## Ohio Jobless Claims for Sunday, January 12, 2025, through Saturday, January 18, 2025

This week, the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) provided updated data on unemployment claims filed in Ohio the week of January 12, 2025-January 18, 2025. These statistics were shared with the U.S. Department of Labor.

Ohioans filed **8,607 initial unemployment claims** last week, which was **5,296 <u>fewer</u>** than the previous week. Approximately **1,079** of those have been flagged for more stringent identity verification, to ensure they are not fraudulent.

Ohioans filed **74,699 continued unemployment claims** last week, which was **2,643** more than the previous week.

The total number of claims filed from January 12, 2025-January 18, 2025, was 83,306.

Ohio's unemployment rate in November was **4.3**%. The national unemployment rate in November was **4.2**%. Ohio's labor force participation rate in November was **62.6**%. The national labor force participation rate in November was **62.5**%.

ODJFS works in partnership with local workforce development boards and local staff to provide employment and training services at 88 OhioMeansJobs Centers throughout the state.
