

The following table outlines how transfer credits will be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Social Work degree at Miami University for students who completed an Associate of Arts degree via the Ohio Guaranteed Social Work Transfer Pathway. The OGTP designation guarantees the transfer and applicability of credits, but does not guarantee admission to a program. Some bachelor-degree granting programs may be competitive, and students should check with individual institutions for their program admission requirements.

Advising Notes: ¹ The Social Work Methods courses (FSW 304, FSW 306 and FSW 406) must be completed in the junior year and must be completed prior to beginning Field Experience. The social work field experience is taken in the senior year over two terms for a total of 450 clock hours in an agency setting (225 hours/term). Students are required to register for FSW 411 (Senior Field Experience I) concurrently with FSW 412 (Senior Field Seminar I) and FSW 413 (Senior Field Experience II) concurrently with FSW 414 (Senior Field Seminar II). ² Miami University requires a total of 124 credit hours for degree completion. The total number of hours to complete the bachelor's degree represents a range of hours that may be needed depending on the individual course selections made during the associate degree program.
