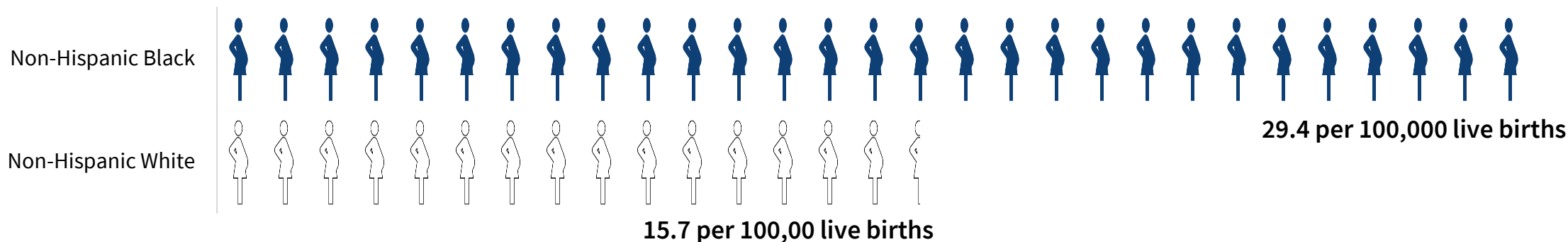

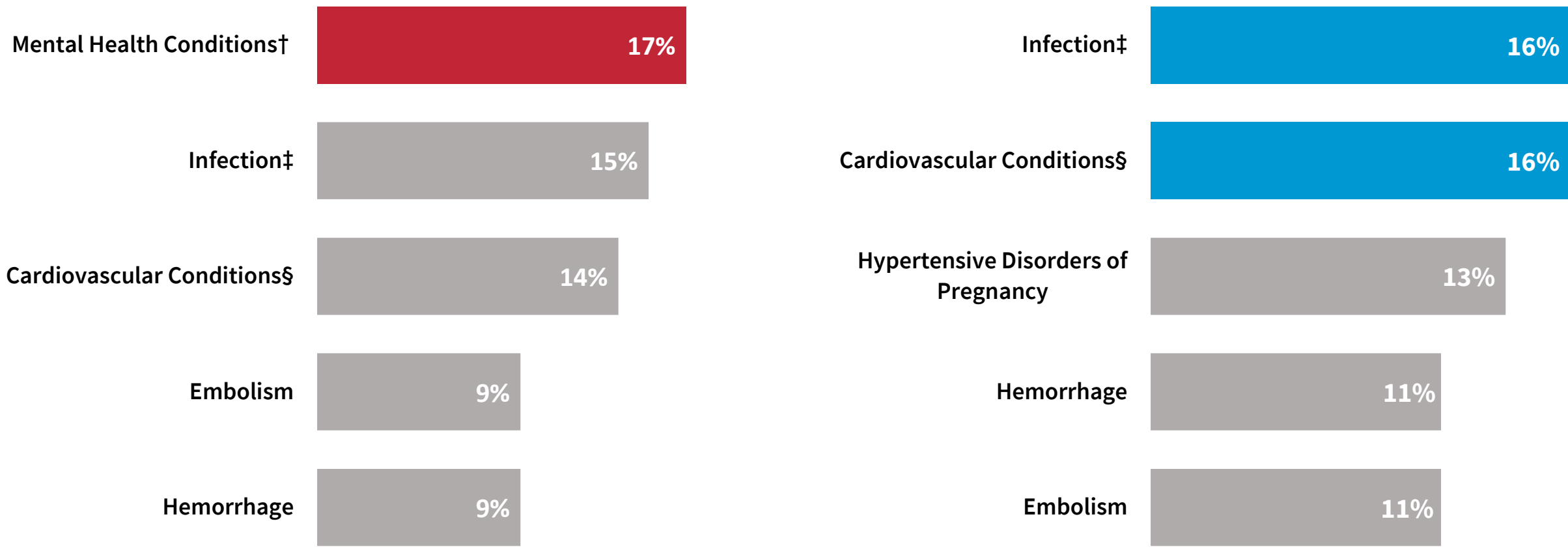
Black Maternal Health Week: April 11-17, 2025

From 2008-2020*, non-Hispanic Black women were almost 2 times more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes than non-Hispanic white women.

Top 5 Leading Causes of Pregnancy Related Death in Ohio: Overall and Non-Hispanic Black Women (2008-2020)*



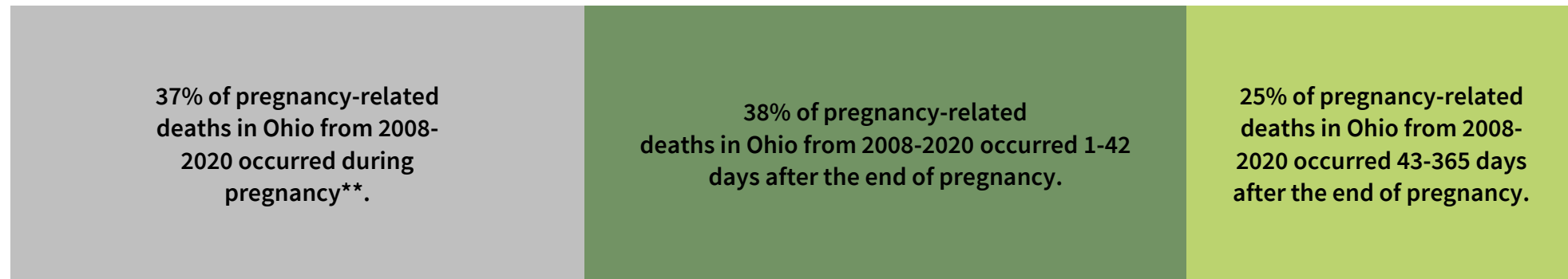

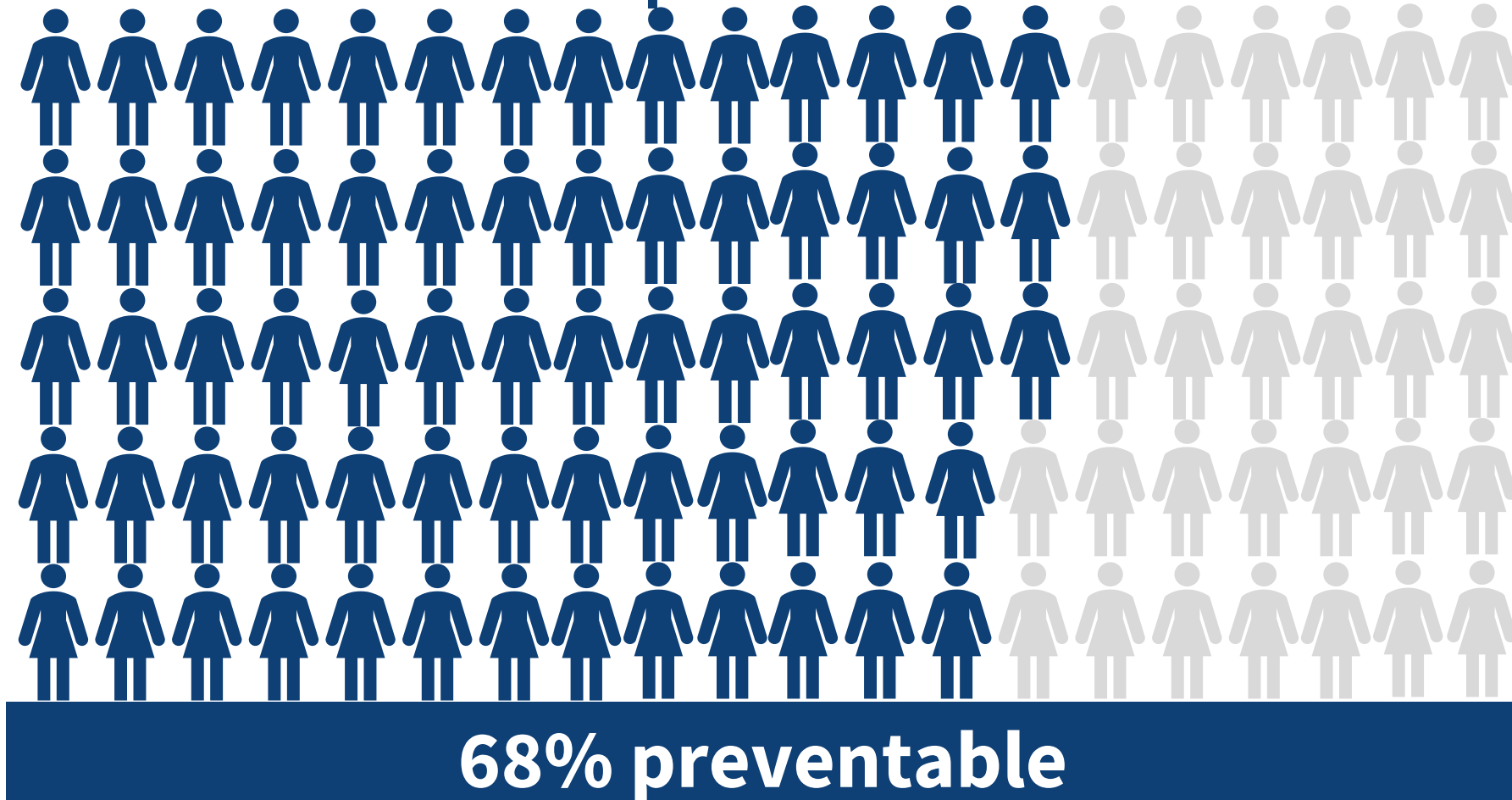
Most pregnancy-related deaths in Ohio from 2008-2020* occurred during the postpartum period.
