
Ohio Department of Youth Services Recidivism Fact Sheet

Recidivism defined:

The number of youth who are returned to DYS or incarcerated in DRC within one, two, and three years of release from a DYS correctional facility.

The recidivism rates for the last three release cohorts are presented in the figure below. Each release during a calendar year is tracked for one, two, and three years from their release data.



The one-year rate for youth released during the last two cohorts (2018 and 2019) were the lowest since recidivism has been tracked this way, with only 13.9% of 2019 releases recidivating with one year of release. The two-year rate for those released in 2018 was the lowest two-year rate we have seen. The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic is probably partially responsible for this. A table of the last ten years of release cohorts is presented below.
