Discover how primitive reflexes influence early brain and motor development in infants and toddlers, and why understanding these reflexes is essential for supporting growth and learning. This session will introduce Rhythmic Movement Training International (RMTI), exploring its origins, underlying principles, and the ways it can be used to integrate reflex patterns and build a foundation for later skills. Presenters will share how Stark County's Early Intervention team has incorporated RMTI into their practices, highlighting real-world examples, implementation strategies, and outcomes for children and families. Participants will leave with practical insights to apply in their own work supporting young children's development.
