

## Appendix 2: Progress Toward SHIP Indicators: State and Target Populations

The SHIP identified 37 measurable objectives to track over time to assess Ohio’s progress on improving health and well-being. The SHIP targets were set by the SHA Steering Committee in 2017. Priority populations are groups of Ohioans with outcomes that were at least 10% worse at baseline than outcomes for Ohio overall.

Following the convention from the last SHA, the status is indicated by reviewing baseline data, the most recently available data, and the 2022 target. Indicators receive a checkmark if there has been at least a 10% change in the desired direction between the baseline year and the most recent year, while indicators for which there has been a change away from the desired direction by 10% or more of the baseline value are considered to be “still working”. Priorities for which there was not 10% or more of the baseline value in either direction are noted as having “little or no change.” In addition, if a target has been met or exceeded the target set for 2022, this is noted with a “gold ribbon”.

Severe maternal morbidity (SMM) is an aggregate metric that is comprised of 20 outcome indicators during delivery hospitalizations that result in significant short- or long-term consequences to a woman’s health. Ohio has joined the national Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health (AIM) to promote best practices and reduce our statewide SMM rate.

Studies have shown that SMM is not fully preventable and can vary by indicator. Nonetheless, hospitals are collaborating and sharing best practices to limit variation and reliably improve the quality-of-care women receive in hopes of mitigating the maternal risks posed when SMM is encountered. We are still witness to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the lasting negative impact upon Ohio’s SMM rate. While not an indicator in the SMM metric at this time, we do know that those with COVID-19 at delivery are at an increased risk for SMM.
