The regular meeting of the Ohio Board of Nursing (Board) was held March 19-20, 2025, at the State Fire Marshal – Fire Training Academy, 8895 East Main Street, Reynoldsburg, Ohio 43068.

On Wednesday, March 19, 2025, at 8:32 a.m., President Erin Keels called the Board meeting to order, welcomed visitors and staff. President Keels requested that Board members introduce themselves.

# **Executive Director Report**

- Director Marlene Anielski shared that the Board staff completed and submitted the 2024 Annual Report to the Governor's office January 31, 2025.
- Board members and staff attended the Tri-Regulator Symposium March 6-7, 2025, and the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) and National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Midyear Meeting March 10-13, 2025.
- The Board will be holding a Compliance training in April with investigators and monitoring agents to include training from the Ohio Board of Pharmacy, the Ohio Attorney General, and Board education staff.
- Director Anielski concluded her report discussing Rules 2024 package 2 and 3 and the 2025 5 year rule review.

# Strategic Plan – Workflow Update

# **Operations Overview**

Director of Operations, Nick Siniff, gave an overview of the operations section at the Board along with current metrics and goals for each department within operations. The operations section of the Board consists of Customer Service, Education/Practice, Fiscal, Hearing, Information Technology (IT), Legislation, and Licensure.

#### **Customer Service**

Nick Siniff shared metrics to show the number of calls being received by the Board and how many are being taken by Board staff as opposed to the third party customer service center, as well as the total average time spent on a call. Between January and February 2025 63% of call received by Board customer service staff were grouped into the Licensure category, and Board staff are able to give the caller a one call resolution on those calls. In an effort to create consistent communication and improved collaboration between units, a customer service scripting site is being developed for customer service staff to quickly reference and give the caller a pleasant experience

#### **Education/Practice**

The Education unit regulates 202 pre-licensure programs and 64 training programs. The Education unit continues outreach through quarterly calls with program administrators and holding onboarding for new program administrators.

The Practice unit runs the Boards 6 advisory groups, responds to questions regarding application of law and rules, and update interpretive guidelines

on the Board's website. The Practice unit's goal is to disseminate and apply the most up to date regulatory information.

#### **Fiscal**

The Fiscal unit is responsible for purchasing supplies and working with the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) on building purchases. Weekly meetings with Fiscal and DAS maintenance personnel have been established to go over the work being done on the building throughout the week. Through the FY26 – FY27 budget request, 2 full-time and 4 part-time employees in year 1 along with 1 full-time and 1 part-time employee in year 2 were requested.

### Hearing

A Board Committee Hearing took place on March 4, 2025, with Member Joseph Quackenbush as presiding member along with Members Shawn Livingston and Scott Wesbecher. In 2019, hearings were split nearly evenly among internal hearing examiners and contracted external hearing examiners. Currently, there are no external hearing examiners handling hearings for the Board. Additionally, to schedule hearings in a more consistent and efficient manner, the Board has implemented multiple strategies, including a mini Kaizen event for the Hearing unit. Through the mini Kaizen event, the Board was able to create a more efficient process and have a 30% reduction in steps.

#### IT

The IT unit is currently working on the rollout of Windows 11 to all employees as Microsoft ends support for Windows 10. Also, the Program Completion Letter Portal has been fully implemented and the IT unit will continue to onboard any new programs. The IT unit is collaborating with each department at the Board to create internal SharePoint sites for each to easily collaborate and share information within the department.

#### Legislation

The Legislation unit is currently monitoring House Bill 96, HB 52, HB 12 and the effects they could have on the Board. The Legislation unit has also continued outreach presenting to nursing programs throughout Ohio. The presentation is to help students have a flawless application process and avoid any delays in the process of being licensed. The presentation has been given to 135 of 202 programs (67%) with a goal to reach 100% of program by the end of 2025.

#### Licensure

In the Licensure unit, the time to process an application has dropped from the six months it took in previous years to three business days. Due to process improvements from the Kaizen event and the introduction of MultiState licenses the Board has been able to achieve the more efficient processing of applications. Mr. Siniff highlighted the importance of automating processes, such as continuing education verification, within Licensure and how automation can support the Board's mission of safeguarding the public

#### REPORTS TO THE BOARD

# **Nurse Education Grant Program Year 1 Report**

Lisa Emrich, Program Manager, gave a report of the NEGP year 1 Grant cycle. Section 4723.063, Ohio Revised Code (ORC), authorizes the Ohio Board of Nursing (Board) to establish the Nurse Education Grant Program (NEGP) through which the Board awards funds to nurse education programs to establish partnerships with other education programs, community health agencies, and health care facilities and increase the education program's enrollment capacity. Methods of increasing enrollment capacity may include hiring faculty, accessing preceptors through clinical agency partnerships, purchasing education equipment and materials, and other actions acceptable to the Board. The NEGP is funded through the transfer of ten dollars of each nursing license renewal fee into the NEGP account through December 31, 2033. Although the Board is authorized to use up to ten percent of the funds for its costs in administering the NEGP, the Board has not charged administrative costs to this account for the last several years. During the first year of the two-year 2023-2025 NEGP grant cycle, the Board disbursed a total of \$1,183.595.60 to the eleven NEGP recipients. The disbursements for the second year of the grant cycle that began November 1, 2024 will total \$816,404.40. Below are disbursements, reported increases in student enrollment capacity and a brief summary of the recipient goal achievement during the report period.

# 2024 NCLEX Report

Lisa Emrich reviewed the 2024 NCLEX Report of pre-license nursing education programs with Full, Provisional, or Continued Conditional approval. NCLEX national and state data are provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing. Rule 4723-5-23, Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), specifies that each program's NCLEX pass rate is determined by factoring the percentage of a program's first-time test candidates who attempted the NCLEX exam within six

months of completing the nursing education program. Rule 4723-5-23, OAC, also establishes 95% of the national average of first-time test candidates as the benchmark pass rate for Ohio.

# Mercy College of Ohio, Baccalaureate Nursing Program
