Free job services available at OhioMeansJobs.com and Ohio's local OhioMeansJobs Centers

COLUMBUS, OHIO – September is National Workforce Development Month, and Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) Director Matt Damschroder is reminding Ohioans about all the many free employment services available at <u>OhioMeansJobs.com</u> and Ohio's local OhioMeansJobs Centers.

"Whether you're exploring new careers, looking for a job – or if you're an employer looking to grow your workforce – <u>OhioMeansJobs.com</u> and your local center can help," Damschroder said. "Our job services are free, and they're available to all Ohioans."

Every county in Ohio has an OhioMeansJobs Center. All offer career planning, job training, and other employment services to Ohioans looking for work and to employers seeking workers. All centers also have free public computers and phones that individuals can use to write a resume, complete online training, and look for jobs. Many centers offer information about local career fairs, referrals to local service providers, and training opportunities. Some centers also offer workshops on topics such as basic computer skills, resume writing, and interviewing.

At either the centers or the website, Ohioans can find and apply for job openings, take skill and career interest assessments, create or improve their resumes, and more. To explore careers on <u>OhioMeansJobs.com</u>, select "For Job Seekers." Under the drop-down menu, choose "Career Preparation" (under "Build Your Career") or "Career Skills" or "Career Path" (under "Practice Your Skills").
