Where do these rules come from?

- Ohio Revised Code (laws)
- Ohio Administrative Code (rules)
- National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (federal rules) "NESHAP"
 - 40 CFR Part 61, Subpart M

What Is a Facility?

- Any structure
 - Institutional, commercial, public, industrial or residential structure, installation, or building
- Any ship
- Any active or inactive waste disposal site





Residential Building Exemption

- Excludes residential buildings with four or fewer dwelling units
 - Has always only served as a residence and has always only included four or fewer units
- *Residential buildings which are acquired and demolished as part of an urban renewal project are a facility



Demolition and Renovation

Demolition

- Wrecking or removing loadsupporting structural member
- Burning





Renovation

- Altering in any way
- Includes removing regulated asbestos-containing material (RACM)





What is RACM?

- Friable asbestos (>1% asbestos)
 - Can be crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder by hand pressure
 - Already friable or becomes friable during removal or abatement which includes fragmenting to < 4in²
- Category I nonfriable that becomes friable (>1% asbestos)
 - Packing, gaskets, resilient floor coverings, & asphalt roofing products
- Category I nonfriable subject to sanding, grinding, cutting, or abrading
- Category II nonfriable likely to become crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder during demolition or renovation
 - All materials >1% asbestos that aren't Category I



Compliance Steps

If structure meets the definition of a facility:

- Determine presence/absence of asbestos
 - asbestos survey (inspection)
- Schedule asbestos abatement (if required)
- Submit notification to Ohio EPA (if required)
- Wait 10 working days
- Perform demolition or renovation (after abatement, if applicable)



Determine Presence/Absence

- Ohio EPA rules require a thorough inspection by a certified asbestos hazard evaluation specialist.
- The program for obtaining this certification is managed by Ohio Department of Health.
- Locate a licensed asbestos surveyor http://www.odh.ohio.gov/
- Review Asbestos Report
 - Details Regulated Asbestos Containing Material (RACM) to be removed prior to demolition or renovation



Schedule Asbestos Abatement (if required)

- Abatement conducted by licensed specialist
 - Locate a licensed asbestos abatement contractor
 - Ohio Department of Health
- Ensure proper management and disposal at landfill that is permitted to receive asbestos
 - Landfill List http://www.epa.ohio.gov/dapc/atu/asbestos.aspx



Complete and Submit Notification

- Notification is required for every demolition of a facility!
- Notification is required for renovations of a facility if:
 - The amount of RACM is at least two hundred sixty linear feet on pipes; or
 - The amount of RACM is at least one hundred sixty square feet on other facility components; or
 - The amount of RACM is at least thirty-five cubic feet of facility components where the length or area could not be measured previously
- No notification is required for renovations if the thresholds aren't exceeded or if no asbestos is present.



Notification Form and Submittal

- Where are the instructions and notification form?
- Where do I submit the notification?
 - District Offices/Local Agencies <u>Map</u> for Submitting Demolition/Renovation Notifications
- When can I begin my project?
 - 10 working day waiting period
 - Starts when post-marked, if completed properly
 - Phone and fax notifications not acceptable for original notification; may be acceptable for revisions depending on DO/LAA



Notification Recommendations

- Use the Ohio EPA Notification of Demolition and Renovation Form!
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- Use the Ohio EPA Notification of Demolition and Renovation Form!!!
- Be careful to submit a complete and approvable, original notification
 - The ten day clock doesn't start until notification is complete



Ohio EPA's Fees

- Each notification: \$75, if abatement is required
- Asbestos removal: \$3/unit
 (1 unit = any combination of linear feet or square feet equal to 50)
- Asbestos debris: \$4/cubic yard
- Local Air Agencies have different fee structure
 - District Offices/Local Air Agencies Map
- Billed after notification is submitted
