Project Overview

A. Project Description

The State intends to select an Architect/Engineering (A/E) team to provide design and construction administration services for a Fire System & Electrical Upgrade Project at the Toledo Correctional Institution (TOCI). TOCI is in Toledo, Ohio, and houses approximately 900 incarcerated persons. The facility is approximately 24 years old.

The project is primarily intended to replace all fire system devices, cards, modules & equipment, fire dampers & motors, in all building on site, replace exhaust fans and louvers for fire system, update lighting controls, upgrade electrical panel and transformer in Master Control, assessment of generator and transfer switches at TOCI. The approximate number of fire system devices on site is 2,320. The approximate number of fire dampers and motors on site is 120. The total number of exhaust fans and louvers is 26.

The development of the POR will include a comprehensive survey/field investigation of the existing site and surrounding areas to evaluate the condition in relation to the project scope described above, and in relation to the project budget. Develop a phasing plan to keep the fire system, lighting and electricity functional throughout construction. Work will include demolition, masonry, metals, carpentry, security and electrical as a minimum scope.

Also included will be necessary ancillary work which may be uncovered/discovered during investigation of the site. This work may include all general construction items and scopes, including but not limited to painting, finishes, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing work that may be integral to the security aspects of the fire system & electrical upgrade project. The project scope will then be evaluated, prioritized, and defined/redefined to align with available project funds. All aspects of the project must comply with Department of Rehabilitation and Correction policies and procedures.

B. Scope of Services

The selected firm will develop a program of requirements, an estimate of probable cost of construction, and scheduling information to a basic schematic level, moving into design development, construction documents, bidding, and construction stages immediately thereafter.

The selected A/E, as a portion of its required Scope of Services and prior to submitting its proposals, will discuss and clarify with the Owner and/or the Contracting Authority, the cost breakdown of the Architect/Engineer Agreement detailed cost components to address the Owner's project requirements. Participate in the Encouraging Diversity, Growth & Equity (EDGE) Program as required by statute and the Agreement.

As required by the Agreement, and as properly authorized, provide the following categories of services: Program Verification, Schematic Design, Design Development, Construction Document Preparation, Bid and Award Support,

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Conformed Documents, Construction Administration, Post-Construction, and Additional Services of all types including testing and special inspections.

Refer to the *Ohio Facilities Construction Manual* for additional information about the type and extent of services required for each. A copy of the standard Agreement can be obtained at the OFCC website at <https://ofcc.ohio.gov>.

During the construction period, provide not less than four (4) hours (excluding travel time) on-site construction administration services each week, including (1) attendance at progress meetings, (2) a written field report of each site visit, (3) on-site representation comprised of the A/E and its consultant staff involved in the primary design of the project, all having relevant and appropriate types of construction administration experience.

Please list all major scope services needed to complete the selection process for successful project delivery. The specific scope of services must state building types, functional design or specialized professional services required to evaluate the level of experience of each applicant firm (e.g. fire protection design, correctional facility experience, occupied construction experience, construction cost estimating work inside a secure facility, and electrical design). 8. Experience with construction cost estimating inside a secure facility.
9. Experience with construction administration for corrections projects.

I. Evaluation Criteria for Selection

- Demonstrate the ability to meet Owner’s programmed project vision, scope, budget, and schedule on previous projects.
- Previous experience compatible with the proposed project (e.g., type, size).
- Relevant past work of prospective firm’s proposed consultants.
- Past performance of prospective firm and its proposed consultants.
- Qualifications and experience of individuals directly involved with the project.
- Proposer’s previous experience (numbers of projects, sizes of projects) when working with its proposed consultants.
- Specification writing credentials and experience.
- Experience and capabilities of creating or using Critical Path Method (CPM) schedules and of using CPM schedules as a project management resource.
- Approach to and success of using partnering and Alternative Dispute Resolution.
- Proximity of prospective firms to the project site.
- Proposer’s apparent resources and capacity to meet the needs of this project.

Interested A/E firms are required to submit the *Commitment to Participate in the EDGE Business Assistance Program* form in its Statement of Qualifications (Form F110-330) submitted in response to the RFQ, to indicate its intent to contract with and use EDGE-certified Business Enterprise(s), as a part of the A/E’s team. The *Intent to Contract and to Perform* and / or waiver request letter and *Demonstration of Good Faith Effort* form(s) with complete documentation must be attached to the A/E’s Technical Proposal. Both forms can be accessed via the OFCC website at <https://ofcc.ohio.gov>. The *Intent to Contract and to Perform* form is again required at the Fee Proposal stage.

If the A/E firm intends to receive points for exceeding the EDGE Participation Goal, it must provide BOTH a completed *Commitment to Participate* form AND a completed *Statement of Intent to Contract and to Perform* forms signed by both parties with its *Statement of Qualifications*.

For all *Statements of Qualifications*, please identify the EDGE-certified Business Enterprises, by name, which will participate in the delivery of the proposed professional services solicited in the RFQ.

Interested A/E firms must indicate on their *Statement of Qualifications*, the locations where their services will be performed in the spaces provided or by attachment in accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 2019-12D related to providing services only within the United States and the requirements of Executive Order 2022-02D prohibiting purchases from or investment in any Russian institution or company. Failure to do so may cause their *Statement of Qualifications* to be rejected.

Electronic submittals should be combined into one PDF file named with the project number listed on the RFQ and your firm’s name. Use the “print” feature of Adobe Acrobat or similar software for creating a PDF rather than using a scanner. If possible, please reduce the file size of the PDF. In Acrobat, go to Advanced, then PDF Optimizer.

Paper copies of the *Statement of Qualifications*, if requested, should be stapled only. Do not use special bindings or coverings of any type. Cover letters and transmittals are not necessary.

Facsimile copies of the *Statement of Qualifications* will not be accepted.

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Firms are requested to identify professional registrations, memberships and credentials including LEED GA, LEED AP, LEED AP+, CCCA, CCM, CCS, CDT, CPE, DBIA, and any other appropriate design and construction industry credentials. Identify that information on the resume page for individuals in Block 22, Section E of the F110-330 form.
