What is Farm to Early Care & Education?

Farm to Early Care and Education (ECE) is an innovative evidence-based approach that gives young children increased exposure and access to local food, and opportunities to learn about nutrition, agriculture and gardening.

How do I get started in Farm to ECE?

Start by completing the *Early Childhood Health: Farm to Early Care* training, available for free, 2.0 Ohio Approved (OA) credit* hours on OCCRRRA's OPR.
