

Ohio's Unemployment Rate Increased to 4.4% in June

Ohio's unemployment rate was 4.4% in June 2024, up from 4.2% in May. Ohio's nonagricultural wage and salary employment decreased 2,300 over the month, from a revised 5,655,200 in May to 5,652,900 in June.

Ohio Nonfarm Payroll Employment Over-the-Month Change, seasonally adjusted, June 2023 – June 2024




Household Survey Data

The number of workers unemployed in Ohio in June was 254,000, up from 243,000 in May. The number of unemployed has increased by 60,000 in the past 12 months from 194,000. The June unemployment rate for Ohio has increased 1.1 percentage points from 3.3% in June 2023.

The U.S. unemployment rate for June 2024 was 4.1%, up from 4.0% in May 2024 and up from 3.6% in June 2023.

In June 2024, the labor force participation rate in Ohio was 62.1%, up from 61.9% in May 2024 and up from 61.9% in June 2023. During the same period, the national labor force participation rate was 62.6%, up from 62.5% in May 2024 and unchanged from 62.6% in June 2023.

Establishment Survey Data

Ohio's nonagricultural wage and salary employment decreased 2,300 over the month, from a revised 5,655,200 in May to 5,652,900 in June, according to the latest business establishment survey conducted by the U.S. Department of Labor (Bureau of Labor Statistics) in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS).

Employment in goods-producing industries, at 939,300, increased 2,300 as gains in construction (+3,600) outweighed losses in manufacturing (-1,300). Mining and logging did not change over the month. The private service-providing sector, at 3,925,300, decreased 14,600, as losses in private educational and health services (-8,400); professional and business services (-3,400); trade, transportation, and utilities (-1,700); leisure and hospitality (-1,200); and financial activities (-200) exceeded gains in information (+200) and other services (+100). Government employment, at 788,300, increased 10,000, with gains in local (+5,600); state (+4,300); and federal (+100) government.

From June 2023 to June 2024, nonagricultural wage and salary employment increased 25,200. Employment in goods-producing industries increased 3,100, led by construction which added 6,000 jobs. Mining and logging gained 100 jobs. Manufacturing lost 3,000 jobs, in durable (-2,800) and nondurable goods (-200). Employment in the private service-providing sector increased 17,100 as gains in private educational and health services (+25,100); other services (+7,200); leisure and hospitality (+4,000); and professional and business services (+200) outpaced losses in financial activities (-11,100); trade, transportation, and utilities (-6,000); and information (-2,300). Government employment increased 5,000 as gains in local (+4,700) and federal (+2,200) government exceeded losses in state government (-1,900).

EDITOR'S NOTE: All data cited are produced in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor. Data sources include the Current Population Survey (U.S. data), Current Employment Statistics Program (nonagricultural wage and salary employment data), and Local Area Unemployment Statistics Program (Ohio unemployment rates).
