

WHEREAS, World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, launched on June 15, 2006, is an opportunity to take action to protect older people by raising awareness about elder abuse, why it occurs, and what we can do to stop it; and

WHEREAS, elder abuse is an injustice that affects as many as 1 in 10 Americans, with cases still widely unreported; and

WHEREAS, by the year 2030, it is estimated that Ohioans age 60 and older will make up more than one quarter (26.3 percent) of the state's total population; and

WHEREAS, on average, over 100 referrals are received by Adult Protective Services in Ohio each day; from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, there were 38,026 referrals of alleged abuse, neglect, and exploitation involving Ohioans 60 and older; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services works with other adult protective services advocates and professionals to support inter-disciplinary collaboration, raise awareness, and serve vulnerable older adults in danger of abuse, neglect, or exploitation; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Aging and the Office of the State of Ohio Long-Term Care Ombudsman provide programs, resources, and advocacy for individuals and caregivers to allow older adults to live free of abuse, neglect, and exploitation.
