Rate Increases Included In HB 33

Non-Institutional Services

Transportation, Dentists, Pharmacy, Physician, Vision, Dialysis, Testing & Lab, Durable Medical Equipment, etc.

HCBS Waiver Services

Home Health Nursing (PDN & Waiver nursing), Personal Care Aide, Home Health Aide, Adult day, Assisted Living, etc.

Behavioral Health Services

Community behavioral health services, mental health peer recovery support service, free-standing psych hospital and acute psychiatric units



Processes for Implementing Rate Increases

Top Priorities

- Obtain Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approval BEFORE end of the quarter in which we want new rate increases to go
 into effect.
- Start clearance in August -> Formal rule process October.

State Plan Amendments (SPA)

- Target: rate increases go into effect January 1, 2024.
- There will be a variety of rule packages. Please refer to the provider process tracker to identify which rule(s) you should be following.
- Some provider types may have more than one rule they will need to follow (i.e. dental)
- For some rules the actual "rates" will be included in the Appendix.

HB 33 appropriated funding for various service categories. ODM is working with existing codes, formulas, etc., to establish new rates.

Other rate increases of note: Home and community-based waivers and behavioral health



New department of Children and Youth

Adoption, child-care, early childhood, maternal and infant mortality



Makes continuous Medicaid coverage available for children ages 0-3



Continued implementation of ODM's Maternal and Infant Support Program (mom/baby dyad care, doulas, lactation consultants, postpartum nurse home visits) and Healthy Beginnings at Home



Expansion of Medicaid school program



Medicaid Buy-In for Workers with Disabilities > 65 y.o.



Meaningful employment

- Next Generation work collaborative JFS/ODM
- Community work orgs, MCOs
