

Ohio's Agricultural Building Exemption

Determination Flow Chart Notes

- **Note 1:** "Agricultural purposes" is defined in ORC 3781.06(C)(1) to include all of the following:
 - Agriculture
 - o cultivating soil, producing crops, raising livestock
 - Farming
 - o same as agriculture
 - Dairying
 - o producing, processing, and selling dairy
 - Pasturage
 - o the grass or land eaten by grazing animals
 - Apiculture
 - o beekeeping
 - Horticulture
 - o plants
 - Floriculture
 - o flowers
 - Viticulture
 - grapes
 - Ornamental horticulture
 - o landscape gardening
 - Olericulture
 - vegetables
 - Pomiculture
 - o fruit
 - Animal and poultry husbandry
 - Webster's defines animal husbandry as the branch of agriculture concerned with <u>farm</u> animals, especially in regard to breeding, judging, care and production [Mentor Lagoons, Inc. v. Zoning Board of Appeals of Mentor Twp., 1958]
 - Livestock includes horses, mules, cattle, calves, swine, sheep, or goats [AG opinion 69-078, July 1969; and Chapter 943 of the Revised Code]
 - The raising of minks <u>is</u> considered animal husbandry [Butler Co. Court. of Appeals, Davidson v. Abele, 1965; and AG opinion 3607, 1954]
 - The housing, breeding, raising and showing of dogs is considered animal husbandry [Supreme Court of Ohio, Harris V. Rootstown Township Zoning Bd. Of Appeals]
- **Note 2:** "Incident" used as an adjective means:
 - 1. Having a subordinate or dependent relation to something specified [Merriam-Webster's Dictionary of Law, © 1996 Merriam-Webster, Inc.]
 - 2. Related to or dependent on another thing [The American Heritage® Dictionary of the English Language, Fourth Edition, Copyright © 2009 by Houghton Mifflin Company]
 - 3. Likely to happen as a result [Webster's Dictionary and Thesaurus, ©2002 by Geddes & Grosset]

In other words is the use of the building in question related to the agricultural purpose for which the land is used?

- **Note 3:** AG Opinion 3440, November 1962, concluded that a residential dwelling is <u>not</u> a structure incident to an agricultural use of land.
- Note 4: If they sell mostly their own crops, then the building *is not* used in retail trade. If they sell mostly other stuff, then the building *is* used in retail trade.
