Education and Experience Requirements for Certification of Class A, I, II, and III Personnel

Class A Education and Experience Requirements (see OAC Rule 3745-7-06 for further details)

* Post High School education shall be obtained from an accredited institution while pursuing a degree in physical or natural science or chemical, civil or environmental engineering and is subject to review by the Operator Certification staff.

⁽¹⁾ Work experience means time spent at a job where a portion of duties involve dealing with a public water system or treatment works.

⁽²⁾ Successful completion of one or more of the OTCO (Operator Training Committee of Ohio) "Basic Water" or "Basic Wastewater" correspondence course, the California State University at Sacramento "Small Water System Operation and Maintenance" or "Small Wastewater System Operation and Maintenance, Volume I" correspondence course, shall reduce the experience requirement to one year of working experience or five hundred twenty hours of operating experience.

Operating Experience Criteria (see OAC Rule 3745-7-01 for the definition of operating experience)

Experience for drinking water related examinations may <u>only</u> be obtained at public water systems (PWS). The PWS ID number must be provided on the application.		
Applicants may be accepted to take the Class A, I, II, and III examinations without the required experience in accordance with criteria established in Ohio Administrative Code 3745-7.		
A Class II or Class III applicant who is certified at the same or higher classification in the other field, may be granted a 50% reduction in the operating experience requirement, though the applicant is still required to document a minimum of one year of actual operating experience in the field they applied.
