



REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION

ANTIOCH UNIVERSITY Institutional Reauthorization

Request:

Antioch University requests continued authorization from the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education.

Profile:

Antioch University is a private, non-profit institution administratively headquartered in Yellow Springs, Ohio. The university offers programs online and at additional locations in Ohio, California, New Hampshire, Maine, Minnesota, and Washington. Today, the university serves nearly 3,000 students in programs at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral level.

Accreditation/Authorization:

Antioch University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next review in 2034-35. The university also holds specialized accreditation for several of its academic programs. The university has been authorized by the Chancellor since January 1970.

Program Offerings:

Antioch University is authorized to offer the following degrees: Bachelor of Arts; Bachelor of Science; Master of Arts; Master of Business Administration; Master of Education; Master of Human Service Administration; Master of Science; Master of Science in Nursing; Doctor of Education; Doctor of Nursing Practice; and Doctor of Philosophy.

Institutional Changes:

Since its last reauthorization, Antioch University implemented a new learning management system. In 2023-24, Antioch University and Otterbein University created a higher education affiliation known as the Coalition for the Common Good, which received change of control approval from HLC and the Chancellor. Because of this affiliation, Antioch University attained Chancellor approval for several graduate programs previously offered by Otterbein University. The university has participated in the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement since September 2015.

Recommendation to the Chancellor:

Antioch University meets the Chancellor's standards, and the staff recommends continued institutional authorization through 2035 to coincide with the university's next accreditation reaffirmation review with the Higher Learning Commission. The Chancellor may, in his judgment, withdraw authorization or require additional review if the institution fails to continue to meet the Chancellor's standards for authorization or receives a sanction from the Higher Learning Commission.


