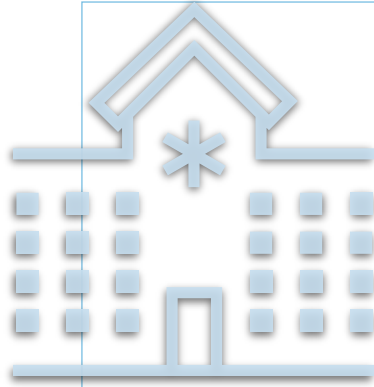
CPC Overview



CPC Overview

- Team-based care delivery model led by a primary care practice that comprehensively manages a patient's healthcare needs with the goal of improving quality of care and lowering costs by empowering practices to deliver the best care possible
- Program Year 2024 will run from 1/1/2024 to 12/31/2024
- Program regulations are in the following Ohio Administrative Code rules:
 - 5160-19-01 at <https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-administrative-code/rule-5160-19-01>
 - 5160-19-02 at <https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-administrative-code/rule-5160-19-02>

CPC Overview



CPC practices may be eligible for two additional payment streams based on their performance on metrics and activities:

- Per-member-per-month (PMPM) payments
- Shared savings payments to reward total cost of care savings



CPC gives practices access to data and reports that provide information needed to help make better decisions about outreach, care, and referrals for patients

CPC Eligibility

Provider Type

Individual physicians and practices, professional medical groups, rural health clinics, federally qualified health centers, etc.*

Specialty

Medical doctor (MD), doctor of osteopathy (DO), clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse practitioner, or physician assistant with the appropriate specialty*

Size

At least 500 claims-only members to participate independently or as a partnership

At least 150 claims-only members to participate as a practice partnership

CPC Clinical Quality Metrics

- Well-child visits in the 1st 15 months of life
- Child/adolescent well-child visits for members aged 3 to 11 years
- Child and adolescent well-child visits for members aged 12 to 17 years
- Weight assessment and counseling for nutrition and physical activity for children and adolescents. BMI assessment for children and adolescents
- Timeliness of prenatal care
- Live births weighing less than 2,500 grams
- Postpartum care
- Chlamydia screening for women
- Cervical cancer screening
- Controlling high blood pressure
- Asthma medication ratio
- Statin therapy for members with cardiovascular disease
- Comprehensive diabetes care; HbA1c poor control (greater than 9%)
- Comprehensive diabetes care: blood pressure control
- Comprehensive diabetes care: eye exam
- Antidepressant medication management
- Follow-up after hospitalization for mental illness
- Preventive care and screening: tobacco use, screening and cessation intervention
- Initiation and engagement of alcohol and other drug dependence treatment
- Well visits for members who are 18 to 21 years of age

CPC for Kids Overview

Emphasizes primary care to support improved population health outcomes for the pediatric population

Optional program for those enrolled in CPC

Includes additional quality metrics and bonus incentives

Incentives are based on performance on pediatric-related metrics and CPC for Kids activities

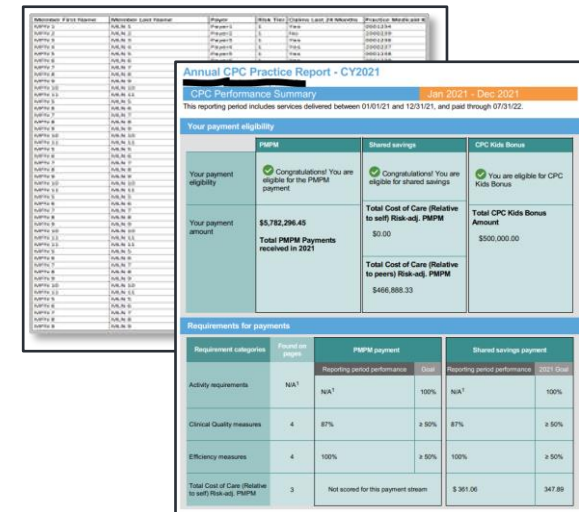

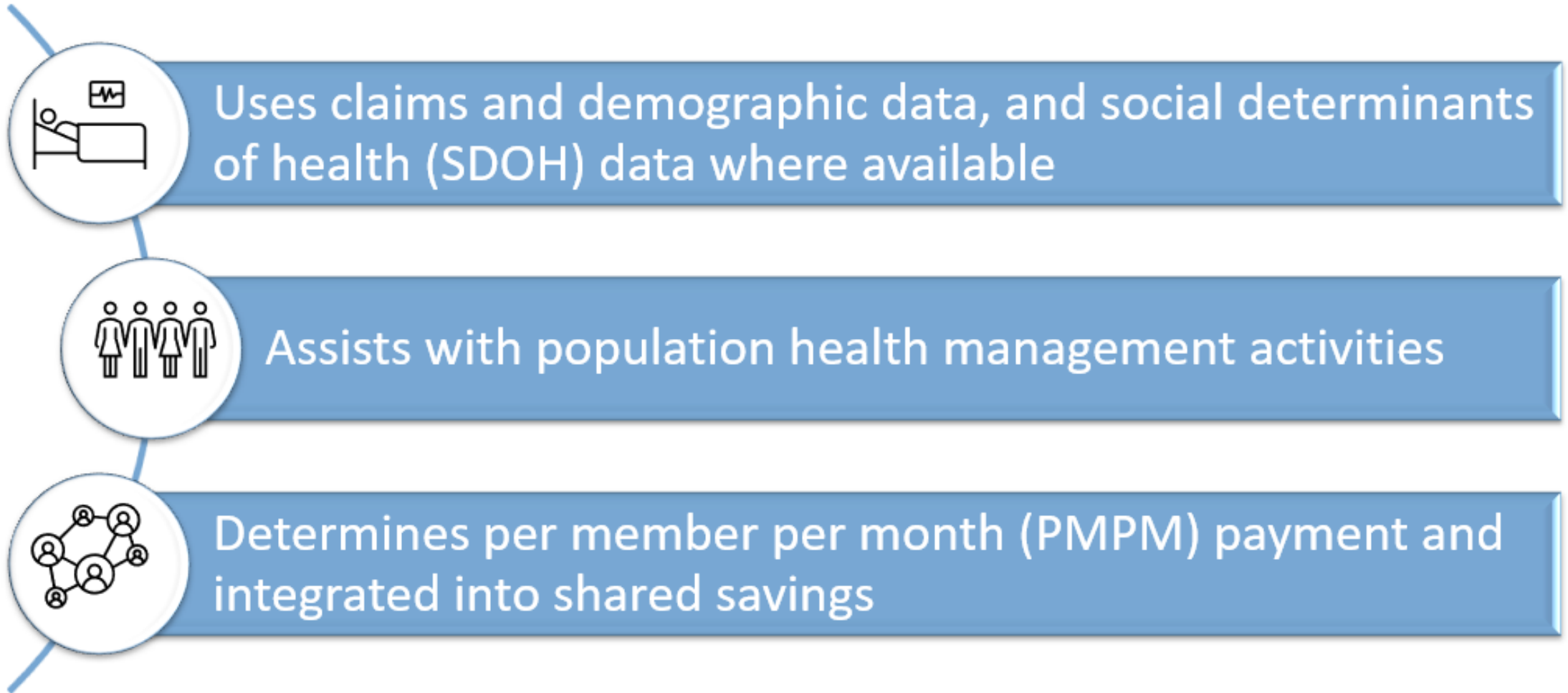

Chronic Illness and Disability Payment System + Prescriptions (CDPS + Rx)

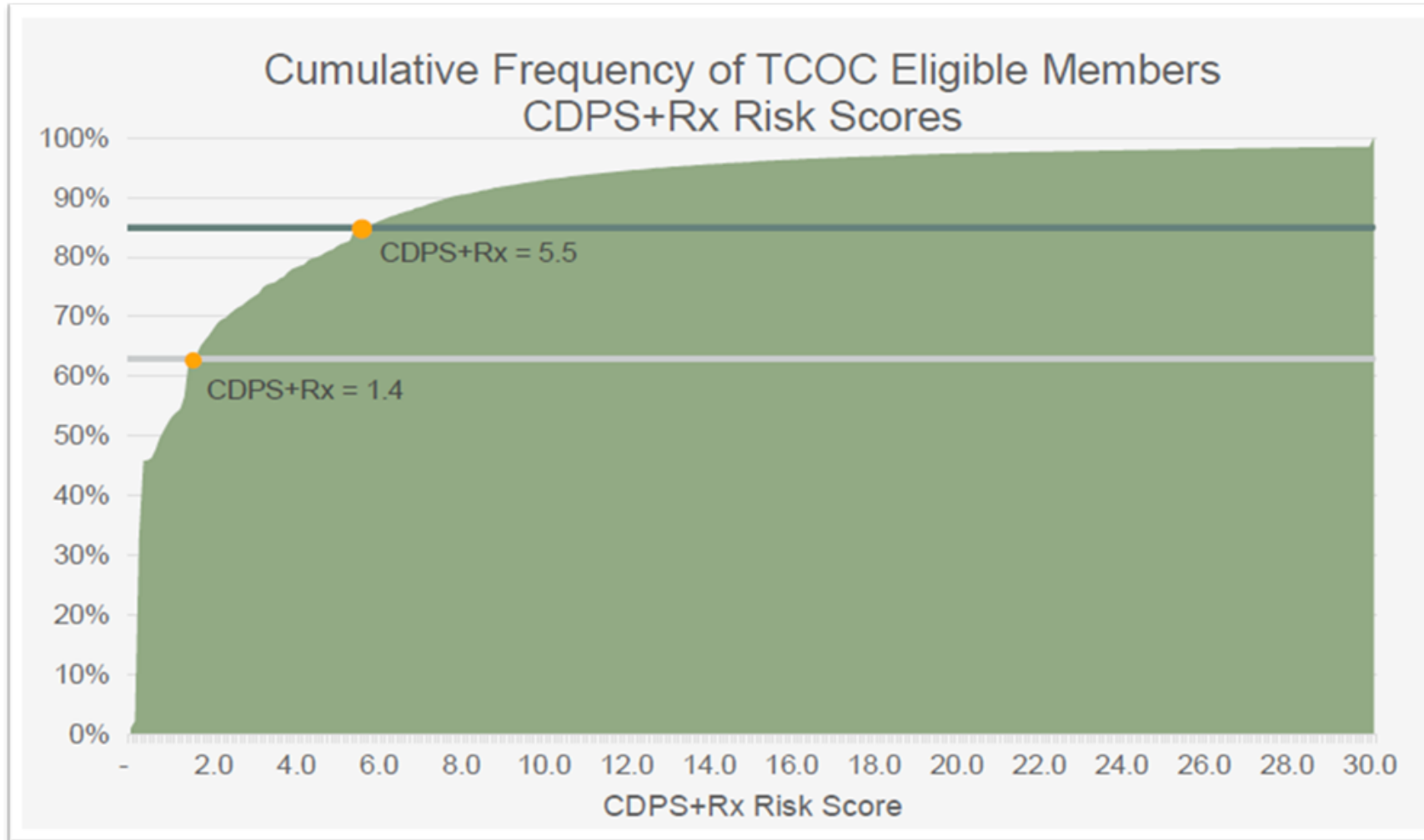
- Members are assigned a unique risk score developed from historical diagnoses, national drug codes, and demographics
- Different sets of risk weights depending on the member's aid category:
 - Able Adult (AA)
 - Able Child (AC)
 - Disabled Adult (DA)
 - Disabled Child (DC)
- For risk scores to be comparable for all members, AC, DA and DC risk scores were normalized to be the same as an AA
 - Required comparing the relative morbidity of members across aid categories
- Separate weights to reflect concurrent or prospective risk for various benefit packages
 - Standard concurrent acute weights were used

CDPS + Rx Risk Score Example

- TANF Child aged 4
- Risk score starts at 0.069
- Has a low-risk central nervous system (CNS) condition of epilepsy
- Adds 2.209 to their risk score
- Total risk score: 2.278

- As of December 5th there are now new provider reports that explain non-claim, lump sum payments dating back to February 1st
- Reports are found in the self-service location, along with all other remittance advices (RAs)
- The RA will specify details such as: payment method, RA date, payment ID, reason code description, and amount paid
- The naming convention is consistent with all other RAs
 - The digits represent the payment date, followed by the provider's NPI
