SFY 2021-2022 Community Plan Guidelines

Introduction

- The SFY 2021-2022 Community Plan template was redesigned, and feedback on the new template was provided by a group comprised of Board representatives.
- Director's Cover Letter (PDF), Community Plan Guidelines (MS-Word), Guidance Document (PDF) and Continuum of Care spreadsheet (MS-Excel) will be sent soon.
- Each Board's completed SFY 2019-2020 Continuum of Care Spreadsheet was e-mailed separately to Board directors.
- Due date is Friday, June 19, 2020.
- Work is continuing to align the Community Plan and the State Health Improvement Plan community needs assessment process of the Ohio Department of Health.



Key Principles of Plan

- **Planning**
 - Focus on the identification of local Board priorities
 - Identification of data and environmental factors
- **Alignment with Identified Priorities**
 - Identification of any alignment with State and Federal priorities
- **Data Collection**
 - Track at least one indicator for each identified priority

Evaluating and Highlighting the Need for Services and Supports

1. Describe the community needs assessment process that led to the identification of the local priorities.
2. Identification of the Board's unique priorities.
3. Data collection.
4. Describe all environmental factors that influenced the identified priorities. (*economic, social and demographic factors, transportation, unemployment, uninsured/underinsured population, poverty rates, housing availability, incarceration rates, etc.*)

RecoveryOhio

OhioMHAS is particularly interested in updates or the status of the following areas identified as priorities for RecoveryOhio:

- Access and capacity changes for mental health and addiction services for both adults and children/youth
- Health equity concerns for racial and ethnic minorities and people living in Appalachia or rural Ohio
- Distinctive challenges for multisystem youth, families involved in child welfare, and for criminal justice-involved Ohioans
- Prevention and/or decrease of opiate overdoses and/or deaths
- Suicide prevention.



Evaluating and Highlighting the Need for Services and Supports

5. Describe any child service needs resulting from any finalized dispute resolution with the county Family and Children First Council.
6. Describe how future outpatient service needs of persons currently receiving inpatient treatment in the State Regional Psychiatric Hospitals are identified.

Collaboration

- In this section, the Board is asked to identify planned collaborative efforts that will be needed to implement the identified priorities.
- In former templates, Boards identified previous community collaborate efforts that they have been involved since the last planning cycle.
- Now, the Boards should identify what collaborations will be needed to meet the identified priorities in the previous section of the plan.



Inpatient Hospital Management and Transition Planning

- This section is requesting information on what partnerships will be needed between the Board, public and private hospitals and outpatient providers for the identification of needed community services and supports.
- How will the Board coordinate the transition from the hospital to the community (i.e.; discharge planning)?
- How will they ensure that this takes place? Who will be responsible for this?

Continuum of Care Service Inventory

- This section is identical to previous planning templates.
- Boards will be provided a spreadsheet to complete to identify area providers for statutorily-required services and supports.



Alignment with Federal and State Priorities

- This section is similar to previous planning templates.
- A table will be provided to identify any alignment with identified federal and state priorities.
- The eighteen (18) identified priorities on this template are identical to those on the SFY 2019-2020 Community Plan template.
- Boards are asked to identify at least one measurement indicator, and subsequent baseline data, that will be used to track progress towards meeting the identified priority(ies.)
