State Medical Board of Ohio Formal Action Report – January 10, 2024

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Please find below a summary of actions taken or initiated by the State Medical Board of Ohio and an update of Board matters pending or decided in courts as of January 10, 2024.

PRE-HEARING SUSPENSION

CLARK, Dawn M., R.C.P., (#RCP.11834) – Williamsburg, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4761.09(H), license to practice as a respiratory care professional summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the respiratory care professional is in violation of Section 4761.09(A)(18), Ohio Revised Code, and that their continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 1/10/24. (See also: Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

CLARK, Dawn M., R.C.P., (#RCP.11834) – Williamsburg, Ohio

Based on allegations that when the respiratory care professional violated the terms of her Monitoring Agreement with OPHP when she subsequently tested positive for alcohol, admitted to using alcohol, failed to complete a substance use disorder evaluation and informed OPHP she could no longer afford the cost of monitoring, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: impairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that may impair ability to practice. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/10/24.

CLEMENT, Loretta A., M.D., (#35.054165) – Cincinnati, Ohio

Based on allegations that the doctor failed to speak with and/or meet with a Board investigator, and failed to answer interrogatories sent by the Board, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: failure to cooperate in an investigation conducted by the Board, including failure to comply with a subpoena or order issued by the Board or failure to answer truthfully a question presented by the Board in an investigative interview, an investigative office conference, at a deposition, or in written interrogatories Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective upon service.

FRANK, Harrison G., M.D., (#35.147135) – Wilmington, North Carolina

Based on a prior disciplinary action by the North Carolina Medical Board which issued a 1/30/23 Public Letter of Concern, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/16/24.

GOWDA, Chandre C., M.D., (#35.085235) – Dublin, Ohio

Based on allegations that when the doctor falsely certified they were the treating physician on a United States Citizenship and Immigration Services Medical Certification of Disability Exceptions Form, and failed to provide records for at least ten of the people they certified as patients, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: Making a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery, or a limited branch of medicine; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or certificate to practice issued by the Board. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/25/24.

HARDMAN, Justine R., L.M.T., (#33.024167) – Lewis Center, Ohio

Based on allegations with respect to the care and treatment of one identified patient, when the massage therapist admitted to having engaged in sexual conduct with the patient on three separate occasions while providing massage therapy services to the patient, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: the Board's Prohibition regarding sexual misconduct, which also constitute a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/13/24.

HARRISON, Steven W. R.C.P., (#RCP.10403) – South Point, Ohio

Based on allegations that the respiratory care professional failed to adhere to the terms of a 7/13/23 Board Order when they failed to submit a quarterly declaration, to appear for a scheduled personal appearance, to submit to random toxicological screens, to call-in/log-in to drug testing facility, to ensure that screening reports were forwarded to the Board on a quarterly basis, make an arrangement with a designated testing facility and provide documentation to the Board, and submit attendance logs, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violation of the conditions of limitation placed by the board upon a license or permit. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/25/24.

KRIWINSKY, Jan, M.D., (#35.052622) - Beachwood, Ohio

Based on allegations with respect to the care and treatment of three identified patients, when the doctor: treated a patient for strep throat and touched that patient's penis without the purpose of appropriate health care service and without wearing gloves; and treated a second patient for an annual well check appointment, the doctor failed to employ appropriate disrobing or draping practices, made comments not clinically relevant about the patient's sexual activity with his girlfriend, flicked the patient's penis, and engaged in sexual contact when he touched the patient's genitals without wearing gloves; and treated a third patient to an intimate examination in the presence of a third-party without patient consent, wherein he exposed and examined the patient's genitals without wearing gloves, failed to offer the patient a gown, or provide an opportunity to excuse the third-party who was present in the room, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the board, to wit: Prohibitions regarding sexual misconduct which also constitute a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/31/24.

OSHER, Sanford S., M.D., (#35.055036) – Cincinnati, Ohio

Based on allegations that when the doctor utilized a twelve year old third-party chaperone during an intimate patient examination without obtaining consent of the patient, or the juvenile chaperone, or the juvenile's parent/guardian, and without explaining to the juvenile what they would be witnessing, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: Prohibitions regarding sexual misconduct, which also constitute a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/13/24.

POPA, Carmen M.D., (#35.079249) – Parma Heights, Ohio

Based on allegations with respect to the care and treatment of nine identified patients for weight loss, obesity, and/or conditions related to body mass index, when the doctor prescribed schedule II stimulates that were not approved for weight loss, failed to document testing to diagnose conditions, and failed to access or document accessing the Ohio Automated RX Reporting System (OARRS), those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: Utilization of anabolic steroids, schedule II controlled substance cocaine hydrochloride, and schedule II controlled substance stimulants; Prescribing for subacute and chronic pain; and standards and procedures for review of "Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System" (OARRS), which also constitute a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of

similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established; and failure to maintain minimal standards applicable to the selection or administration of drugs, or failure to employ acceptable scientific methods in the selection of drugs or other modalities for treatment of disease; and making a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery, or a limited branch of medicine; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or certificate to practice issued by the Board. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/11/24.

ROSENFIELD, Jonathan L., M.D. (#35.124430) – Atlanta, Georgia

Based on allegations that when the doctor was convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of Texas, Houston Division to one felony count of Conspiracy to Unlawfully Distribute and Dispense Controlled Substances, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony, Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/18/24.

SERRET, Christina, M.D. (#57.252094) – Lakewood, Ohio

Based on allegations when the doctor practiced medicine and surgery at University Hospitals system without a license or a training certificate, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: the commission of an act that constitutes a felony in this state, regardless of the jurisdiction in which the act was committed, to wit: Practicing Medicine [or a limited branch] Without Certificate. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/13/24.

SHAFFER, Diane M., R.C.P. (#RCP.6883) – Akron, Ohio

Based on allegations with respect to the care and treatment of one identified patient, when the respiratory care professional falsely documented as having provided respiratory care to the patient without actually providing that care, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: making a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of respiratory care; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or permit issued by the Board. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective upon service.

WANG-THOMAS, Shuying R.C.P. (#RCP.11178)

Based on allegations that when they failed to follow a physician's order for a respiratory care patient, and also canceled a physician's order for respiratory care in the patient's electronic health record, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: practicing in an area of respiratory care for which the person is clearly untrained or incompetent or practicing in a manner that conflicts with section 4761.17 of the Revised Code, to wit: Supervised Practice. Notice of Opportunity for Hearing effective 1/13/24.

Application for a license to practice as a respiratory care professional denied. Based on the applicant's submission of an application for a license to practice as a respiratory care professional, and on the finding that the applicant has not passed an examination approved under rules adopted by the Board. Order effective 1/14/24.

GETACHEW, Eskender, M.D., (#35.086201) – Delaware, Ohio

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery permanently revoked, and subject to payment of an eighteen thousand dollar (\$18,000.00) fine. Based on the finding when the Ohio Department of Medicaid suspended the doctor's Medicaid provider agreement and all Medicaid reimbursements as the result of credible allegation of fraud, and on the doctor's finding of guilt and conviction in United States District Court, Southern District of Ohio, Eastern Division to eleven felony counts of Unlawful Distribution and Dispensing of Controlled Substances, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute, termination or suspension from participation in the Medicare or Medicaid programs by the department of health and human services or other responsible agency; and a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Order effective 1/10/24.

GHERMAN, John D., M.D., (#35.134629) – Petoskey, Michigan

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery indefinitely suspended, and subject to interim monitoring, conditions for reinstatement, and probationary terms, conditions and limitations for at least two years. Based on the finding when the doctor failed to submit to an examination as ordered by the Board, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: an inability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of mental illness or physical illness, including, but not limited to, physical deterioration that adversely affects cognitive, motor, or perceptive skills. Order effective 1/10/24.

GROCHOWSKI, Arkadiusz K., M.D., (#35.078958) – Bartlett, Illinois

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to payment of a one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) fine, and all terms and conditions contained in the 6/8/22 Consent Agreement to remain in effect. Based on the finding when the doctor executed a Surrender for Cause of DEA Certificate of Registration [DEA Surrender], to the U.S. Department of Justice – Drug Enforcement Agency; and on a prior disciplinary action by the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation of the State of Illinois which entered into a Consent Agreement, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute:

revocation, suspension, restriction, reduction, or termination of clinical privileges by the United States department of defense or department of veterans affairs or the termination or suspension of a certificate of registration to prescribe drugs by the drug enforcement administration of the United States department of justice; and any of the following actions taken by an agency responsible for authorizing, certifying, or regulating an individual to practice a health care occupation or provide health care services in this state or another jurisdiction, for any reason other than the nonpayment of fees: the limitation, revocation, or suspension of an individual's license to practice; acceptance of an individual's license surrender; denial of a license; refusal to renew or reinstate a license; imposition of probation; or issuance of an order of censure or other reprimand; and violation of the conditions of limitation placed by the board upon a license or certificate to practice. Order effective upon service.

LAGER-FERMON, Jennifer M., D.O., (#34.008441) – Loveland, Ohio

License to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery indefinitely suspended, and subject to interim monitoring, conditions for reinstatement, and probationary terms, conditions and limitations for at least five years. Based on the finding when the doctor failed to enter into a monitoring agreement with the Ohio Professional Health Program without providing the Board information that they have been determined to be capable of practicing in accordance with acceptable and prevailing standards of care, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: impairment of ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that may impair ability to practice. Order effective 1/16/24.

MASSULLO, Mary-Helene, D.O., (#34.004036CTR) – Brookfield, Ohio

License to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery permanently revoked, and subject to payment of an eighteen thousand dollar (\$18,000.00) fine. Based on the finding when the doctor pled guilty in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio, Eastern Division, to Conspiracy to Commit Health Care Fraud, those acts and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: a plea of guilty to, a judicial finding of guilt of, or a judicial finding of eligibility for intervention in lieu of conviction for, a felony. Order effective upon service. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

SHARFAL, Daniel C., M.T., (#33.007155) – Austintown, Ohio

License to practice massage therapy reprimanded, and subject to probationary terms, conditions, and limitations until successful completion of educational courses. Based on the finding when the massage therapist exposed the breasts of two specified patients during a massage, and also touched the vaginal area of one of those patients, those actions and/or omissions, individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions of this chapter or any rule promulgated by the board, to with Prohibitions against engaging in sexual misconduct with a patient, and a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established. Order effective 1/25/24.

SMITH, Scott W., M.D., (#35.144277) – Mount Pleasant, South Carolina

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery permanently revoked, and subject to payment of a four thousand five hundred dollar (\$4,500.00) fine. Based on the finding when the Drug Enforcement Administration issued an Order to Show Cause and Immediate Suspension of Registration which immediately suspended the doctor's registration, and when the doctor voluntarily surrendered his DEA registration, those actions and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: the revocation, suspension, restriction, reduction, or termination of clinical privileges by the United States department of defense or department of veterans affairs or the termination or suspension of a certificate of registration to prescribe drugs by the drug enforcement administration of the United States department of justice. Order effective 1/25/24.

TAYLOR, Neal, L.M.T. Applicant – Kent, Ohio (Non-Disciplinary)

Application for a license to practice massage therapy conditionally approved, provided that they take and pass the Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination [MBLEx] within six months. Based on the finding that the massage therapist has not been engaged in the active practice of massage therapy in excess of two years. Order effective 1/10/24. (Journal Entry-No Hearing Requested).

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to payment of a five thousand dollar (\$5,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission that when he demonstrated unprofessional communication during interactions with a co-worker in the workplace setting, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violation of any provision of a code of ethics of the American medical association, the American osteopathic association, the American podiatric medical association, or any other national professional organizations that the board specifies by rule, to wit: Section II of the American Medical Association Code of Ethics. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

KLAMAR, Jan E., M.D., (#35.059432) – Columbus, Ohio

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded. Based on the doctor's admission when under the influence of alcohol he raised his voice to staff providing a procedure to a family horse, and continued to do so even after police were dispatched to the area, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: Commission of an act involving moral turpitude that constitutes a misdemeanor in this state, regardless of the jurisdiction in which the act was committed, to wit: disorderly conduct. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

LEATHERMAN, Katherine L., L.D., (#LD.5767) - Powell, Ohio

License to practice as a licensed dietician reprimanded, with conditions imposed including successful completion of educational courses dealing with professional ethics. Based on the dietician's admission when while employed by Columbus Public Health, she entered false information into the WIC system to complete certifications/recertifications of clients in the program, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: making a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of dietetics; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or permit issued by the Board under this chapter. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

LOVE, David D., M.T., (#33.023748) - Cleveland, Ohio

License to practice massage therapy suspended for a definite period of 120 days, with imposed conditions including successful completion of boundaries course within one year, and payment of a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine. Based on the massage therapist's admission that when he practice massage therapy without a license between July 2022 to November 2022, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: commission of an act that constitutes a felony in this state, regardless of the jurisdiction in which the act was committed, to wit: practicing medicine without a license. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

MARK, Matthew M., M.D., (#35.075459) – Bedford, Ohio

Commencing on the thirty-first date of effective date, license to practice allopathic medicine and Ohio suspended for a definite period of ninety (90) days. Doctor prohibited from undertaking the care of new patients during thirty-day interim wind down period, and also subject to probationary terms until the completion of educational courses, and payment of a ten thousand dollar (\$10,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission when he has several prescriptions issued to himself for a controlled substance while using the name of a colleague as the prescribing physician, and failed to document the medical treatment in his personal patient chart, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: failure to maintain minimal standards applicable to the selection or administration of drugs, or failure to employ acceptable scientific methods in the selection of drugs or other modalities for treatment of disease. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

RUMP, Olivia, L.D, (#LD.08480) - Ottawa, Ohio

License to practice as a license dietician is reprimanded, and subject to imposed conditions including successful completion of educational courses within one year. Based on the dietician's admission while employed by Columbus Public Health she entered false information into the WIC system to complete a recertification of a client in the program, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: making false, fraudulent, deceptive, or misleading statement in the solicitation of or advertising for patients; in relation to the practice of dietetics; or in securing or attempting to secure any license or permit issued by the board under this chapter. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

SUNDHEIMER, Alan B. M.D., (#35.040004) - Holland, Ohio

License to practice allopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to imposed conditions including the successful completion of educational courses, and payment of a one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission that when he failed to check OARRS reports for several patients prior to initiating treatment with controlled substances, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: Standards and procedures for review of Ohio Automated RX Reporting System. Agreement effective 1/10/24.

WATKINS, Mark G., D.O., (#34.009077) - Toledo, Ohio

License to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery reprimanded, and subject to probationary terms until the successful completion of educational courses and payment of a three thousand dollar (\$3,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission that when he made multiple attempts to solicit a romantic date from the mother of one of his pediatric patients, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of, or conspiring to violate, any provisions or any rule promulgated by the Board, to wit: Prohibitions regarding engaging in sexual misconduct. Agreement effective 1/10/24.
