



REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION

Kettering College Institutional Reauthorization

Request:

Kettering College requests continued authorization from the Chancellor of the Ohio Department of Higher Education.

Profile:

Kettering College is a private, not-for-profit college located in Dayton, Ohio with an additional location in Beavercreek, Ohio. It serves more than 800 students at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels.

Accreditation/Authorization:

Kettering College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) until its next review in 2032-33. The college also holds accreditation from the Adventist Accrediting Association and numerous specialized accreditors in the health care field (Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs; the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing; the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant; the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology; the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care; and the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education). The college is approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing and has been authorized by the Chancellor since 1968.

Program Offerings:

Kettering College offers degree programs at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels in seven health care fields, as well as a certificate program in Community Health. The college offers many of its programs in an online or hybrid format and offers an accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

Institutional Changes:

Since its last reauthorization, Kettering College has revised its program offerings by adding and sunsetting majors, minors, and concentrations to better meet institutional and student needs. Kettering College also joined the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement in 2017.

Recommendation to the Chancellor:

Kettering College meets the Chancellor's standards, and the staff recommends continued institutional authorization through December 31, 2033, to coincide with the college's next accreditation reaffirmation review with the Higher Learning Commission. The Chancellor may, in his judgment, withdraw authorization or require additional review if the institution fails to continue to meet the Chancellor's standards for authorization or receives a sanction from the Higher Learning Commission, the Ohio Board of Nursing, or one of the specialized accreditors for the college's health care programs.
