Ohio's State Opioid & Stimulant Response (SOS) 3.0 Grant

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) awarded the State of Ohio approximately \$97M in State Opioid Response (SOR) funding through federal fiscal year (FFY) 2023 to implement tailored approaches in prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery supports for opioid use disorder, stimulant use disorder, and/or co-occurring disorders. This funding will allow the state to expand upon the efforts planned for and implemented through the CURES State Targeted Response (STR) Initiative awarded in 2017, SOR 1.0 grant awarded in 2018, and the SOR 2.0 grant awarded in 2020.

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) titled this iteration of SOR as "State Opioid and Stimulant Response" or SOS 3.0. Ohio's SOS 3.0 grant aligns state level efforts with community partners engaging a focused, data-driven approach shifting Ohio from "battling" to successfully "emerging" from the opioid epidemic. OhioMHAS coordinated with statewide partners, state level agencies, and Governor Mike DeWine's RecoveryOhio initiative to identify Ohio's goals to address substance use and abuse, including to:

1. Reduce Unintentional Overdose Deaths
2. Increase Access to Addiction Treatment
3. Prevent Youth Alcohol and Drug Use
4. Increase Recovery Supports
5. Support Responsible Prescribing Practice
6. Promote Harm Reduction Practices

Implementing SOS 3.0

SOS 3.0 funding will be distributed through state and local partnerships as pre-approved by SAMSHA. OhioMHAS partners with 50 county Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health (ADAMH) Boards with statutory authority for planning services in 88 local county catchment areas. These Boards contract with local entities who provide Ohio's core behavioral health treatment, prevention, harm reduction, and recovery support services. OhioMHAS also partners with state level agencies and community organizations directly to provide targeted community-based services, innovative initiatives, and special population programming.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

TREATMENT

QRT/OCRT responds to opioid overdoses to provide on scene screenings, treatment referrals, MAT linkage, and crisis placement.

Ohio Valley Physicians offers 3.5 and 3.7 level of care residential substance use disorder services. Shawnee Mental Health offers MAT and additional services in Lawrence County.

Individuals who refuse medical care or Emergency Department transport are offered a brief screening, referral to treatment, MAT linkage, or other crisis placement services. This program allows access to a larger proportion of the community missed in the current Emergency Department response.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services provide support for Level III housing for substance use disorder clients. In addition, peer supporters are provided throughout the area.

VOCATIONAL SUPPORTS

Vocational support services assist individuals pre and post release from settings of incarceration. The curriculum focuses on skill building for job readiness, financial education, and life skills in courses such as workplace etiquette, building credit and more. Courses support certification and employment in electric, plumbing, equipment operations, construction, auto mechanic, deck handling, and environmental services.

Providers: The Counseling Center, Shawnee Mental Health Center, THRIVE Peer Support, and Ohio Valley Physicians provide services in this area.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

TREATMENT

Treatment services provide expanded access to MAT and offer navigation services to outpatient treatment. The navigation service provides a network of resources that are on demand and same day access to care.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services offer family stabilization outreach through navigation services, working with families to reduce out of home placements by providing quick linkage to treatment for parents with SUD and co-occurring disorders. In addition, trauma informed treatment is provided for children removed from their homes.

Recovery Housing Support Specialist/Coordinators provide support to owner/operators of local qualified recovery houses to assure quality services.

Other recovery support services provide support to clients who have opioid and/or stimulant use disorders by assisting clients with intake paperwork, completion of GPRA, navigating placement options when housing is disrupted, offer support groups, and connects clients with community resources.

This Board area also provides transportation services to eliminate transportation barriers.

Supportive trauma informed childcare services are provided through Rhodes State College Early Learning Center, for children of parents in intensive inpatient or partial hospitalization treatment for Opioid or Stimulant Use Disorders.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

Prevention funding provides services for Ashland County k-12, youth; adults involved in criminal justice, parents/caregivers/foster families involved with child protective services and adults/youth of targeted community partners.

TREATMENT

Treatment services are provide for adult domestic/sexual/dating violence, stalking, and human trafficking survivors in the Ashland County Domestic Violence Shelter ('Safe Haven').

RECOVERY

Recovery supports services are provided for Ashland County residents in recovery housing, domestic violence shelters and for individuals receiving services for OUD.

Additional recovery support services offer transportation and Navigator services to increase behavioral health treatment participation and involvement in key supportive services.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

The local Criminal Justice system provides co-occurring and SUD only treatment services in the jail to reduce relapse and recidivism rates.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

Virtual Zero Suicide Training Academy equips providers and staff with the tools needed to address suicide ideations, which remains high among individuals with opioid and stimulant disorders.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

System Navigators screens pre-trial and post-conviction individuals on probation to determine and assist with treatment and recovery support needs.

Access to treatment is streamlined by collaboration between the criminal justice and local probation department.

TREATMENT

Treatment services include contingency management, motivational incentives, and tangible rewards to encourage sobriety and behaviors that support healthy living.

The MOMS, program for pregnant women and new moms maintains the goal of fostering recovery, ensuring child safety, and promoting family stability.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services provides maternal recovery housing for women with OUD/Stimulant Use Disorder and their children. It also intends to increase recovery housing supports with the expansion of a newly designed recovery house for men. In addition, increased access to SUD peer support services is also provided.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION/EARLY INTERVENTION

Athens Adolescent Outpatient Program expands the existing, evidence-based program to provide early intervention/outpatient services, clinical support, and wrap-around services to Appalachian students.

TREATMENT

Residential Treatment expands access through OTP and residential support creating a multiagency pathway to treatment including through the emergency department, overdose response team and the harm reduction program. Further services include the following populations: adolescents and their families through residential treatment and clinical support services.

MOMS (Maternal Opiate Medical Supports), provides MAT and clinical support wrap-around services to pregnant and post-partum women diagnosed with opioid or stimulant use disorder.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal Justice programs provide court intervention and expand access to MAT, while addressing social determinants of health. In addition, the programs focus on causal factors that trigger and exacerbate the disease cycle of addiction through assessment and evidence-based programming for justice involved clients.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

QRT/Peer Support Services utilize a rapid access model combined with support to develop authentic relationships and facilitate referrals to community providers.

Recovery Support Services aids clients in gaining and maintaining housing in recovery and sober living settings and independent community living environments while targeting both single adults and women with children.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Peer supporters' partner with three county jails providing services to both male and female populations. The connection continues after the individual is released from the hospital or the jail to assist in treatment, recovery supports and other services engagement.

Peer supporters coordinate continuation of care for those referred by the jails, who are MAT eligible to board supported outpatient providers.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services implement two peer recovery support programs in the Belmont, Harrison, and Monroe County jails to assist clients struggling with opioid and other stimulant use disorders. Peer supporters refers eligible SUD clients to residential and other ASAM supported services.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

Prevention programming provides family support services for those with family members who have SUD. Additionally, programs implement prevention messaging via social media and the Strengthening Families Program.

TREATMENT

Quick Response Teams provide Narcan training, community resources, assessments, treatment options, and education regarding medical risks.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal Justice programming provides consultation, assessments, and referrals for treatment and assists with MAT engagement within the county jail and municipal court.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Programming for recovery support services provides transportation, recovery support, and engage clients in treatment including medication-assisted treatment services.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

The Health Habits and Anti-Stigma Reduction campaign focuses on reducing stigma and engaging individuals and families.

EARLY INTERVENTION/OUTREACH

Harm Reduction Collaborative which is a five-county initiative, in partnership with the Project DAWN and syringe exchange sites, addresses the needs within the community through the distribution of Naloxone, supplies, and outreach across five counties.

TREATMENT

Extended Care and Rehabilitation, provides individuals with co-occurring conditions access to clinicians with ability to assess, diagnose and treat substance use disorders.

The Harm Reduction Collaborative provides a mobile unit.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal Justice programming provides jail-based peer recovery support to assist with IOP engagement, provides access to case management and post-release planning, and additional recovery supports.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Drop-in engagement services, provides access to resources such as Medicaid enrollment, obtaining a driver's license, and wrap-around recovery supports.

Additional programs provide peer recovery support, reentry planning/case management, and warm-hand off services.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

Prevention programs provide Triple P, Botvin LifeSkills, and other various school-based prevention curriculum. Also, adult prevention education curriculum is provided through prevention funding.

TREATMENT

Treatment services offer MAT and treatment of co-occurring disorders. Also provided is trauma informed care with wrap-around services and community linkages.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Programming for criminal justice provides pre-release jail-based assessment and treatment engagement including peer recovery support services.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services provide access to recovery housing and housing assistance, linkages to treatment, and workforce engagement including faith-based providers and partners which utilize gender-specific/trauma-informed approaches to treatment.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION

Prevention programming offers a variety of evidence-based practices such as, Botvin LifeSkills and Prime for Life to support youth in building healthy and effective coping skills. Prevention specialist staff expand capacity by offering after school programming.

TREATMENT

Treatment services provide community-based OTP and increased nursing staff availability.

In addition, programs provide comprehensive, integrated mental health and substance use disorder services to individuals with severe and persistent mental illness with co-occurring SUD disorders in a single location.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

County's Community Alternative Sentencing Center (CASC) provides treatment in lieu of jail days for inmates who qualify. Treatment Alternatives for Street Crime (TASC), provides triage, assessments, and coordinates transition back to the community from CASC. Additional provisions include continued community corrections-based MAT and treatment services.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services offers peer recovery support services at all Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health Services (GCGH), which includes housing assistance, OTP, and transportation services. Peer recovery supporters are embedded within recovery houses.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION & EARLY INTERVENTION

In prevention and early intervention programs, coordinators provide evidence-based programs such as SMART Recovery and mindfulness to promote good decision-making and encourage a drug free lifestyle.

TREATMENT

Treatment programming focuses on strengthening and expanding behavioral health systems to assist individuals with opioid and stimulant use disorders with a continuum of treatment and recovery supports. Programming also provides increased access to MAT and other recovery supports.

A mobile crisis response unit helps improve service delivery.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal justice programming works collaboratively with the courts to provide treatment in lieu of jail time/ incarceration. Also included are added supports and coordination with local courts and detention facilities.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery supports use increased access to safe, stable recovery housing, which provides ongoing supports to help facilitate the transition into independent living.

Recovery peer supporters help clients develop plans and set goals to help them sustain a drug free lifestyle and connect with needed resources.

PREVENTION

Programs conduct prevention events to distribute Naloxone and harm reduction supplies. Partnering with local law enforcement, EMS, and the medical examiner to identify zip codes with high EMS runs for overdoses and overdose fatalities.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal justice makes provision for access to MAT for individuals residing in Cuyahoga County Jail.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services provide housing and recovery support, such as linkage, case management, transportation, vocational training, etc. for men, women, and women with children. Also available is houses serving specialized populations such as LGBTQ, adult men of color, women and children, female veterans, and faith based.

Recovery efforts provide strategically placed hand-written note cards with encouragement and phone numbers for resources.

Peer support services are provided in-person and virtually to clients in treatment and recovery.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION & EARLY INTERVENTION

Prevention and early intervention programs provide evidence-based prevention curriculum such as “CATCH My Breath” and “I Mind”, community and school-based educational events, medication lock box distribution, and prevention coalition coordination. Programming utilizes a digital platform for community education campaigns and to disseminate “The 5 Signs That You’re Ready for Recovery” guide. The goal of the curriculum is to provide students with the skills to resist peer pressure and media influences to use e-cigarettes and avoid substance use.

TREATMENT

Continue partnerships with law enforcement, hospitals, courts, Department of Job and Family Services, and peer recovery supporters provide rapid linkage to treatment utilizing innovative treatment options and withdraw management services.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Criminal justice services provide MAT and recovery support services to inmates in the Delaware County jail.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

The Trauma Loss Response Team responds to traumatic and sudden death within four counties providing support to overdose survivors and families.

TREATMENT

Treatment programing collaborates with local healthcare providers to enhance partial hospitalization programs, expand intensive outpatient programs, and MAT access.

In addition, Treatment provides withdraw management and residential services for individuals to access higher levels of care for those struggling with opioid and other substance use disorders.

Prevention and Early Intervention programming trains and educates the community to increase awareness of OUD/SUD and reduce the stigma of addiction.

Prevention also partners with the local schools to provide evidence-based prevention programs, focusing on suicide prevention, alcohol, and drug use, vaping, and making good decisions.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

PREVENTION/ EARLY INTERVENTION

The Quick Response Team (QRT) responds to overdoses within the community and provides support.

Narcan Vending Machines machines are strategically placed throughout the county to provide equal access and opportunity to free Narcan 24/7.

TREATMENT

Treatment services provide Project Direct Link (PDL), a substance abuse treatment including MAT to individuals currently incarcerated.

Rapid access for MAT and residential treatment are provided through Treatment funding.

Treatment also provides Mobile Response and Stabilization Services for families.

Through Treatment programs, BRIDGE Devices are provided to individuals. The BRIDGE Device is an FDA-cleared, non-pharmaceutical intervention device offered with outpatient MAT for aiding in the reduction of Opiate withdrawal symptoms.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

The QRT provides a pretrial diversion program that offers treatment alternatives to individuals with felony charges.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Recovery support services provide a Forensic Liaison, who provides coordination services for individuals with substance abuse disorders involved in the criminal justice system.

Also provided are engagement and outreach services through peer support workers, recovery housing, and transportation services.
