Effective beginning Academic Year 2022-23 (Last revised November 23, 2022)

The following table outlines how transfer credits will be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology degree at the University of Akron for students who completed an Associate of Arts degree via the Ohio Guaranteed Psychology (AA to BA) Transfer Pathway. The OGTP designation guarantees the transfer and applicability of credits, but does not guarantee admission to a program. Some bachelor-degree granting programs may be competitive, and students should check with individual institutions for their program admission requirements.
