OCAI is a collaborative project of the State Library of Ohio and TeachingBooks.net. The project is funded in whole or in part with Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) federal funds, granted to the State Library of Ohio. Ohio Digital Library

- In the month of March, ODL patrons checked out 757,296 items. The total for the year stands at 2,196,904 checkouts.
 - The most popular title in March with close to 1,500 checkouts was Maybe I Will, a delightfully snarky audiobook full of tropes like enemies to lovers, workplace romance and with a dash of a second chance romance.
 - Curious about what's being checked out? Take a look at the real-time checkouts and holds.
- Beginning May 1, the legacy OverDrive app will be discontinued. For over five years, the Libby and OverDrive apps have been supported alonaside each other but now Libby will be the only available app. Libraries can use the OverDrive Resource center for staff trainings, marketing materials, preparation checklists, and more.
 - ODL-branded Libby business cards will be sent out to all ODL member libraries shortly.
- Two libraries joined the Ohio Digital Library in March: New Straitsville Public Library and Oberlin Public Library.
- In mid-March 2020, ODL enabled the opportunity for Ohioans to take advantage of the Overdrive Instant Digital Card. A user can sign up with his/her phone number and gain quick access to econtent via ODL. Users that sign up via the Instant Digital Card will be directed to their local library to fill out a physical library card. In March 2023, 3,766 registrations took place.

Reimagining School Readiness








Syndetics Unbound Statistics

In partnership with the Ohio Library for the Blind and Print Disabled (OLBPD) at the Cleveland Public Library, the State Library of Ohio serves as the machine lending agency for the state providing playback equipment to eligible blind, visually impaired and print disabled residents. To help in this effort, we have machine sub-lending agencies, local public libraries, or social service organizations to help assist eligible citizens in their areas.

Summer Food Service Program

- Many libraries in Ohio and around the USA participate in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), a USDA-funded program that provides free meals and snacks to children ages 0-18 in communities with high levels of need. Besides the obvious benefits of addressing hunger and supporting vulnerable youth, SFSP participation benefits libraries through:
 - Access to new user groups, especially underserved and marginalized populations
 - o Increased visibility of the library as a community asset
 - Opportunities for new partnerships
 - o Positioning of the library as an important stakeholder in community well-being and positive child outcomes
 - Support for summer library programming through increased attendance
- If you are already an SFSP site or have been in the past, work with your current/previous sponsor to prepare for summer 2023.
- If you want to become an SFSP site, the Collaborative Summer Library Program offers a thorough, clear how-to guide for libraries: Libraries and Summer Food provides a step-by-step for libraries interested in becoming SFSP sites, or otherwise getting involved in addressing child food insecurity during the summer.



• There were 118 WebJunction course completions in March 2023, down from 138 in February. Individuals completing courses represented the following types of libraries: 116 public and 2 school.


