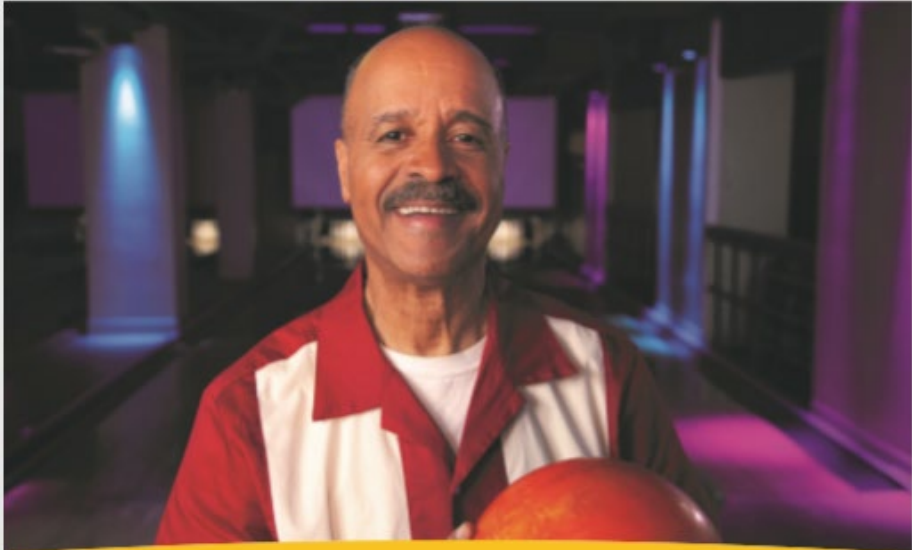

CAMPAIGN GOAL

To create awareness of problem gambling across communities in Ohio, so that influencers and gamblers can understand what responsible gambling looks like; recognize the signs of high-risk gambling and addiction; and know how to get help for loved ones.

Phase Two Data Gathering 2016-17

- In 2016-17, undertook the Ohio Gambling Survey – Round Two. 24,000+ surveys collected.
- Almost 1M adults (10.3%) at-risk; 0.9% problem gamblers. At-risk gambling doubled.
- Still less than national average of 1-2.2% PG.

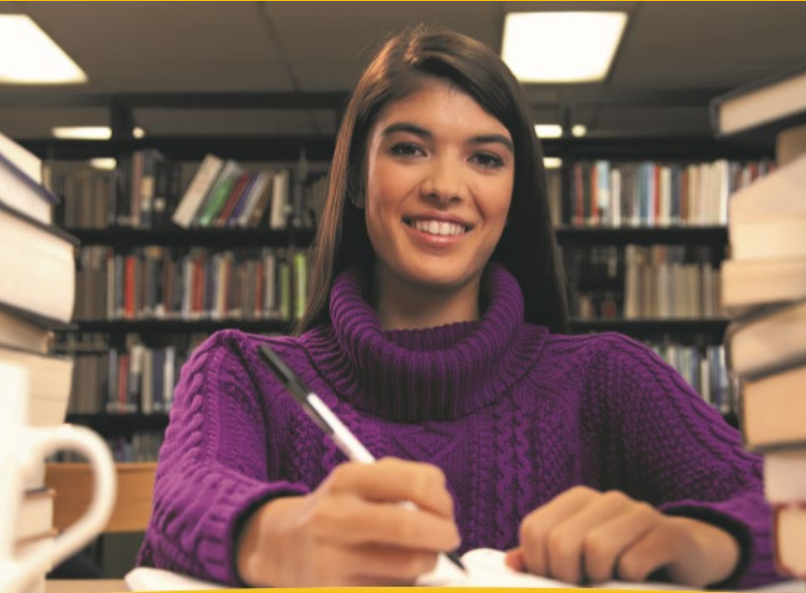

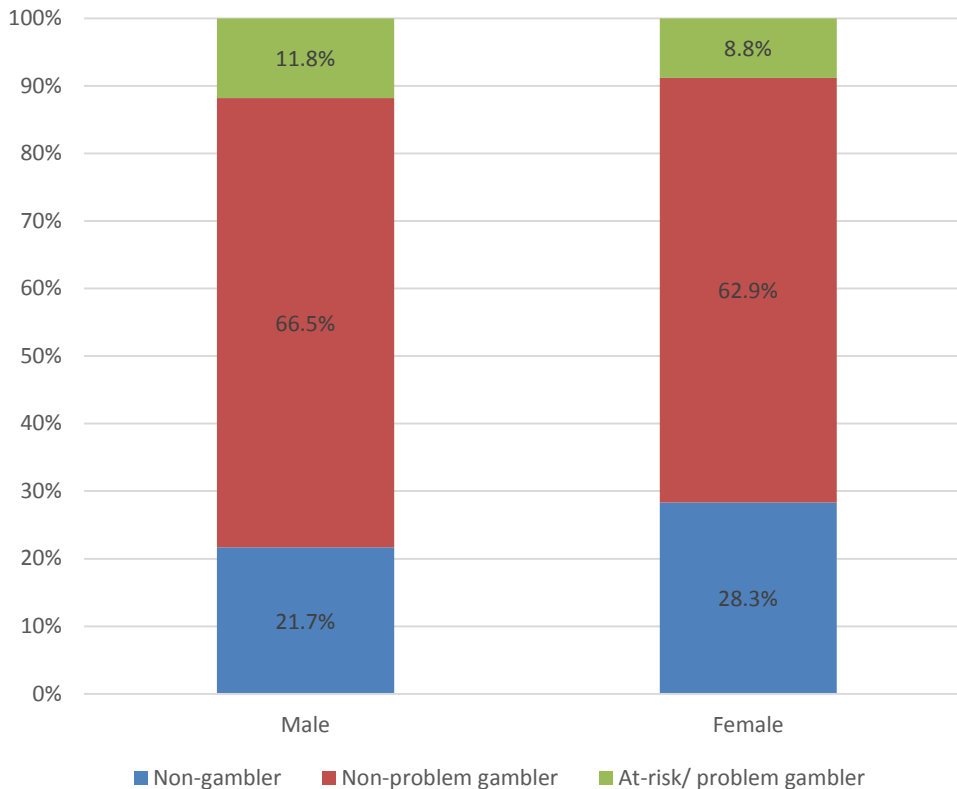

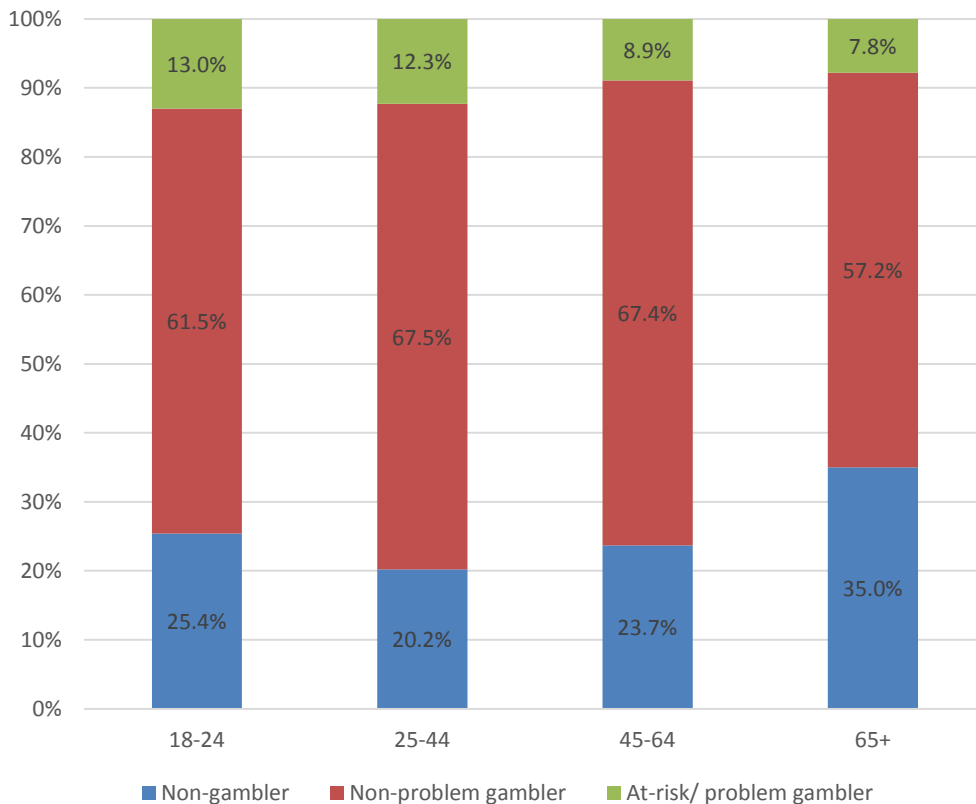
Gender and Gambling Behavior



- Of the sample, 48.4% were male, and 51.6% were female*.
- Overall, men had a higher rate of at-risk/problem gambling (11.8%) than women (8.8%).

Gambling Behavior by Age

Age and Gambling Behavior: Ohio



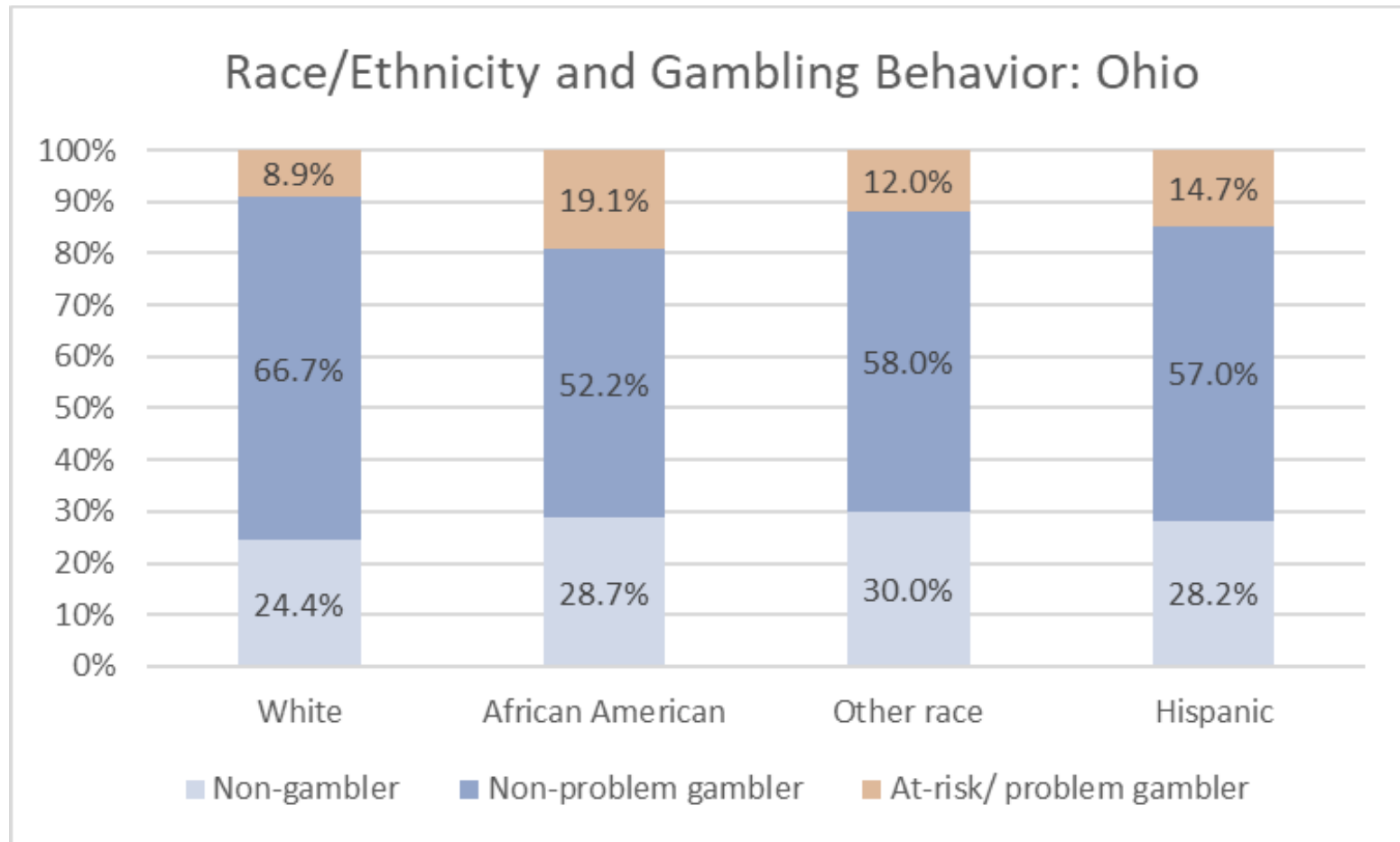
- Age groups consisted of
 - 18-24 (12.1%)
 - 25-44 (32.1%)
 - 45-64 (35.2%)
 - 65+ (20.5%)*
- Young adults (18-24) had the highest rate of at-risk/problem gambling, followed by adults 25-44.
- Older adults (65+) had the highest rate of abstaining from gambling.

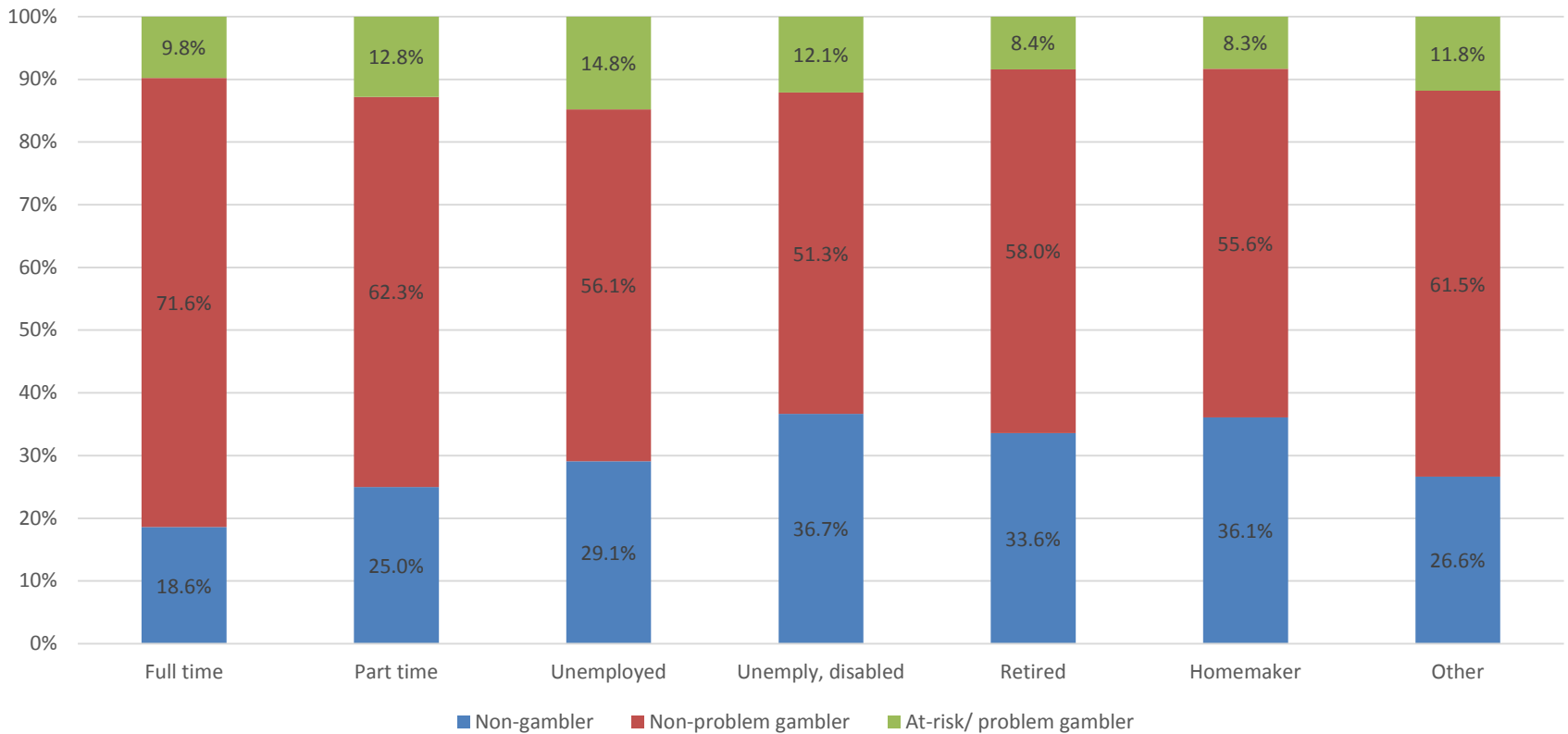
Gambling Behavior by Race & Ethnicity



- “Other race” comprised Asian, American Indian and Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, Other, and multi-race.
- African American and Hispanic ethnicity individuals had higher rates of at-risk/problem gambling than White and “Other race” individuals.

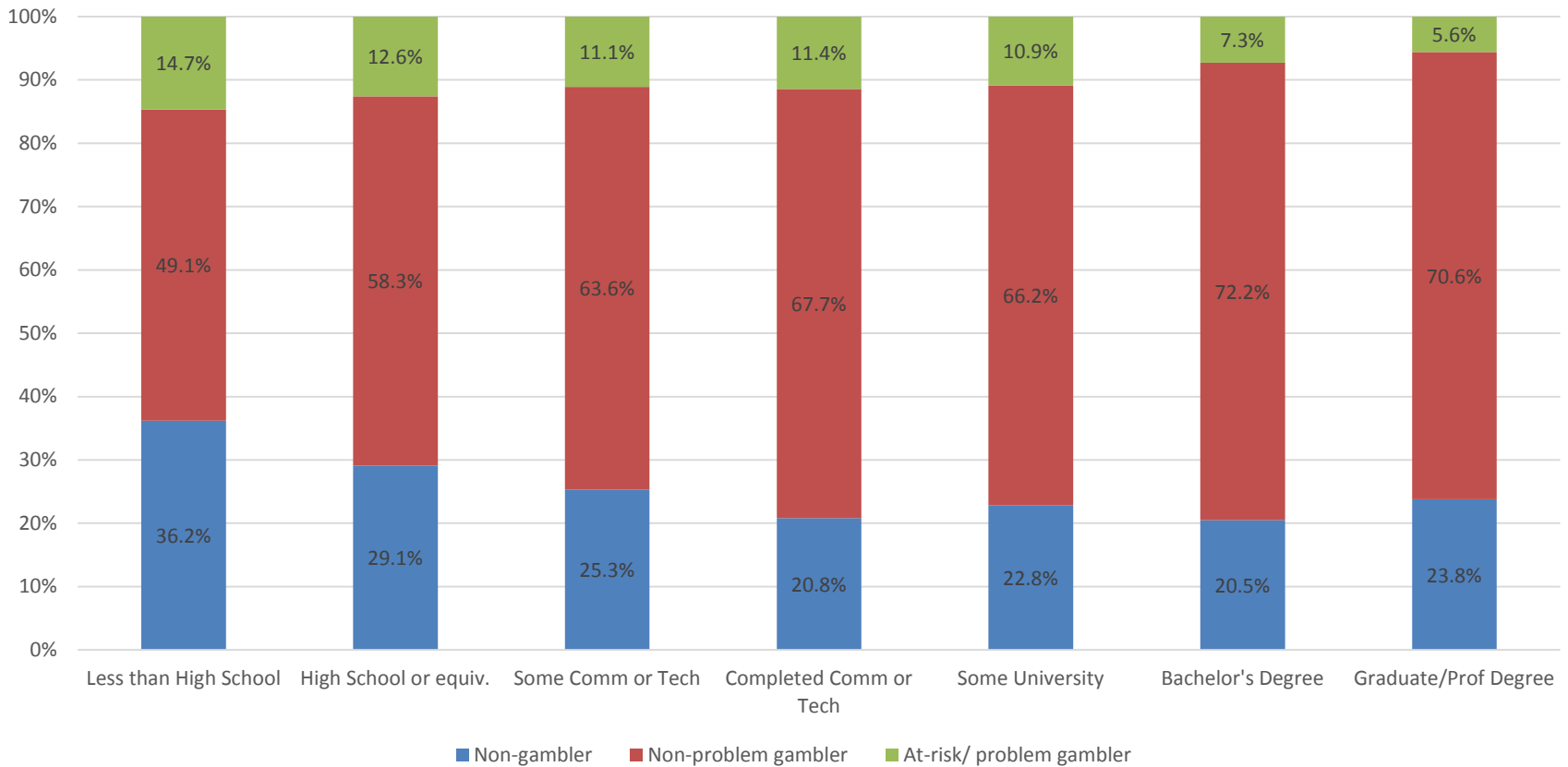

Gambling Behavior by Education Level

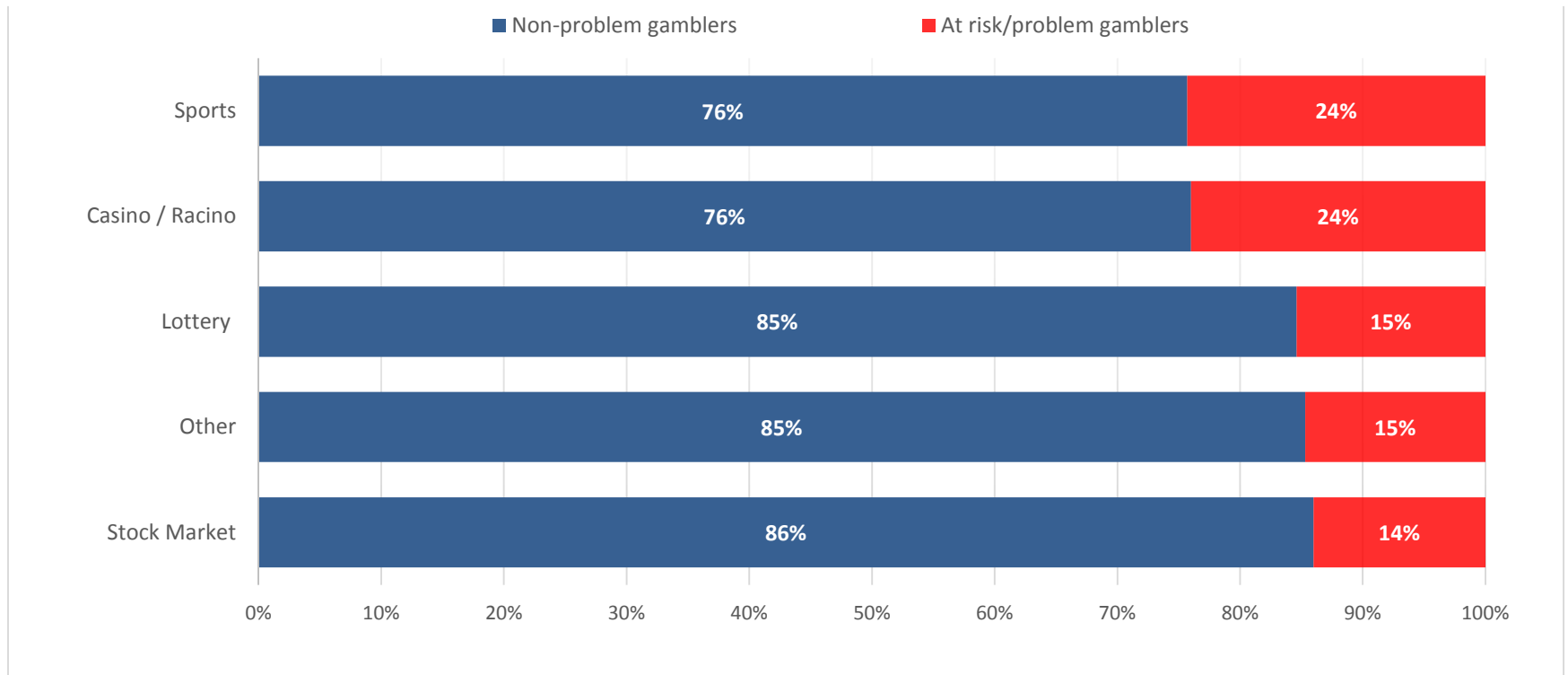

Type and Frequency of Gambling

- Participants were asked 22 questions about the specific types of gambling they might have participated in during the past 12 months.
- The types of gambling were grouped into categories:
 - Lottery gambling
 - Casino gambling
 - Sports gambling
 - Stock market gambling
 - Other gambling

Family and Individual Correlates

- Family Correlates:
 - Family history of gambling problems
 - Family history of alcohol or drug problems
- Individual Correlates:
 - Alcohol or drug problem
 - Urge to drink after painful event
 - Urge to use drugs after painful event
 - Under a doctor's care due to stress
 - Serious depression

Family History of Alcohol or Drug Problem

- At-risk/problem gamblers were the most likely group to have someone else in their family with an alcohol or drug use problem.

Under Doctor's Care Due to Stress

- At-risk/problem gamblers were the group most likely to report they were under a doctor's care due to stress.

Non-Problem Gambler	12.9%	87.1%	
At-Risk/Problem Gambler	19.8%	80.2%	

Serious Depression

- At-risk/problem gamblers were the group most likely to report being seriously depressed.

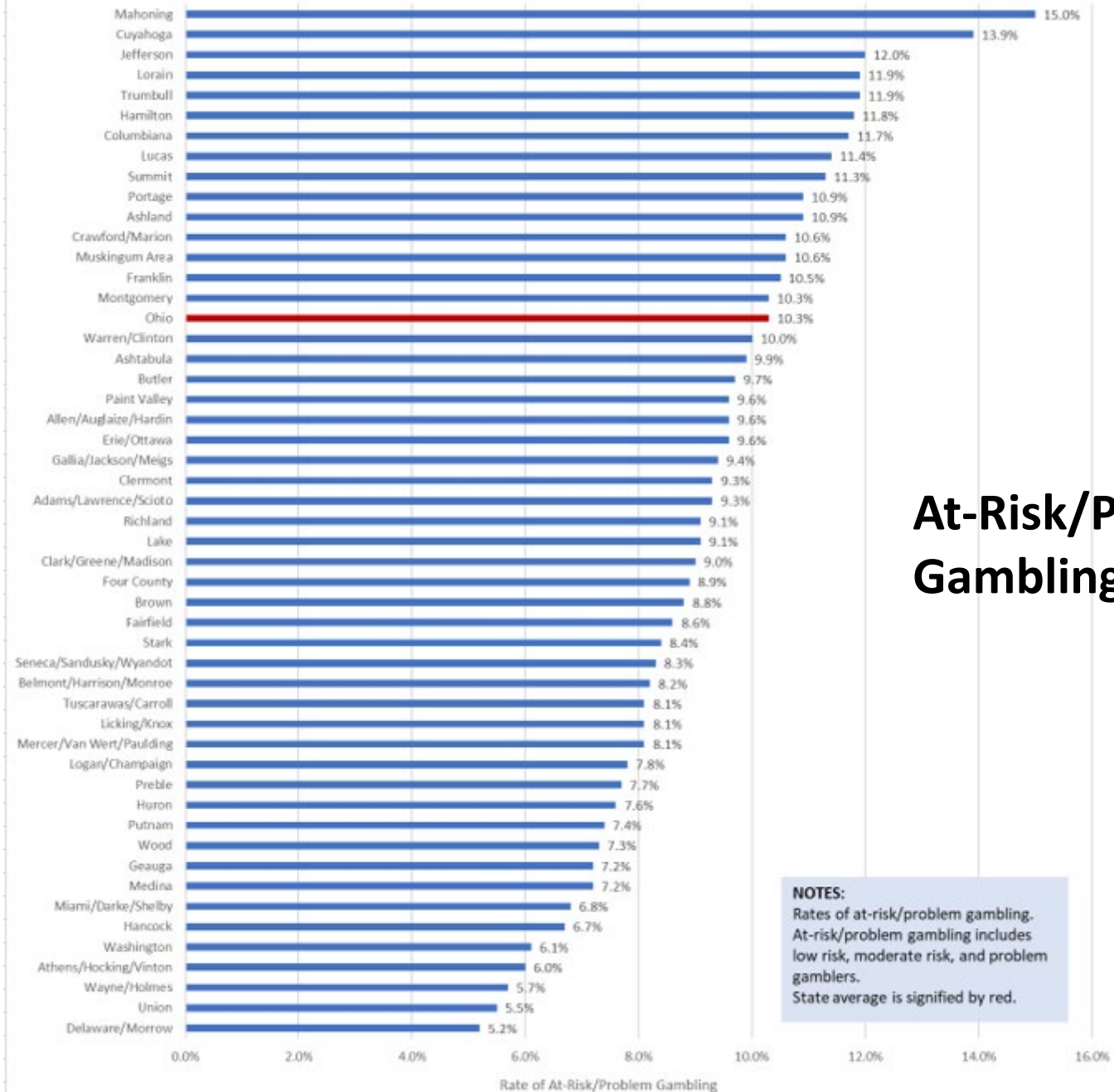

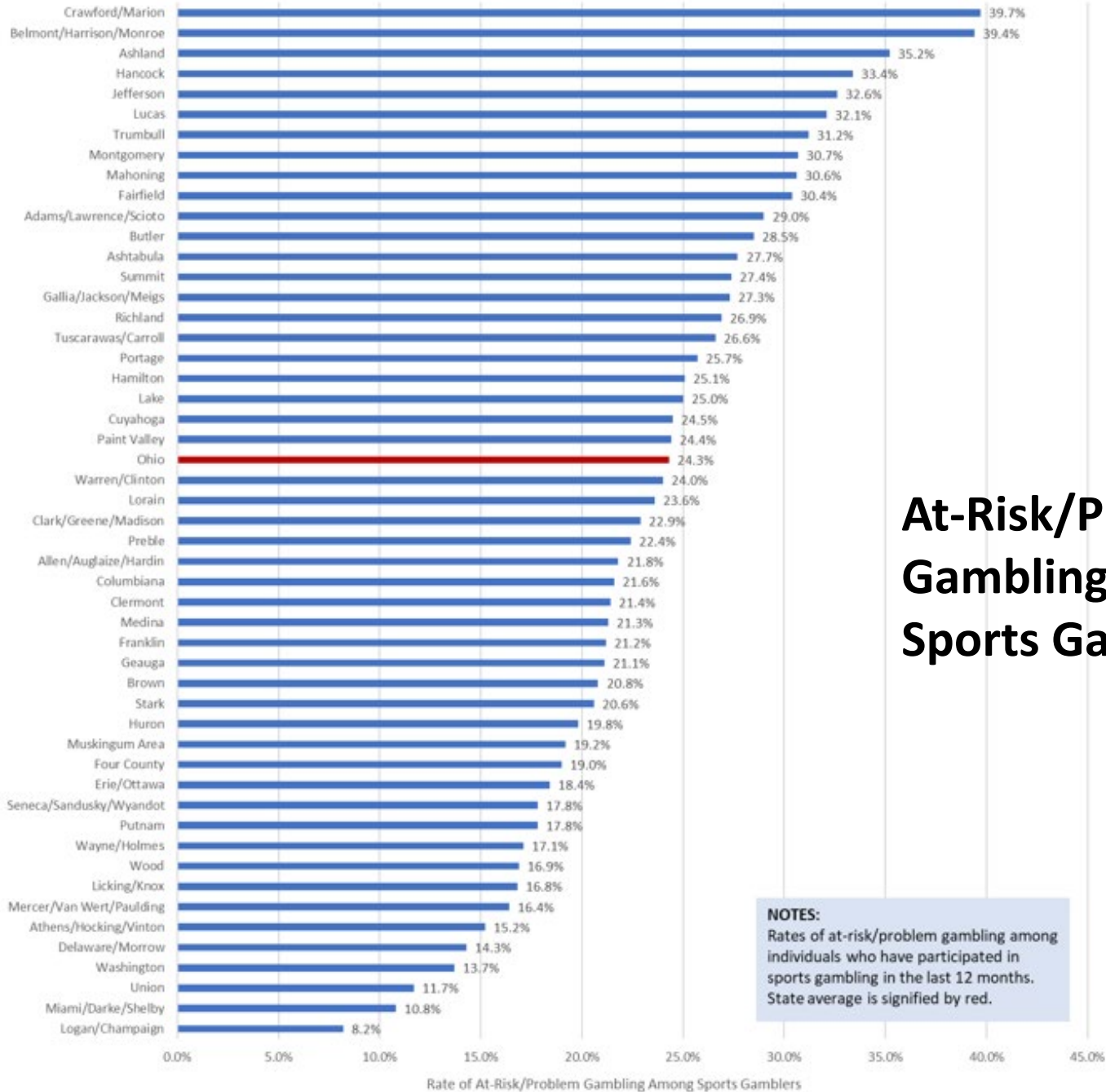
At-Risk/Problem Gambling in Ohio

 State average is signified by red.

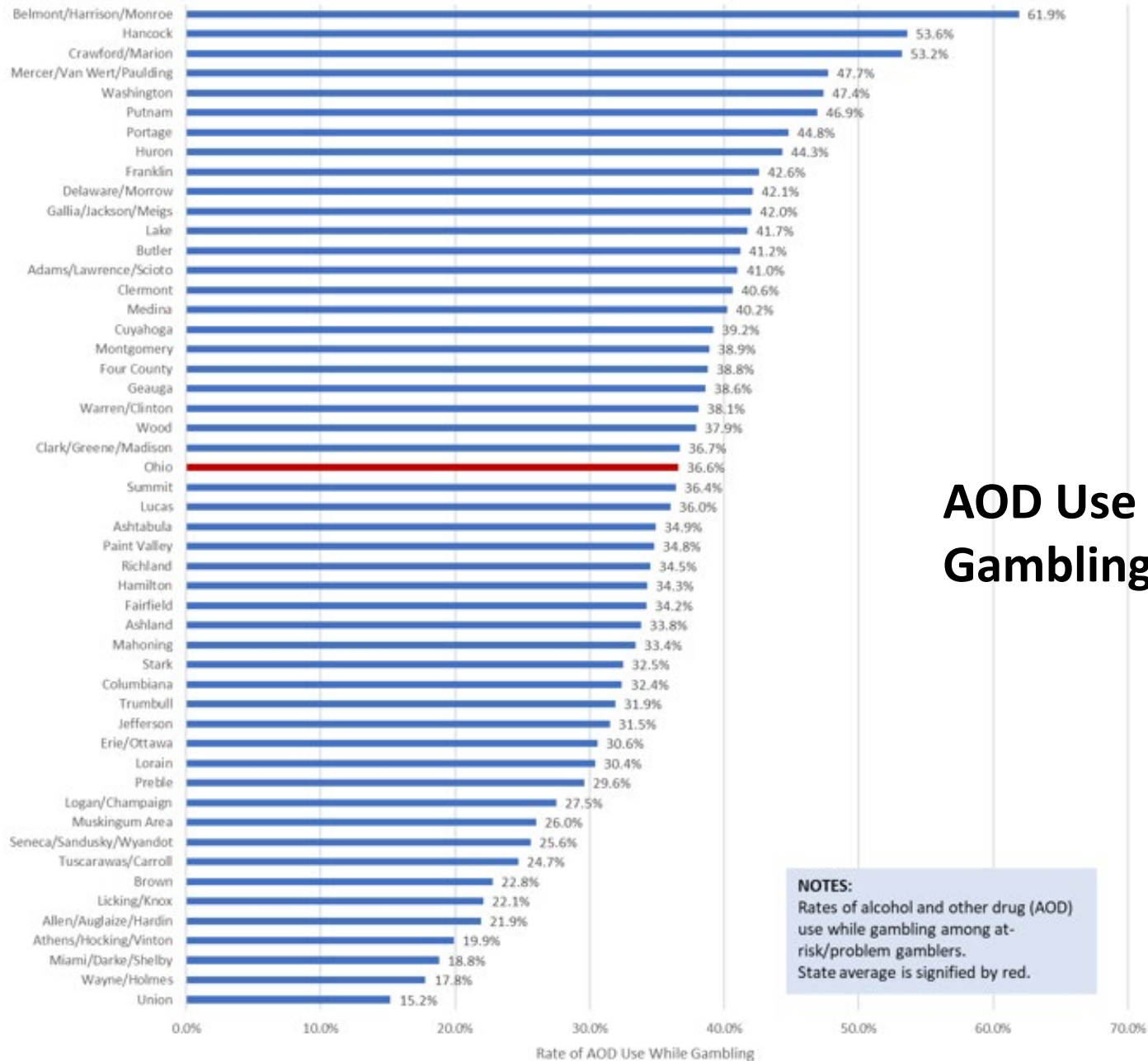
At-Risk/Problem Gambling Among Sports Gamblers

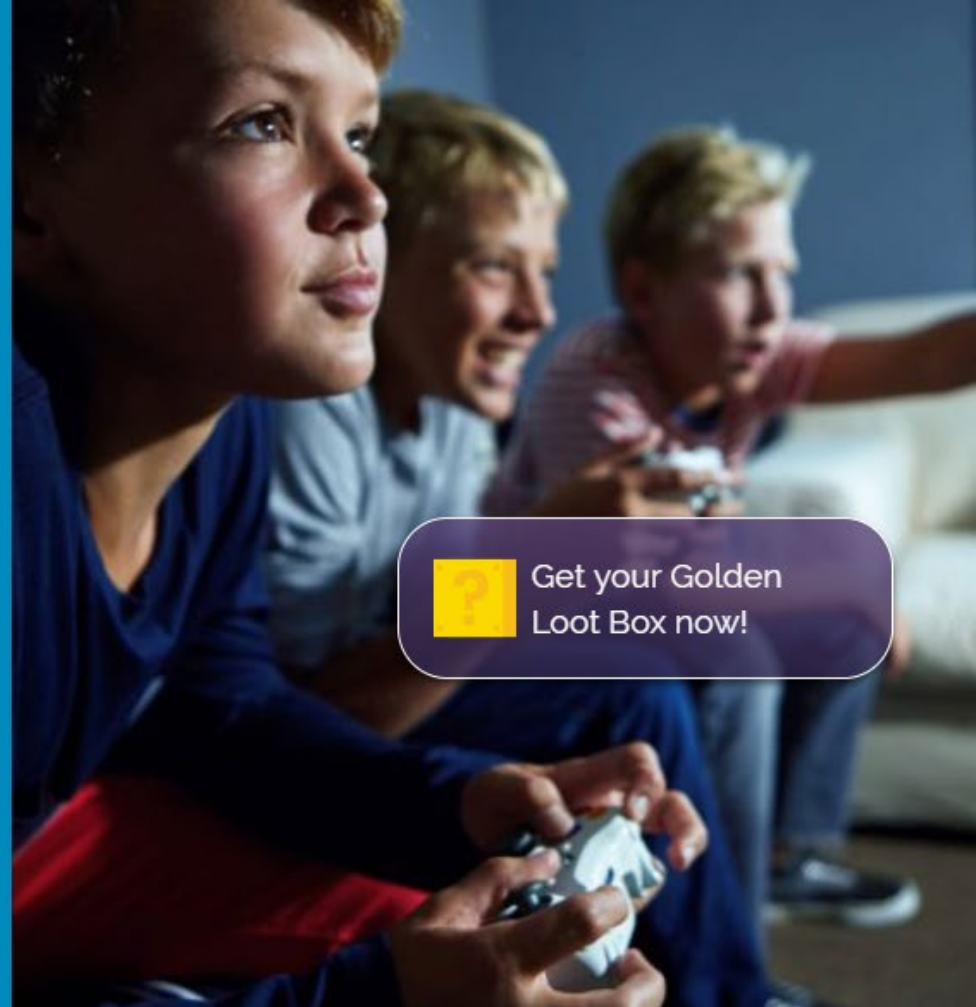
