Dear Dr. Genetta:

Enclosed please find a certified copy of the Findings, Order and Journal Entry approved and confirmed by the State Medical Board meeting in regular session on December 10 2025.

Any party desiring to appeal this order shall file a notice of appeal with the State Medical Board of Ohio, located at 30 E. Broad St., 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215, setting forth the order appealed from and stating that the agency's order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law. The notice of appeal may, but need not, set forth the specific grounds of the party's appeal beyond the statement that the agency's order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law.

The notice of appeal shall also be filed by the appellant with the court of common pleas of Franklin County or the court of common pleas in the county in which the place of business of the licensee is located or the county in which the licensee is a resident. If the party appealing is not a resident of and has no place of business in this state, the party shall appeal to the court of common pleas of Franklin County. In filing a notice of appeal with both the Medical Board and the court, the notice that is filed may be either the original notice or a copy of the original notice.

The party filing the appeal shall comply with all requirements of Ohio Revised Code section 119.12 (R.C. 119.12). The notice of appeal shall be filed within fifteen days after the service of the notice of the Medical Board order as provided in section 119.05 of the Ohio Revised Code.





PROPOSED FINDINGS AND PROPOSED ORDER

Basis for Action:

*Notice of Opportunity for Hearing:* In a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing On Failure To Submit To An Examination and Notice Of Summary Suspension Based Upon Presumption Of An Admission of Impairment dated March 12, 2025 (“Notice”), the State Medical Board of Ohio (“Board”) notified Timothy D. Genetta, D.O., that, pursuant to R.C. 4731.22(G), the Board had adopted an Entry of Order summarily suspending his license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio. In addition, the Board notified Dr. Genetta that it proposed to take disciplinary action against his license based on allegations that he failed to submit to a Board-ordered examination and that he failed to notify the Board of any circumstances beyond his control preventing him from submitting to the examination. The Board further alleged that it had not received information that Dr. Genetta had entered into treatment with a Board-approved treatment provider, that he completed treatment and entered into an aftercare contract with a Board-approved treatment provider, or that he had been determined to be capable of practicing in accordance with acceptable and prevailing standards of care.

The Board also alleged that, as a result, pursuant to R.C. 4731.22(B)(26), a legal presumption had been established that Dr. Genetta had admitted the factual and legal allegations as set forth by the Board in a January 8, 2025 letter ordering him to the examination, thus demonstrating an impairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. The Board alleged that the acts, conduct, and/or omissions of Dr. Genetta, individually and/or collectively, constitute “[i]mpairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice,” as set forth in R.C. 4731.22(B)(26), as in effect at that time. (Ex. 1, 1.A)

*No Request for Hearing:* The Board arranged for an investigator to personally delivery the Notice to Dr. Genetta’s address of record: **Redacted**; as well as to an alternative address of record: **Redacted**. On March 12,

2025, the Board investigator attempted personal delivery at Dr. Genetta's Flushing address but Dr. Genetta did not live at the address. On March 14, 2024, the Board investigator completed personal service at Dr. Genetta's alternative address in Georgetown, Ohio, by leaving a copy of the Notice at the residence.

On March 13, 2025, the Board sent the Notice to Dr. Genetta by registered email at his email address of record: **Redacted**. On March 19, 2025, the Board again sent the Notice to Dr. Genetta by registered email at his email address of record. On April 9, 2025, the Board received notice that Dr. Genetta had opened the Board's March 19, 2025 email with the Notice.

On April 7, 2025, the Board caused to be published a legal notice in the *Times Leader*, a newspaper of general circulation in the area of Dr. Genetta's address of record. On April 10, 2025, a copy of the affidavit of publication was mailed to Dr. Genetta's last known address of record. The Board's Chief Legal Counsel attested in a sworn affidavit dated June 2, 2025 that the thirtieth and final day on which Dr. Genetta could submit a written request for a hearing was May 9, 2025 and that no request for a hearing had been received as of the date of the affidavit. (Exs. 1, 1.A – 1.D)

*Request for Proposed Findings and Proposed Order:* In a memorandum dated June 10, 2025, the Assistant Legal Counsel requested that a hearing examiner review the evidence as provided and prepare a report of Proposed Findings and Proposed Order. (Ex. 7)

Evidence Examined:

Anderson, Chief Legal Counsel, regarding service of the Notice on Dr. Genetta and attesting that the final date to request a hearing was May 9, 2025 and that no request for hearing had been received as of the date of the affidavit. Exhibit 4: March 3, 2025 Affidavit of Shane Stoehr, Enforcement Attorney, attesting to his coordination of the investigation of complaints against Dr. Genetta; the discovery of Dr. Genetta's alternative address in Georgetown; the delivery of a January 8, 2025 letter to Dr. Genetta at both his Flushing and Georgetown addresses which ordered Dr. Genetta to undergo an examination at Glenbeigh Hospital on February 16, 2025; that he was informed that Dr. Genetta failed to appear for a scheduled examination; and that he has not received information that Dr. Genetta was unable to attend the examination due to circumstances beyond his control. Mr. Stoehr attached the following documents to his affidavit:

### PROPOSED FINDINGS

1. Timothy D. Genetta D.O., was first licensed to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio in 1996. His license is currently suspended.

*This proposed finding is supported by the following evidence:* Exs. 1.A, 2.

2. The Board notified Dr. Genetta by letter dated January 8, 2025 that it had determined it had reason to believe that he was in violation of R.C. 4731.22(B)(26) and ordered him to submit to a 72-hour inpatient evaluation at Glenbeigh Hospital in Rock Creek, Ohio beginning on February 16, 2025. The Board also informed Dr. Genetta of the adequate grounds that existed to support its reason to believe he was in violation of R. C 4731.22(B)(26) which included:

- (1) The Board received information that on or about June 14, 2024, [his] employment with the Ohio Veteran Home [OVH] in Georgetown, OH, was terminated due to suspicion that [he] were under the influence of alcohol while on duty. According to the information received by the Board, on the day of [Dr. Genetta's] termination, staff at OVH observed [him] to be slurring [his] words while on duty. Furthermore, staff at OVH observed alcohol in a cup [he] had been drinking from that day, as well as an open container(s) of alcohol in [his] office.

- (2) [Dr. Genetta has] previously pled guilty to two alcohol related traffic offenses:

In or around January 2008, in Mahoning County, OH, [Dr. Genetta was] charged with Failure to Maintain Physical Control and Operating a Motor Vehicle While Under the Influence. [He] ultimately pled guilty to an amended charge of Reckless Operation.

In or around April 2015, in Jefferson County, OH, [Dr. Genetta was] charged with Operating a Motor Vehicle While Under the Influence. [He] ultimately pled no contest to the charge of Reckless Operation.

The January 8, 2025 letter also notified Dr. Genetta that “failure to submit to this examination as directed constitutes an admission of the allegations against you unless the failure is due to circumstances beyond your control, and that a default and final order may thereupon be entered without the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence.”

The January 8, 2025 letter was sent to Dr. Genetta at his address of record in Flushing, Ohio, as well as to an alternative address of record in Georgetown, Ohio, by UPS. The copy of the January 8, 2025 letter was delivered to the Flushing address on January 15, 2025 and to the Georgetown address on January 16, 2025.

*This proposed finding is supported by the following evidence:* Exs. 1.A, 4.A, 4.B

3. According to records from OVH, Dr. Genetta was terminated from his position on June 14, 2024. After reports that he was drinking alcohol on the clock, slurring his words, and after other employees detected the smell of alcohol in his office, the Ohio State Highway Patrol was called to help remove Dr. Genetta from the building. Documentation from the OVH indicates that a cup in Dr. Genetta's office smelled of alcohol. With the trooper present, Dr. Genetta was informed of his termination and given the opportunity to pack his belongings. Both staff and the trooper informed Dr. Genetta that he was unable to drive as he was under the influence. Dr. Genetta did not argue and quietly complied. While clearing out his desk, Dr. Genetta pulled multiple cans out of a drawer and placed them in his box (not the trash can) with the other items he was packing to take home. OVH staff noted the cans were seltzer. When Dr. Genetta picked up the box, it began leaking something. Staff from OVH drove Dr. Genetta home.

*This proposed finding is supported by the following evidence:* Exs. 6.4, 6.5

4. By letter dated February 18, 2025, Tina Ensmann, Admission Manager at Glenbeigh Hospital, notified Mr. Stoehr that Dr. Genetta did not appear for the scheduled evaluation.

*This proposed finding is supported by the following evidence:* Exs. 4, 4.C, 6.1

5. In his March 3, 2025 affidavit, Mr. Stoehr attested that he had not received any information that Dr. Genetta was unable to attend the examination due to circumstances beyond his control.

*This proposed finding is supported by the following evidence:* Ex. 4

6. There is no evidence in the record that Dr. Genetta has entered treatment at a Board-approved treatment provider, that he has completed the recommended/required treatment, or that he has entered into an aftercare contract with a Board-approved treatment provider. Further, there is no evidence in the record that Dr. Genetta has been determined to be capable of practicing in accordance with acceptable and prevailing standards of care.
7. Dr. Genetta's acts, conduct and/or omissions, as set forth in Proposed Findings 1 through 6, individually and/or collectively, constitute "[i]mpairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that may impair ability to practice," as set forth in R.C. 4731.22(B)(26).

Pursuant to R.C. 4731.225, the Board is authorized to impose a civil penalty for this violation. However, it is the Board's policy to not impose civil penalties when the only violation is for impairment.

### **RATIONALE FOR THE PROPOSED ORDER**

Dr. Genetta is clearly struggling with alcohol use. As he did not request a hearing, there is no evidence that circumstances beyond his control prevented him from attending the Glenbeigh evaluation. There is also no evidence that he is currently able and willing to comply with the Board's normal treatment and monitoring regimen. The hearing examiner does not wish to impose treatment conditions on Dr. Genetta with which he cannot currently comply. Therefore, the proposed order is for revocation of his license. Dr. Genetta should consider reapplying for licensure after he has completed treatment with an approved treatment provider and can show a period of sobriety.

### **PROPOSED ORDER**

It is hereby ORDERED that:

The license of Timothy D. Genetta, D.O., to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio shall be REVOKED.

This Order shall become effective immediately upon the date of service of the notification of approval by the Board.

If you wish to request such hearing, that request must be made in writing and be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty days of the time of service of this notice. It is hereby ORDERED that the certificate of Timothy D. Genetta, D.O., to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in the State of Ohio be summarily suspended.

It is hereby ORDERED that Timothy D. Genetta, D.O., shall immediately cease the practice of osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio and immediately refer all active patients to other appropriate physicians.

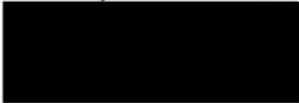


**OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING ON FAILURE TO SUBMIT TO AN EXAMINATION  
AND  
NOTICE OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION  
BASED UPON PRESUMPTION OF AN ADMISSION OF IMPAIRMENT**

Dear Dr. Genetta:

On or about January 8, 2025, the Secretary of the State Medical Board of Ohio [Board] notified you of the reasons supporting a belief that you may be impaired, and ordered you to submit to an examination on February 16, 2025. Due to your failure to submit to the examination as ordered and your failure to notify the Board of any circumstances beyond your control preventing you from submitting to said examination, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, a legal presumption has been established that you have admitted the factual and legal allegations demonstrating an impairment of your ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice, as alleged against you in the Board's letter dated January 8, 2025, and sent to you by UPS Next Day Air [January 8, 2025 letter] so ordering you to submit to such examination. Accordingly, the Secretary and the Supervising Member of the Board have determined that there is clear and convincing evidence that you have violated Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and have further determined that your continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public, as set forth in paragraphs (1) through (5), below.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), Ohio Revised Code, and upon recommendation of Kim Rothermel, M.D., Secretary, and Harish Kakarala, M.D., Supervising Member, you are hereby notified that, as set forth in the attached Entry of Order, your certificate/license to practice medicine or surgery in the State of Ohio is summarily suspended. Accordingly, at this time, you are no longer authorized to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in Ohio.

Furthermore, in accordance with Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, and Chapter 4731., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby notified that the Board intends, for one or more of the following reasons, to determine whether adequate grounds existed to support a reason to believe that you may have had an

impairment to practice at the time you were ordered to attend the examination and whether your failure to submit to the aforementioned examination was due to circumstances beyond your control, which would rebut the legal presumption of impairment and merit termination of the instant summary suspension of your certificate/license in conjunction with rescheduling the examination as directed by the Board, or conversely, whether your failure to submit to the aforementioned examination was due to circumstances within your control, which would render the legal presumption of impairment conclusive and result in the Board further determining whether or not to limit, revoke, permanently revoke or suspend your license or certificate, or refuse to grant or register or issue the license or certificate for which you have a pending application in accordance with Section 9.79 of the Ohio Revised Code, or refuse to renew or reinstate your license or certificate to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery, or to reprimand you or place you on probation based upon your legally admitted impairment. Further, the Board will determine whether adequate grounds existed to support a reason to believe that you may have been impaired at the time you were ordered to attend the examination:

- (1) By letter dated January 8, 2025, the Board notified you of its determination that it had reason to believe that you may be in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and ordered you to undergo a 72-hour inpatient examination to determine if you are in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code. The Board's determination was based upon one or more of the reasons outlined in such letter, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, which included information that on or about June 14, 2024, your employment with the Ohio Veterans Home in Georgetown was terminated due to suspicion that you were intoxicated while on duty.
- (2) The January 8, 2025, letter from the Board further notified you that, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, you were ordered to submit to a 72-hour inpatient examination. The examination was scheduled to take place at Glenbeigh Hospital, a Board-approved treatment provider, on February 16, 2025, at 4:00 p.m.

The January 8, 2025, letter from the Board further notified you that failure of an individual to submit to an examination as directed constitutes an admission of the allegations against the individual unless the failure is due to circumstances beyond the individual's control. Finally, the letter notified you that if you failed to submit to the examination, and such failure was not due to circumstances beyond your control, the Board would be authorized to enter a default and final order without the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence.

- (3) You were duly notified of the examination order and its scheduled date. The UPS tracking results indicate the January 8, 2025, letter was delivered to your address of record on January 15, 2025.
- (4) By letter dated February 18, 2025, the Board was notified that you failed to appear for the examination that the Board scheduled for you. At no time did you inform the Board that your failure to appear was due to circumstances beyond your control. Accordingly, pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and in consideration of the affidavits of Shane Stoehr, Enforcement Attorney, and Brandon Morant, Chief of Licensure, copies of which are attached hereto and fully incorporated herein, the Board hereby FINDS that you have admitted the truth of the allegations demonstrating impairment as set forth in the January 8, 2025, letter from the Board. The Board FINDS that pursuant to Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, your failure to appear for the examination ordered by the Board as directed constitutes "[i]mpairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care

because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice,” as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code.

- (5) Further, the Board has not received information indicating that you have entered treatment at a Board-approved treatment provider, or that you have completed the recommended/required treatment and entered into an aftercare contract with a Board- approved treatment provider. In addition, the Board has not received information that you have been determined to be capable of practicing in accordance with acceptable and prevailing standards of care.

Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, provides that any individual authorized to practice accepts the privilege of practicing in this state subject to supervision by the Board; that by filing an application for or holding a license or certificate to practice, an individual shall be deemed to have given consent to submit to a mental or physical examination when ordered to do so by the Board in writing; and that the expense of the examination is the responsibility of the individual compelled to be examined. Failure to submit to a mental or physical examination ordered by the Board constitutes an admission of the allegations against the individual unless the failure is due to circumstances beyond the individual's control, and a default and final order may be entered without the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence.

Further, Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, additionally provides that if the Board determines that an individual's ability to practice is impaired, the Board shall suspend the individual's certificate/license and shall require the individual, as a condition for continued, reinstated, or renewed certification to practice, to submit to treatment and, before being eligible to apply for reinstatement, to demonstrate to the Board the ability to resume practice in compliance with acceptable and prevailing standards of care, including completing required treatment, providing evidence of compliance with an aftercare contract or written consent agreement, and providing written reports indicating that the individual's ability to practice has been assessed by individuals or providers approved by the Board and that the individual has been found capable of practicing according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care.

Further, Rule 4731-16-02(B)(1), Ohio Administrative Code, provides that if an examination discloses impairment, or if the Board has other reliable, substantial and probative evidence demonstrating impairment, the Board shall initiate proceedings to suspend the licensee, and may issue an order of summary suspension as provided in Section 4731.22(G), Ohio Revised Code.

Your acts, conduct, and/or omissions as alleged in paragraphs (1) through (5) above, individually and/or collectively, constitute “[i]mpairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice,” as that clause is used in Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code.

Furthermore, for any violations that occurred on or after September 29, 2015, the Board may impose a civil penalty in an amount that shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars, pursuant to Section 4731.225, Ohio Revised Code. The civil penalty may be in addition to any other action the Board may take under section 4731.22, Ohio Revised Code.

Pursuant to Chapter 119., Ohio Revised Code, and Chapter 4731., Ohio Revised Code, you are hereby advised that you are entitled to a hearing concerning whether adequate grounds existed to support a

reason to believe that you may have been impaired at the time you were ordered to attend the examination and whether your failure to submit to the examination as directed was due to circumstances beyond your control. If you wish to request such hearing, the request must be made in writing and must be received in the offices of the State Medical Board within thirty days of the time of service of this notice.

You are further advised that, if you timely request a hearing, you are entitled to appear at such hearing in person, or by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before this agency, or you may present your position, arguments, or contentions in writing, and that at the hearing you may present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.

In the event that there is no request for such hearing received within thirty days of the time of service of this notice, the State Medical Board may, in your absence and upon consideration of this matter, determine whether or not to limit, revoke, permanently revoke or suspend your license or certificate, or refuse to grant or register or issue the license or certificate for which you have a pending application in accordance with Section 9.79 of the Ohio Revised Code, or refuse to renew or reinstate your license or certificate to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery, or to reprimand you or place you on probation.

Please note that, whether or not you request a hearing, Section 4731.22(L), Ohio Revised Code, provides that "[w]hen the board refuses to grant or issue a license or certificate to practice to an applicant, revokes an individual's license or certificate to practice, refuses to renew an individual's license or certificate to practice, or refuses to reinstate an individual's license or certificate to practice, the board may specify that its action is permanent. An individual subject to a permanent action taken by the board is forever thereafter ineligible to hold a license or certificate to practice and the board shall not accept an application for reinstatement of the license or certificate or for issuance of a new license or certificate."

The State Medical Board of Ohio [Board] has determined that it has reason to believe that you are in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, to wit: “[i]mpairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice.”
