- ¹Wright State University will also accept Quantitative Reasoning (TMM011).
- ²Wright State University has pre-admission requirements that include OSS011 American Politics/Government (can be taken as an Ohio Transfer 36 elective or as an option in the Other Requirements category), an interpersonal communications course equivalent to COM 2020, an economics course equivalent to EC 2000 or EC 2900, and a biology course equivalent to BIO 1050 or BIO 1070. Students must earn a grade of C or higher in OSS029 Introduction to Social Work and OSS030 Introduction to Social Welfare. They must also have a minimum GPA of 2.5. Application for admission requires two letters of professional reference as well as a Social Work Professional Statement and Social Issue Statement along with a complete criminal background disclosure statement.
