### **Overview: Office of Housing Support's Fair Housing Actions**

Christina Blair presented an overview of the Office of Housing Support's (OHS) reviewed Supportive Housing Program (SHP) and Homeless Crisis Response Grant Program (HCRP) issues and received comments.

### **Overarching Program Issues**

• Spending - Make sure the end of grant period ends with a \$0 balance – funds can be moved around rather than sending the money back.

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### **Reporting and Performance**

Staff indicated to participants that they need to get back on track to reporting in a timely manner.

#### **Other PAG Recommendations**

- Look at performance standards/equity in funding.
- Home ARP \$ formulas.
- Shelters are aging, monies needed for projects like heating, cooling, etc.
- Cost effective cost of housing has risen/please think about it for cost effectiveness.
- Number of months of assistance has increased wants to maintain housing stability.
- Takes longer to house; shortage of units; seeing back up in shelters; cost versus access to housing is a challenge.
- Projects assisted by tenant based rental assistance (TBRA), etc. National Standards for the Physical Inspection of Real Estate NSPIRE) costing more for Housing Quality Standards(HQS).

#### **Eligible Activities**

Traditionally have not done renovation due to cost.

#### **Caps On Spending Homeless Prevention/Supportive Services**

- Would have concerns if cap put back on due to Instability of markets.
- If don't have money for staff, will not be able to perform program.
- Finding units is harder due to investors buying up properties.
- Uses max allowable for Homeless Prevention due to rent so high.
- FMR is an issue/cost prohibitive/unit unavailable.
- Hold fees, application fees.
- Homelessness prevention is critical for stability.
- Many issues with Rapid Rehousing.

#### **Coordinated Funding-Spending Targets Thoughts**

- ½ grant=50% spent ¾ grant 75% spent, etc. will be in grant agreements going forward.
- Don't penalize if unable to spend would be responsible to allow grantee to return to give to someone else who needs it.
- Possible to make grantees report more often to hold them accountable possible shorter contracts to help drive progress.
- Earlier dates for Federal Funds-60 days to obligate funds. Sept. 1, 2023 through Aug. 25, 2025.

#### **HCRP Pre-Application Thoughts**

- New applicants only-not renewals.
- How to make process easier.
- Policies are helping a lot.

#### SHP

- Continuum of Care (CoC) regulations match HUD regulations.
- Pre-application is helpful-takes pressure off people at local level.
- Needs outlined more clearly if pre-application needed for renewals of applications.
- The last pre-application was not clear on what was needed.
- Continuum support for only new apps would be good.
- Approval from trustees is cumbersome Development looking to see if needed.

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# **Training Needs**

- Appreciating Development gives the best model/it helps standardize/uniform/best practice.
- Shelter needs lots of training on Housing First.
- New grantee training to be put together.
- Written standards are going through the process of approval.
- Training on how to make an amendment.

# **Policy Changes Possible**

If organization had multiple sites, it would be good to easily move monies between projects.
