Residential Building Inspector *3–5 years any construction trade*

Building Inspector 5 years commercial structural experience

Mechanical Inspector 5 years HVAC experience

Electrical Inspector *6 years journeyman or equivalent electrician experience*

Plumbing Inspector 7 years plumbing installation experience

Engineers and architects also qualify for most BBS certifications.

Many building departments offer Trainee programs for interested people who don't meet the minimum qualifications.

Mail to BBS for review and board approval.

Step 2

Watch mail and email for any BBS communications.

If approved, you're eligible to work in a building department with your interim certification.

You will need to take tests and attend Code Academy to reach full certification status. You will have two years to complete these steps.
