Project Overview

A. Project Description

Repaving all three parking lots for the ranges located at Camp Perry.

The Adjutant General's Department intends to select an Architect/Engineering (A/E) team to provide design and construction administration services for a repaving project at the Camp Perry Joint Training Center (CPJTC). CPJTC is near Port Clinton, Ohio, and is the second largest outdoor firing range in the world. The facility is approximately 120 years old. This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) is being issued to obtain Professional Architectural/Engineering (A/E) services for the design of asphalt replacement and site drainage improvements. The asphalt work will mostly consist of full depth replacement. There will be some milling the existing asphalt and installing a 2" topcoat. This project will also include some site drainage to ensure the longevity of the asphalt. The final deliverable will be stripping the parking lots and roadways. The selected A&E will complete a comprehensive survey/field investigation of the existing paving and drainage. The project scope will then be evaluated, prioritized, and defined/redefined to align with available project funds. Evaluation of the project schedule will also be a part of each design stage. All aspects of the project must comply with the Ohio Adjutant General's Department and OFCC policies and procedures.

B. Scope of Services

Repaving all three parking lots for the ranges located at Camp Perry.

A&E Services:

- Core sampling for all three parking lots to determine base layers, binder layers, surface layers composition.
- Provide recommendations on replacement for MPMG and MRFR Range lots and recommendations for repair or replacement of the Covered Rang Lot.
- Provide design and criteria for all Range lots that complies with all UFC standards for bituminous paving projects.
- Provide recommendations for catch basin repairs and replacements for all catch basins in all three parking lots.
- Investigate existing underground stormwater lines by means of scoping lines to determine current condition and functionality, provide recommendations and design to properly and adequately manager stormwater without redirecting stormwater towards other facilities or structures.
- Provide recommendations and design for Stormwater Control Measures (SCM).
 - Including but not limited to replacing existing underground stormwater lines, creating new ditches or detention basins areas for stormwater, parking lot sloping / drainage.

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For projects advertised with an appropriately developed Program of Requirements (“POR”), upon award of the Agreement, commence with Design. For projects without such a POR, upon award of the Agreement, commence by developing the Program of Requirements.

The selected A/E, as a portion of its required Scope of Services and prior to submitting its proposals, will discuss and clarify with the Owner and/or the Contracting Authority, the cost breakdown of the A/E Agreement detailed cost components to address the Owner’s project requirements. Participate in the Encouraging Diversity, Growth & Equity (EDGE) Program as required by statute and the Agreement.

As required by the Agreement, and as properly authorized, provide the following categories of services: Program Verification, Schematic Design, Design Development, Construction Document Preparation, Bid and Award Support, Conformed Documents, Construction Administration, Post-Construction, and Additional Services of all types.

Refer to the *Ohio Facilities Construction Manual* for additional information about the type and extent of services required for each. A copy of the standard Agreement can be obtained at the OFCC website at <https://ofcc.ohio.gov>.

During the construction period, provide not less than **4 hours (excluding travel time)** on-site construction administration services each week, including (1) attendance at progress meetings, (2) a written field report of each site visit, (3) on-site representation comprised of the A/E and its consultant staff involved in the primary design of the project, all having relevant and appropriate types of construction administration experience.

For purposes of completing the Relevant Project Experience Matrix in Section F of the *Statement of Qualifications* (Form F110-330), below is a list of relevant scope of work requirements for this RFQ:

I. Evaluation Criteria for Selection

- Demonstrated ability to meet Owner's programmed project vision, scope, budget, and schedule on previous projects.
- Previous experience compatible with the proposed project (e.g., type, size).
- Relevant past work of prospective firm's proposed consultants.
- Past performance of prospective firm and its proposed consultants.
- Qualifications and experience of individuals directly involved with the project.
- Proposer's previous experience (numbers of projects, sizes of projects) when working with its proposed consultants.
- Specification writing credentials and experience.
- Experience and capabilities of creating or using Critical Path Method (CPM) schedules and of using CPM schedules as a project management resource.
- Approach to and success of using partnering and Alternative Dispute Resolution.
- Proximity of prospective firms to the project site.
- Proposer's apparent resources and capacity to meet the needs of this project.
- The selected A/E and all its consultants must have the capability to use the Internet within their normal business location(s) during normal business hours.

Interested A/E firms must indicate on their *Statement of Qualifications*, the locations where their services will be performed in the spaces provided or by attachment in accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 2019-12D related to providing services only within the United States and the requirements of Executive Order 2022-02D prohibiting purchases from or investment in any Russian institution or company. Failure to do so may cause their *Statement of Qualifications* to be rejected.
