Contents

The tables present various estimates of the U.S., Ohio's and the counties' gross domestic products (GDPs). Tables 1 and 2 show current-dollar county totals in alphabetic and rank order with each county's latest contribution to the state total. 2024 GDP by sector is detailed in table 3, and table 4 shows the percentage distribution by sector. Table 5 chronicles real changes in GDPs from 2018 through 2024 after adjusting for inflation. Table 6 ranks the counties by their net aggregate growth from 2018 to 2024; table 7 ranks them by the percentage net change in aggregate growth.

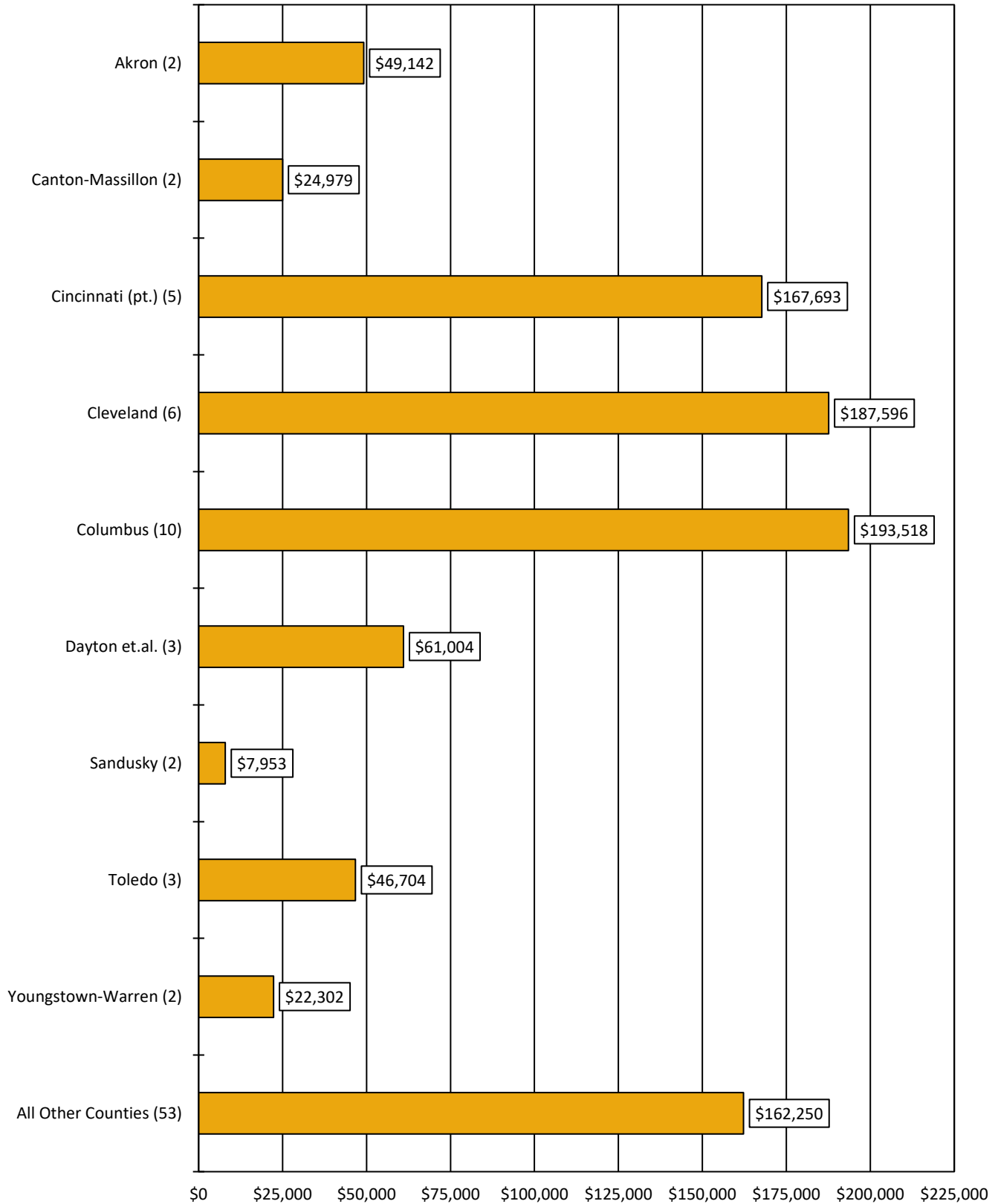

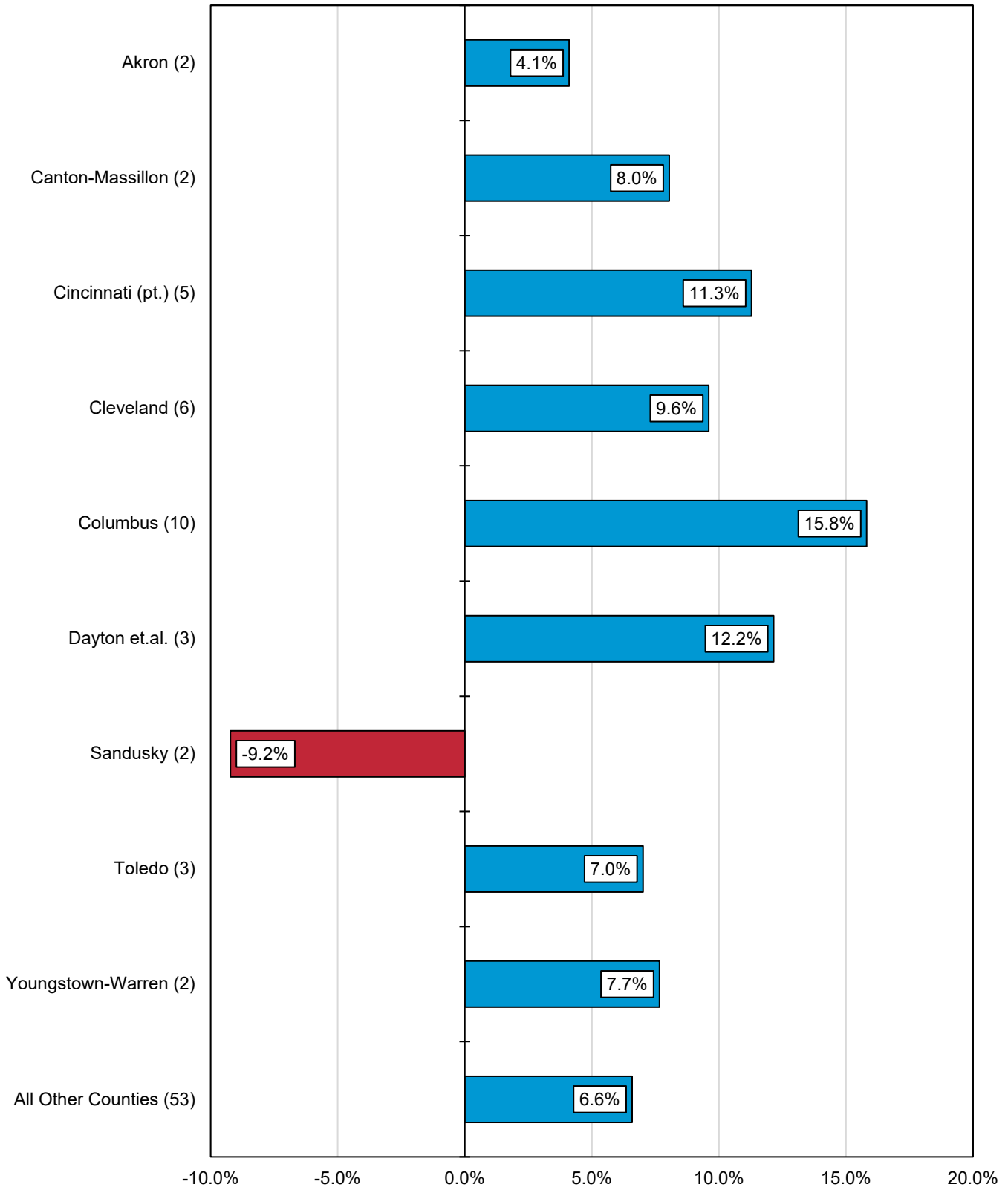
