## State Medical Board of Ohio Formal Action Report – March 12, 2025

Please find below a summary of actions taken or initiated by the State Medical Board of Ohio and an update of Board matters pending or decided in courts as of March 12, 2025.

## PRE-HEARING SUSPENSIONS

**GENETTA**, Timothy D., D.O., (#34.006561) – Flushing, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), Ohio Revised Code, license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the licensee is in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and that his continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 3/12/25. (See also: Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

**GROSS**, Irina Y., D.P.M., (#36.003747) – Chagrin Falls, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4731.22(G), Ohio Revised Code, license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the licensee is in violation of Section 4731.22(B)(26), Ohio Revised Code, and that her continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Order effective 3/12/25. (See also: Citations/Proposed Denials below.)

GROSS, Irina Y., R.C.P., (#RCP.8077) - Chagrin Falls, Ohio

Pursuant to Section 4761.09(H), Ohio Revised Code, license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the licensee is in violation of Section 4761.09 (A)(18), Ohio Revised Code, and that her continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Pursuant to Section 4730.25(G), Ohio Revised Code, license to practice as a physician assistant summarily suspended based on Board's determination that there is clear and convincing evidence that the licensee is in violation of Section 4730.25(B)(5), Ohio Revised Code, and that her continued practice presents a danger of immediate and serious harm to the public. Based on the legal presumption that the doctor's failure to submit to an examination as ordered by the Board constitutes an admission that he is unable to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care by reason of his habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. Opportunity For Hearing on Failure to Submit to an Examination and Notice of Summary Suspension Based Upon Presumption of an Admission of Impairment effective 3/23/25.

**GROSS**, Irina Y., D.P.M., (#36.003747) – Chagrin Falls, Ohio

Based on allegations that doctor is impaired in her ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 3/13/25.

**GROSS**, Irina Y., R.C.P., (#RCP.8077) – Chagrin Falls, Ohio

Based on allegations that respiratory care professional is impaired in her ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 3/13/25.

## **NASH**, Alison M., P.A., (#50.006093RX) – Leipsic, Ohio

Based on allegations that physician assistant is impaired in her ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 3/13/25.

## **RAJAN**, Semur P G, M.D., (#35.033496) – Mansfield, Ohio

Based on allegations that the massage therapist is impaired in her ability to practice according to acceptable and prevailing standards of care because of substance use disorder or habitual or excessive use or abuse of drugs, alcohol, or other substances that impair ability to practice. Notice of Summary Suspension and Opportunity for Hearing effective 3/13/25.

#### SUNDARAM, Candadai M. M., M.D., (#35.149215) – Milwaukee, Wisconsin

License to practice medicine and surgery reprimanded, with required completion of educational courses, and payment of a three-thousand-dollar (\$3,000.00) fine. Based on the doctor's admission when the doctor had one patient disrobe without employing proper draping and disrobing practices, and instructed the patient to "get on all fours" and patted the patient's bare buttocks; and told a second patient to lower their pants without employing proper draping and disrobing practices, and had that patient get on hands and knees for a rectal examination while batting the protrusion in his buttocks back and forth while making a demeaning noise; and repeatedly attempted to remove a third patient's pants despite consent being explicitly revoked, those acts and/or omissions individually and/or collectively constitute: prohibition from engaging in sexual misconduct, which also constitutes a departure from, or the failure to conform to, minimal standards of care of similar practitioners under the same or similar circumstances, whether or not actual injury to a patient is established.
