Please find below a summary of actions taken or initiated by the State Medical Board of Ohio and an update of Board matters pending or decided in courts as of August 14, 2024.

PRE-HEARING SUSPENSION

PLEISTER, Adam P., M.D., (#35.093819) – Worthington, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), license to practice medicine and surgery summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the licensee is in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and that his continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 8/14/24. (*See also:* Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

RAJAN, Semur P. G., M.D., (#35.033496) - Mansfield, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), massage therapy license summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the massage therapist is in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(19), Ohio Revised Code, and that his continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 8/14/24. (*See also:* Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

THOMPSON, Lamoll A., M.T., (#33.026668) – Cleveland, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), massage therapy license summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the massage therapist is in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(20), Ohio Revised Code, and that his continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 8/14/24. (*See also:* Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

ANDERSON, Stuart D., M.D., (#35.081721) – Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Based on allegations that a prior disciplinary action by the West Virginia Board of Medicine which issued a 5/9/24 Consent Order, constitute: Any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason

other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

JONES, Marquis, R.C.P. App. – Houston, Texas

Based on allegations when the respiratory care professional failed to respond to Board Interrogatories, and failed to respond to Board attempts at communication, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: a failure to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the Board including failure to comply with a subpoena or order issued by the Board or failure to answer truthfully a question presented by the Board in an investigative interview, an investigative office conference, at a deposition, or in written interrogatories, except that failure to cooperate with an investigation shall not constitute grounds for discipline under this section if a court of competent jurisdiction has issued an order that either quashes a subpoena or permits the individual to withhold the testimony or evidence in issue. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

MUDE, Priyanka J., D.P.M., (#36.110003) – North Canton, Ohio

Based on allegations when the podiatric doctor admitted during an investigatory interview to creating fraudulent patient profiles and then writing prescriptions in those names, as well as in the names of her husband and sister-in-law for Oxycodone for self-administration, and forging the signature of another physician without their knowledge or consent, and when the podiatric doctor admitted in her response to an investigative subpoena that additional patient records did not exist, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: selling, giving away, personally furnishing, prescribing, or administering drugs for other than legal and legitimate therapeutic purposes or a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction of, a violation of any federal or state law regulating the possession, distribution, or use of any drug; and violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: General Provisions, Utilizing Controlled Substances for Self and Family Members; and Making a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery, or a limited branch of medicine; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or certificate to practice issued by the Board; and a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

PLEISTER, Adam P., M.D., (#35.093819) – Worthington, Ohio

Based on allegations when the doctor failed to arrange an examination with OPHP, and based on the doctor slurring words, smelling of alcohol, loss of consciousness, a fall, instances of putting patient care at risk by ordering incorrect tests, incorrectly charting, ordering medications to

which patients were allergic, failing to report to work as scheduled, consuming alcohol at work, an investigation and suspension from his employer, and based on the doctor failing to attend a 72-hour Board ordered inpatient examination, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: impairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that may impair ability to practice. Opportunity for Hearing on Failure to Submit to an Examination and Notice of Summary Suspension Based Upon Presumption of an Admission of Impairment 8/15/24.

RAJAN, Semur P. G., M.D, (#35.033496) - Mansfield, Ohio

Based on allegations that when a staff member observed the doctor having difficulty with his memory and mobility, and when the doctor arrived at the Board's offices stating he had an appointment with two other doctors, and when the doctor completed a well-being screening that concluded the doctor was unable to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care due to cognitive impairment, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: an inability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of mental illness or physical illness, including, but not limited to, physical deterioration that adversely affects cognitive, motor, or perceptive skills. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

SINGH, Ankita, M.D., (#35.128903) – Maumee, Ohio

Based on allegations the doctor's finding of guilt and conviction in the United States District Court from the Northern District of Ohio to six felony counts of executing a scheme and artifice to defraud Medicare, constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

STEWART, Scott T., P.A., (#50.000926) – Groveport, Ohio

Based on allegations that the physician assistant's plea of guilty in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio to one felony count of Health Care Fraud, constitute: A plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

TAHA, Assad M., M.D., (#35.047968)

Based on allegations when the doctor had one patient disrobe without employing proper draping and disrobing practices, and instructed the patient to "get on all fours" and patted the patient's bare buttocks; and told a second patient to lower their pants without employing proper draping and disrobing practices, and had that patient get on hands and knees for a rectal examination while batting the protrusion in his buttocks back and forth while making a demeaning noise; and repeatedly attempted to remove a third patient's pants despite consent being explicitly revoked, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: prohibition from engaging in sexual misconduct, which also constitutes a departure from, or the failure to conform to,

minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

THOMPSON, Lamoll A., M.T., (#33.026668) – Cleveland, Ohio

Based on allegations when the massage therapist rubbed a patient's vaginal area and pressed his penis against her head and hand, and rubbed a second patient's vaginal area, performed oral sex, and put his penis in that patient's mouth and ejaculated on her face and neck, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: prohibition from engaging in sexual misconduct, which also constitutes a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

YOUNG, David, M.D., (#35.136341) – Fredericksburg, Texas

Based on allegations that the doctor's indictment and conviction in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas to one felony count of conspiracy to commit healthcare fraud and three felony counts of fraudulent statements related to health care matters, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

ZIEGLER, Jordan I., M.D., (#35.143751) – Phoenix, Arizona

Based on allegations that a prior disciplinary action by the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs which adopted a Decision and Order, individually and/or collectively constitute: Any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 8/15/24.

Based on the submission of an application for restoration of a license to practice massage therapy, and on allegations that the massage therapist has not been engaged in the active practice of massage therapy for over two years. Notice of Opportunity for hearing effective 8/28/24.

ABDELMALAK, Joseph Badi, M.D., (#35.093969) - Broadview Heights, Ohio

License to practice medicine and surgery permanently revoked and subject to payment of a twenty thousand dollar (\$20,000.00) fine. Based on the finding with respect to the care and treatment of seven identified patients, when the doctor inappropriately touched the breasts and genital area of patients, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the board, to-wit: the Board's rules prohibiting sexual misconduct, which also constitutes departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Order effective 8/15/24.

BJARKE, Chris, M.D., (#35.132483) - Renton, Washington

License to practice medicine and surgery permanently revoked, and subject to payment of a twenty thousand dollar (\$20,000.00) fine. Based on the finding that a 9/12/22 Information, a 9/26/22 Plea Agreement, and a 9/27/22 Order Accepting Guilty Plea filed in the United States District Court, Eastern District of Washington, and also a 5/25/23 Stipulation to Informal Disposition issued by the Washington Medical Commission, and a 7/7/23 Surrender Order issued by the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, and also a prior 11/13/19 Consent Agreement, constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony; and any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. Order effective upon service. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

CLEMENT, Loretta A., M.D., (#35.054165) - Cincinnati, Ohio

License to practice medicine and surgery suspended for an indefinite period of time and subject to conditions for reinstatement including payment of a three thousand dollar (\$3,000.00) fine, and certification of cooperation with Board investigation. Based on the finding when the doctor

failed to speak with and/or meet with a Board investigator, and failed to answer interrogatories sent by the Board, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: failure to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the Board, including failure to comply with a subpoena or order issued by the Board or failure to answer truthfully a question presented by the Board in an investigative interview, an investigative office conference, at a deposition, or in written interrogatories. Order effective upon service. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

HARASYN, Macsen, M.T., (#33.013881) - McDonald, Ohio (Non-Disciplinary)

Application for restoration of license to practice massage therapy approved, provided that the massage therapist takes and passes the Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination within six months. Based on the submission of an application for restoration of a license to practice massage therapy, and on the finding that the massage therapist has not been engaged in the active practice of massage therapy for over two years. Order effective upon service. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

HERZOG, Delia Jan, M.D., (#35.065804) - Delaware, Ohio

License to practice medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to probationary terms, conditions, and limitations including completion of educational courses, and payment of payment of a five thousand dollar (\$5,000.00) fine. Based on the finding when the doctor failed to provide complete patient records in response to an investigative subpoena duces tecum despite having signed a certification stating such records were complete, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: a failure to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the board, including failure to comply with a subpoena or order issued by the board or failure to answer truthfully a question presented by the board in an investigative interview, an investigative office conference, at a deposition, or in written interrogatories, except that failure to cooperate with an investigation shall not constitute grounds for discipline under this section if a court of competent jurisdiction has issued an order that either quashes a subpoena or permits the individual to withhold the testimony or evidence in issue. Order effective 8/15/24.

POWELL, Steven W., M.D., (#35.136939) - San Francisco, California

License to practice medicine and surgery permanently revoked and subject to payment of a twenty thousand dollar (\$20,000.00) fine. Based on the finding that the doctor's plea of guilty to one felony count of Health Care Fraud in the United States District Court of New Hampshire, constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Order effective upon service. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

WANG-THOMAS, Shuying G., R.C.P., (#RCP.11178) - Cincinnati, Ohio

License to practice as a respiratory care professional is suspended for an indefinite period of time, but not less than thirty (30) days, and subject to conditions for reinstatement including completion of educational courses and payment of a three thousand five hundred dollar (\$3,500.00) fine. Based on the finding when the respiratory care professional failed to follow a

physician's order for a patient, and additionally canceled a physician's order for respiratory care in the patient's electronic health record, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: practicing in an area of respiratory care for which the person is clearly untrained or incompetent or practicing in a manner that conflicts with section 4761.17 of the Revised Code, to wit: Supervised Practice. Order effective 8/15/24.

License to practice medicine and surgery reprimanded, with imposed conditions including completion of educational courses dealing with interpersonal communication, and payment of a five thousand dollar (\$5,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission when he resigned his privileges at a hospital before the conclusion of an investigation into allegations of unwelcome conduct toward hospital staff, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violation of any provision of a code of ethics of the American medical association, the American osteopathic association, the American podiatric medical association, or any other national professional organizations that the board specifies by rule, to wit: Section II of the American Medical Association Code of ethics. Agreement effective 8/14/24.

GRUMBINE, Rowena T., M.D., (#35.133973) - Pocono Pines, Pennsylvania

Summary suspension dated 12/13/23 is terminated, and license to practice medicine and surgery is suspended for an indefinite period of time but not less than one year, and subject to general probationary requirements, and conditions for reinstatement including payment of a three thousand five hundred dollar (\$3,500.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission that prior disciplinary actions by the Maryland State Board of Physicians which issued a 6/7/23 Consent Order, and a 10/17/23 Order of Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, individually and/or collectively constitute: any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. HALASA, Sanah A., R.C.P., (#RCP.5860) - Akron, Ohio

License to practice as a respiratory care professional suspended for an indefinite period of time, but not less than one year, and subject to general probationary requirements and conditions for reinstatement including completion of a professional ethics course, entering into a subsequent consent agreement, and payment of a four thousand five hundred dollar (\$4,500.00) fine. Based on the respiratory care professional's admission when she failed to provide appropriate patient care those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collective constitute: a departure from, or failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar

circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Agreement effective 8/14/24.

HORSLEY, Ross A., M.D., (#35.137726) - Cincinnati, Ohio

License to practice medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to permanent limitation and restriction from prescribing, dispensing, administering, and/or ordering controlled substances to family, friends, co-workers, and colleagues, and precluded from treating family, friends, co-workers, and colleagues. Based on the doctor's admission that a prior disciplinary action by the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, which issued a 10/12/23 Consent Order adopting an 8/16/23 Consent Agreement, individually and/or collectively constitute: any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. Agreement effective 8/14/24.

LESLIE, Audrey Lynn, L.M.T., (#33.020597) - Bowling Green, Ohio

License to practice massage therapy restored, and immediately suspended for a definite period of ninety (90) days, and subject to interim monitoring terms upon restoration, general probationary requirements including completion of educational courses and payment of a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine. Based on the massage therapist's admission when she continued to practice massage therapy despite her license having expired, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: Commission of an act that constitutes a felony in this state, regardless of the jurisdiction in which the act was committed, to wit: Practicing Medicine [or a limited branch] Without Certificate. Agreement effective 8/14/24.

License to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to payment of a three thousand five hundred dollar (\$3,500.00) fine. License to practice medicine and surgery reprimanded, with imposed conditions including completion of educational courses and payment of a two thousand five hundred dollar (\$2,500.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission when he prescribed Schedule IV controlled substances twice to a family member without performing appropriate prior examination and without maintaining a medical record of substances prescribed, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: Utilizing Controlled Substances for Self and Family Members. Agreement effective 8/14/24.
