

## Child Welfare Law Training Opportunity for Attorneys

The Ohio Department of Children and Youth (DCY) is partnering with the National Association of Counsel for Children (NACC) to provide scholarships for three on-demand child welfare law trainings. ### National Red Book Training (Maximum of 50 scholarships)

- NACC's signature Red Book Training Course (RBTC) covers major dependency practice competency areas and is designed to assist you in preparing for the Child Welfare Law Specialist (CWLS) examination. The course is based on NACC's legal treatise, *Child Welfare Law and Practice: Representing Children, Parents, and Agencies in Neglect, Abuse, and Dependency Cases, 4th Edition* (the "Red Book"). During eight weekly webinars, the presenter will assist participants in breaking down the material, focusing on important concepts, and learning CWLS exam-taking strategies. Registration includes the downloadable RBTC workbook, temporary access to the electronic version of the Red Book, and access to the live virtual and on-demand sessions.
