MyCare Ohio is a managed care program designed to coordinate care for Ohioans who receive both Medicaid and Medicare benefits.

What changes are coming to MyCare Ohio? The Next Generation MyCare!

The Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) is in the process of selecting managed care plans to serve as the Next Generation MyCare Ohio plans as we transition out of the Financial Alignment Initiative demonstration and move toward a Fully Integrated Dual-Eligible Special Needs Plan (FIDE SNP) model. Beginning in January of 2026, the selected FIDE SNPs will become the new MyCare Ohio plans and begin covering the full Medicare and Medicaid benefits for those who qualify in the current 29 demonstration counties, with statewide expansion as soon as possible.

What benefits will providers receive from MyCare Ohio today and in the future?

-  Additional support for providers in continuously improving care.
-  Decreased administrative burden.
-  Improved program transparency and accountability.

What is the impact of MyCare Ohio?

12% Improvement in the number of home- and community-based services needed than non-MyCare counties.

10.5% Lower inpatient hospital use than non-MyCare counties.

8% Lower use of Medicaid-funded nursing facility services than non-MyCare counties.

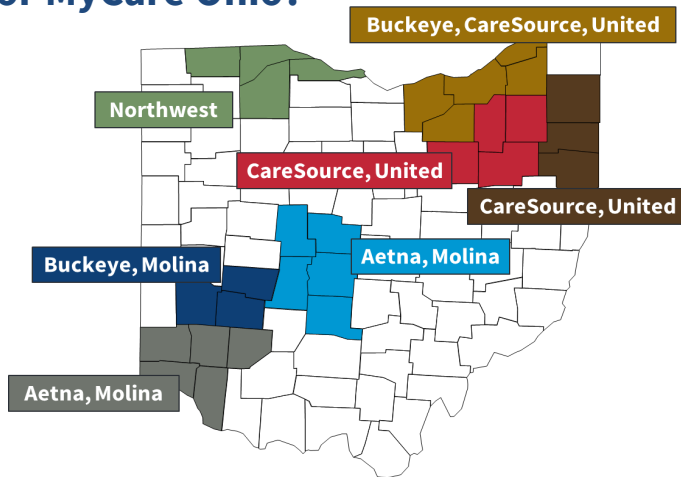
Reduction In use of home- and community-based services.

How does a member know if they are eligible for MyCare Ohio?

To be eligible for the MyCare Ohio program today, a member must be:

- ✓ Eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid services;
- ✓ Age 18 and older*; and
- ✓ Reside in one of the 29 counties where MyCare Ohio is currently available*.

*In the Next Generation MyCare program, members must be 21 years and older. Additionally, the program will be available statewide.
