Ohio's 312-mile Lake Erie shore is an important recreational resource for all Ohioans and tourists. Recreational tourism is a vital economic industry in the Lake Erie region. According to the Great Lakes Commission (2014), visitors to Ohio's Lake Erie region spend more than \$10.7 billion annually, which is nearly 30 percent of the state's total tourism dollars. Lake Erie tourism also supports more than 100,000 jobs in northern Ohio and generates \$750 million in state and local taxes.

Natural resource-based and outdoor recreation opportunities on Lake Erie (and within the watershed) range from passive (low-impact) activities, such as hiking, biking, geocaching, wildlife viewing, sightseeing, fishing and paddling, to active (high-impact) activities, like boating, waterskiing, jet skiing, windsurfing, swimming, disc golfing and participating in field/court sports. Passive-use recreational areas emphasize open green spaces and natural aspects of parks and preserves. These areas require minimal levels of infrastructure development and include restorative and tranquil amenities that have minimal impacts on the surrounding lands and ecosystem. Amenities may include picnic areas, benches, trails, paddling accesses and ornamental gardens. Naturebased parks and preserves can be environmentally important or sensitive spaces where plants and wildlife can establish a foothold. Parks that are mostly intended for passive recreation typically do not afford facilities or equipment for exercise, sports or play. Conversely, active recreation involves high-impact and physically-challenging recreational activities and requires intensive amenity development and upkeep. Such recreational areas often include facilities intended for organized team activities (e.g. baseball, softball, basketball, soccer, volleyball and other field/court sports). Activeuse amenities may also include swimming pools, splash pads, boat ramps, marinas, golf courses and equipment for exercise or play. Parks with active-use amenities may also offer passive-use amenities.

RECREATIONAL LANDSCAPE

Ohio's coastal counties offer a diverse variety of outdoor recreational opportunities and spaces. There are 188 public access sites adjacent to Lake Erie, which comprise approximately 60.5 miles of shore (about 19 percent of Ohio's entire Lake Erie coast) and account for nearly 22,270 acres of protected land (see the Protected Lands map on page 144). Many additional publicly accessible locations are located on the major tributaries that flow into the lake and within the Lake Erie Watershed. Lake Erie-adjacent access sites and other recreational areas include state parks, county metropolitan parks (metroparks), municipal parks, nature preserves, wildlife areas, boating facilities, fishing accesses and scenic overlooks.

The Lake Erie shore and surrounding landscape varies greatly from west to east. The glacially-influenced landscape of the Lake Erie Watershed ranges from the low, flat topography of the lake plains, prevalent in northwest Ohio and along the edge of the shore, to rolling hills and elevated highlands in north-central and northeast Ohio (see the Topography and Landforms map on page 208). Much of northwest Ohio's low-lying landscape was once covered by the Great Black Swamp. Many nature preserves, wildlife areas and other protected lands in Lucas, Ottawa and Sandusky counties preserve remnant portions of historic coastal marshland and are accessible for wildlife viewing, bird watching, fishing, hunting and nature hiking.

Ohio has over a dozen natural islands in Lake Erie's Western Basin. South Bass, Middle Bass and Kelleys islands are popular getaway destinations and are renowned for their natural resources, cultural attractions and recreational opportunities. State parks on these three islands offer camping, hiking, wildlife viewing and boating facilities. South Bass Island and Kelleys Island state parks feature swimming beaches, while Middle Bass Island State Park provides seasonal dockage for island residents and transient dockage for visitors at its 190-slip marina. Approximately 87 percent of North Bass Island is state-owned and managed. The 451-acre North Bass Island State Park is accessible for bicycling, hiking, primitive camping (special permit required) and other low-impact activities.

Tributaries in northeast Ohio, such as the Cuyahoga, Chagrin and Grand rivers, originate in higher-relief upland areas. Many county metropark reservations and other recreational lands along these rivers, including Cuyahoga Valley National Park, feature remarkable geologic formations such as waterfalls and ledges, protect forest and swampland, and preserve historic canal lands. Downriver sections of the Vermilion, Black, Rocky, Cuyahoga, Chagrin and Grand rivers feature recreation-filled valleys that are best characterized by lush forests and impressively high, steep shale cliffs. Recreational opportunities include picnicking, hiking, biking, fishing, wildlife viewing, bird watching and paddling, among many other activities.

Bluffs along the lakeshore, particularly in Erie (east of Huron), Lorain, Cuyahoga, Lake and Ashtabula counties, generally increase in elevation west to east and can reach heights of 60 feet (see Bluff Classification maps on pages 180-183). Many lakefront parks provide beach, fishing and paddling access by way of a bluff-traversing staircase and/or walking path. Most sites afford scenic lake access and several land-based amenities and activities.



OUTDOOR RECREATION ACTIVITIES

Many recreational areas along the Lake Erie shore offer active and passive beach-related activities. Beaches provide easy water access for swimming, wading, fishing and paddling. Nearly 80 of Lake Erie's publicly-accessible sites include a beach (or multiple beach areas) for recreational and/or passive activities. Swimming is permitted at 37 sites (see the Public Access maps and amenity charts on pages 106 through 113). Recreational beaches may also include seasonal volleyball courts, beach-level boardwalks, playground equipment and designated areas for dogs.

While Ohio's Lake Erie shore features several recreational swimming beaches, many other beaches are managed to preserve the natural characteristics of the lakeshore, promote habitat conservation and support low-impact activities, such as nature-walking and wildlife viewing. A few beaches feature dunes and dune communities. Dunes form as the result of accumulated, wind-blown sand. A dune community is a unique habitat type that can support highly specialized plant and animal species. Headlands Dunes State Nature Preserve in Lake County is one of the last remaining and finest Lake Erie dune communities in Ohio. Smaller dune formations are located at Walnut Beach and Conneaut Township parks in Ashtabula County. The Lake Erie shore



also features the 7,300-foot barrier beach at Sheldon Marsh State Nature Preserve in Erie County. A **barrier beach** is a narrow strip of beach separated from the mainland by a marsh, bay or tributary. The barrier beach at Sheldon Marsh separates the waters of Lake Erie from the wetland areas of East Sandusky Bay. Smaller barrier beaches are also present at North Pond State Nature Preserve on Kelleys Island, Old Woman Creek State Nature Preserve in Erie County and Arcola Creek Park in Lake County.

Most recreational areas feature hiking, biking, walking and/or fitness trails. Trails range from dirt-surfaced or grass-mowed nature trails through woods, wetland areas and meadows, to paved multi-purpose trails and lakefront boardwalks. There are also many statewide, regional and local trails and bikeways that link communities and recreational areas. For an overview of the trails in the Lake Erie Watershed, see the Major Trail Networks map on page 114.

Lake Erie offers countless world-class fishing opportunities. Anglers can cast a line from one of many publicly-accessible piers and structures, enjoy a favorite fishing spot at a park, or launch a boat and navigate to an open water destination. Lake Erie yields a mix of fish species, including walleye, yellow perch, smallmouth bass, rainbow (steelhead) trout and white bass, among many others. According to Ohio Sea Grant, Lake Erie produces approximately 50 percent of all fish caught in the Great Lakes—more than lakes Superior, Michigan, Huron and Ontario combined. Walleye and yellow perch are Lake Erie's most popular fish, with 49 percent and 31 percent, respectively, of Ohio anglers targeting those species (see maps on pages 160 and 162).

Sport fishing in Ohio is a \$2.9 billion industry, with anglers spending around \$2 billion annually in the Lake Erie region. It is important to local, state and national economies. Coastal communities actively market available fishing resources and profit from angler visits. Local businesses, hotels, campgrounds, marinas, restaurants, bait and tackle stores, the charter boat industry and other businesses greatly benefit from the fishing opportunities Lake Erie provides. The lake's charter boat industry is the largest in North America and accounts for 40 percent of all Great Lakes charter boats.

A range of habitat types contribute to the abundance and diversity of Lake Erie's sport fishery. The lake is nationally-renowned for its walleye fishing and fittingly known as the "Walleye Capital of the World." Each spring, thousands of walleye run up the Maumee and Sandusky rivers to spawn, which attracts anglers nationwide. The Western Basin is one of the most productive natural spawning and nursery areas on the Great Lakes. Walleye may spawn over reefs, shoals of gravel, bedrock and other firm bottoms in the Western Basin. During the rest of the year, walleye are common throughout the Central Basin as well (see map on page 156).

Yellow perch are often found in Ohio's slow-moving tributaries, lakes and reservoirs but are particularly common in Lake Erie. Like walleye, yellow perch are abundant in the Western and Central basins. From fall through spring, steelhead trout fishing is common in the Central Basin, especially within the gravel/cobble-bottomed (when free of ice) Vermilion, Rocky, Cuyahoga, Chagrin, Grand and Ashtabula rivers (and Conneaut Creek). Lake Erie's bays, harbors and areas along the shore offer excellent bluegill, crappie and largemouth bass fishing. Anglers may also catch the occasional northern pike or muskellunge in vegetated areas.

In winter, many anglers enjoy ice fishing on Lake Erie. Ice fishing requires traversing the frozen lake to a desired "open water" location and casting a line into a drilled hole. Portable shelters, called ice shanties, are placed over the fishing hole for warmth and protection. Licensed ice fishing guides often assist anglers on Lake Erie. Guides help navigate to safe ice, set up ice shanties and locate fish. The area between Green and Rattlesnake islands, just west of South Bass Island, typically offers some of the safest ice on the lake. Walleye, white perch and yellow perch are common Lake Erie ice fishing catches.


Boating offers a variety of recreational opportunities on Lake Erie, including fishing, swimming, water-skiing, entertaining and relaxation. Many boating facilities are located directly on Lake Erie, while many others are located within harbors or along rivers. Boating access sites include public facilities (managed and maintained by a variety of governmental agencies), commercial facilities and private facilities (such as yacht clubs). These facilities provide various amenities, such as ramps, transient dockage, fuel, electric hook-up, water hook-up and/or waste pump-outs. Of the 207 publicly-accessible boating access sites on Lake Erie—including sites that provide access to Lake Erie via connecting waterway—105 have a boat ramp, 177 have docking facilities and 74 have both (ramp and docks). These include 137 commercial facilities, 60 public facilities and five private sites. For maps and more information about Lake Erie public access and boating access, see pages 106-113 and 116-125.

Registrations are required for every recreational boat in Ohio, excluding paddle boards, sail boards, kite boards and belly boats. In 2016, more than 505,000 registrations were issued in Ohio, a 6.5 percent increase from the previous year. Nearly 89,000 registrations, or 18 percent, were issued in one of the eight coastal counties, a five percent increase from 2015. Cuyahoga County accounted for 30 percent of all coastal county registrations. Approximately one-third of all recreational boating activity in Ohio occurs on Lake Erie (ODNR Division of Watercraft, 2012). According to the National Marine Manufacturers Association, recreational boating in Ohio accounts for approximately 19,500 jobs and supports nearly 800 local businesses. Ohio boaters spend approximately \$3.6 billion annually (includes direct, indirect and induced spending).

Paddling is an increasingly popular activity in Ohio. In 2016, over 161,500 canoes and kayaks were registered in the state (15 percent increase from the previous year).



There are four designated water trails totaling nearly 190 miles in the Lake Erie Watershed, including the East Sandusky Bay Water Trail, the Lake Erie Islands Water Trail, the Maumee River Water Trail and the Vermilion-Lorain Water Trail. The East Sandusky Bay Water Trail is a circular route with five access points on the East Sandusky Bay and Pipe Creek. The Lake Erie Islands Water Trail is comprised of five individual paddling routes. These include separate trails encircling each of Ohio's four largest islands—Kelleys, South Bass, Middle Bass and North Bass—and one trail following the Catawba Island/Marblehead Peninsula mainland shore. The 107-mile Maumee River Water Trail was dedicated in 2018 and includes 39 access locations between Maumee Bay and the Indiana state line. The Vermilion-Lorain Water Trail connects nine access points along the Vermilion and Black rivers and Lake Erie. For more information about paddling access and water trails, see pages 128 and 129.



OHIO CLEAN MARINAS AND CLEAN BOATER PROGRAMS

The Ohio Clean Marinas Program is a proactive partnership between Ohio Sea Grant, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and marine trades associations. It is designed to encourage marina operators and boaters to use simple, innovative solutions to keep Ohio's coastal and inland waterway resources clean. Goals include responsible use and protection of the natural environment through education, awareness and applying best management practices. The program helps inform marina operators and boaters about environmental laws, rules and jurisdictions. Committed implementation of various conservation measures that improve environmental and economic aspects of operation may qualify a marina to become a certified "Clean Marina." The Clean Marinas Program is a voluntary program. Benefits include improved water quality and wildlife habitat; public recognition and enhanced image; attracting conscientious boaters; financial incentives, and; compliance assistance. Marinas that support the recreational boating industry contribute significantly to Lake Erie's coastal economy.

The Ohio Clean Marinas Program started in 2004. At the time, it was only available to marinas on Lake Erie. In 2015, the program was expanded statewide. Between 2005 and June 1, 2018, 78 marinas were certified as Ohio Clean Marinas, including 58 in the Lake Erie Watershed. Approximately 74 percent of all Clean Marinas are on Lake Erie (as of June 1, 2018). Erie and Ottawa counties have the most Clean Marinas, with 17 and 14, respectively. Once certified, Ohio Clean Marinas are eligible for recertification every five years. For more information about the Ohio Clean Marinas Program and a map showing certified Clean Marinas, see pages 126 and 127.

The Ohio Clean Boater Program is a component of the Ohio Clean Marinas Program. It is also designed to encourage marina operators and boaters to use simple, innovative solutions to keep Ohio's coastal and inland waterway resources clean. The program offers a list of best boater practices that aim to educate boaters on watercraft upkeep (fueling and engine maintenance, boat cleaning, painting and sanding), waste management, aquatic invasive species control and environmental hazards associated with boating. The Clean Boater Program is a voluntary program. Boaters committed to following best boater practices may pledge to become a "Clean Boater."



LAKE ERIE PUBLIC ACCESS (WEST)





Ohio's 312-mile Lake Erie shore offers a diverse range of publicly accessible facilities, amenities and activities. The following maps (see also the "East" section on the next page) show the locations of parks, nature preserves, wildlife areas, beaches, boating facilities and scenic overlooks that provide recreational and/or scenic access to the Lake Erie coast. Access sites adjacent to Lake Erie's major rivers are also included. All public accesses (lake and river) are managed/protected by federal, state, county, municipal, township or non-profit entities.

In total, there are 188 public access sites on Lake Erie, which comprise approximately 60.5 miles of shore (about 19 percent of Ohio's entire Lake Erie coast) and account for nearly 22,270 acres of protected land. Erie County has the most public access on Lake Erie with 43 sites, followed by Ottawa County (38), Lucas County (28), Lake County (27), Cuyahoga County (23), Lorain County (15), Ashtabula County (13) and Sandusky County (1).

Note: Totals include 27 locally-verified public road right-of-way access sites. Rightof-way sites are public spaces that extend to the lake from a roadway terminus.


All access areas (lake and river) are represented with green polygons. Blue and dark green dots pinpoint the locations of entrances to Lake Erie and river access sites, respectively. Dot sizes vary based on the type of entryway, i.e. main entrances, alternate entrances and pedestrian entryways. Due to map scale, an entrance symbol may completely cover a polygon representing a smaller access site.


Coastal access sites are labelled sequentially from west to east with blue identification label symbols, while river accesses are labelled sequentially in an upriver direction (from river mouth to headwaters) with dark green label symbols. Identification labels point out 145 (of 188) Lake Erie public access sites and 73 river access sites. The corresponding map keys and amenity charts are found on pages 110 through 113. The charts include the following amenities/activities: (1) swimming beach; (2) picnic area; (3) hiking/walking trails; (4) bicycling/multi-use trails; (5) fishing access; (6) boat launch; (7) marina; (8) small boat access; (9) camping; (10) wildlife viewing; (11) hunting, and; (12) restrooms.

Many sites provide access to the water by way of staircase(s) and/or walking path(s) that traverse a bluff, or via the natural terrain or re-graded bluff. Several access sites do not allow access to the water. Restricting access is often a safety precaution.

Nearly 80 Lake Erie public access sites include a beach (or multiple beach areas) for recreational and/or passive activities. Beaches provide easy lake access for swimming, wading, fishing and paddling. The amenity charts list the 37 recreational beaches that allow swimming. Many non-swimming beaches (not listed in the charts) are managed to preserve the natural characteristics of the lakeshore, promote habitat conservation, support dune communities and allow low-impact activities, such as nature-walking and wildlife viewing.

Many access sites feature hiking, biking, walking and fitness trails. Trails range from dirt-surfaced and grass-mowed nature trails through wooded areas, wetlands and meadows, to paved multi-purpose trails and lakefront boardwalks. There are also many statewide, regional and local trails and bikeways that link coastal and river sites. For an overview of the trails in the Lake Erie Watershed, see the Major Trail Networks map on page 114.

Boating amenities range from paved ramps and marina facilities for motorized watercraft to small paddling accesses for kayaks and rowboats. Many river sites provide boaters access to Lake Erie. For a comprehensive list of all boating access facilities, including commercially-owned and privately-owned ramps and marinas, see the Motorized Boating Access maps on pages 116 and 118. A map showing paddling access locations and hazards is found on page 128.

Fishing access is permitted at most coastal and river access sites. Many fishable beach areas, river banks, piers and other structures are publicly accessible. Lake Erie (as well as the Maumee and Sandusky rivers) is nationally-renowned for walleye fishing. It is also noted for yellow perch. The Vermilion, Rocky, Cuyahoga, Chagrin, Grand and Ashtabula rivers, and Conneaut Creek, are recognized for steelhead trout fishing. Lake Erie's bays, harbors and shore areas offer excellent bluegill, crappie and largemouth bass fishing.

The wetlands, shore areas, marshes, estuaries, grasslands and forests that make up the Lake Erie ecosystem provide essential habitat for a variety of avian, aquatic and terrestrial species. Lake Erie is located at the intersection of the Mississippi and Atlantic migratory bird flyways. Many public accesses are prime for year-round wildlife viewing (see also the Lake Erie Birding map on page 130 and the Important Bird Areas map on page 152).

Public access and amenity information was collected and inventoried by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Office of Coastal Management (OCM). This information is presented in two OCM publications: *Ohio's Lake Erie Public Access Guidebook, Coast Edition* (2014) and *Ohio's Lake Erie Public Access Guidebook, Rivers Edition* (2013). It is also available on the OCM website. These publications provide a comprehensive list of public access sites and an expanded list of available amenities and services.







MAJOR TRAIL NETWORKS





Many hiking, biking, multi-use and paddling trails are featured on this map. Trails range from dirt-surfaced or grass-mowed nature trails through woods, wetland areas and meadows, to paved multi-purpose trails and on-road bike lanes and routes. Designated water trails are also included.

Trails are color-coded to represent "Nationwide," "Statewide," "Regional," "Local" and "Park District" trails (and water trails). In instances where multiple routes follow the same physical trail, the line color is assigned in reversehierarchal order. For example, a regional trail that also carries a nationwide and/or statewide route is symbolized with an orange line to represent it as a regional trail.

This map features various long-distance, nationwide bicycling routes that connect multiple states. The Lake Erie Connector, Northern Tier Trail and the Underground Railroad Route are part of the Adventure Cycling Route Network, a nearly 47,000-mile system of bicycling routes that traverse some of the most scenic and historically significant roads in the U.S. and Canada. Proposed U.S. Bicycle Route System corridors are also included.

The Buckeye Trail is a statewide looping hiking trail that meanders more than 1,400 miles through Ohio. Much of the trail follows rural roads. Where possible, the trail is routed off-road and/or through parkland. In Cuyahoga Valley National Park, the Bedford Section (not called out on map) of the Buckeye Trail branches north and navigates to its northernmost terminus at Headlands Dunes State Nature Preserve on Lake Erie.


Regional trails included on the map are multi-use routes that connect parks, communities and counties. Many regional trails, e.g. the North Coast Inland Trail, Wabash Cannonball trails and the Western Reserve Greenway, follow defunct railroad rights-of-way. The Cleveland Lakefront Bikeway and a portion of the Back Roads & Beaches Bike Trail parallel the Lake Erie shore and link many public access sites. Both consist of off-road paved trails, bike lanes and road routes. The Ohio and Erie Canal Towpath Trail parallels the Cuyahoga River in Cuyahoga and Summit counties and follows the historic route of the former Ohio & Erie Canal from Cleveland to New Philadelphia in Tuscarawas County. It connects and traverses many protected lands in Cuyahoga, Summit and Stark counties.

The local trails included in this map comprise of municipally-maintained multiuse routes. These trails, including the North Shore Trail and the Sandusky Bay Pathway, are entirely located in one community (Ashtabula and Sandusky, respectively). Park district trails comprise of hiking, biking, multi-use and bridle routes that are located entirely within the boundaries of a park, nature preserve or wildlife area.

Proposed State Bicycle Route System corridors are also included.

MOTORIZED BOATING ACCESS (WEST)





Boating access along Ohio's Lake Erie shore ranges from unpaved paddling access points to concrete ramps and marinas intended for motorized watercraft. The following maps (see also the "East" section on the next page) show the locations of 319 boat launch and/or dock facilities for motorized watercraft. Many boating facilities are located directly on Lake Erie, while many others are located within harbors or along rivers. Sites with purple identification labels highlight accesses that do not provide access to Lake Erie. A map showing paddling access locations and hazards is found on page 128.

Motorized boating access sites are represented with both black circle/white anchor symbols and navy blue circle/white anchor symbols. Black circles pinpoint the locations of individual boating facilities, whereas due to map scale, navy blue circles are used to represent a cluster of multiple boating facilities within a general geographic location. The exact number of sites (per navy blue circle) is inferred in the accompanying identification label.


Boating access sites that are located directly on Lake Erie are labelled sequentially from west to east, "LE1" through "LE77." Facilities that are located along a tributary are labelled sequentially in an upriver direction (from river mouth to headwaters) using an identification code unique to the waterway (e.g. Maumee River: "MR1" through "MR12"). Facilities that are located within a harbor, along a canal or on an inland lake/reservoir are labeled sequentially using an identification code unique to the waterbody (e.g. LaDue Reservoir: "LR1" through "LR3").


Boating access sites include public facilities (state-, county-, municipal-, township-, port authority- and park district-managed and maintained), commercial facilities and private facilities (yacht clubs, etc.). Many boating facilities provide various amenities, such as ramps, transient dockage, fuel, electric hook-up, water hook-up and waste pump-outs. The corresponding map keys and a services charts, found on pages 120 through 125, lists each access facility and the waterbody it directly accesses, its management type and details the following services and amenities: (1) publicly accessible; (2) launch facility; (3) dock facility; (4) transient dockage, and; (5) boat fuel.

The "Publicly Accessible" column indicates if the boating facility or any of its amenities are available to the public. Of the 207 publicly accessible boating access sites on Lake Erie-including sites that provide access to Lake Erie via connecting waterway—105 have a boat ramp, 177 have docking facilities and 74 have both (ramp and docks). These include 137 commercial facilities, 60 public facilities and five private sites. The public boating access sites include state (13 sites), county (two sites), municipal (32 sites), township (two sites), port authority (three sites) and park district (eight sites) facilities. Public sites are also featured on the Lake Erie Public Access maps in this chapter. For a complete inventory of additional boating resources and amenities, see the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), Division of Parks and Watercraft website.

Security Zones: There are two U.S. Coast Guard-established security zones in Ohio's Lake Erie waters (see crisscross-hatched areas on map). One security zone is located in an area adjacent to the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station in Ottawa County, while the other is located in an area adjacent to the Perry Nuclear Generating Station in Lake County. These zones are not marked with buoys. Entering, transiting or anchoring within a security zone is prohibited. The U.S. Coast Guard, state or local law enforcement officials or power plant security personnel will likely direct boaters out of the area. Refusal to exit a security zone is subject to criminal penalties.

The **Davis-Besse Security Zone** encompasses the portion of Lake Erie beginning at: 41° 36.3′ N, 083° 04.9′ W; then north to 41° 37.0′ N, 083° 03.9′ W; then east to 41° 35.9′ N, 083° 02.5′ W; then southwest to 41° 35.4′ N, 083° 03.7′ W, then back to the starting point (41° 36.3′ N, 083° 04.9′ W).

The **Perry Security Zone** encompasses the portion of Lake Erie beginning at: 41° 48.187′ N, 081° 08.818′ W; then north to 41° 48.7′ N, 081° 08.818′ W; then east to 41° 48.7′ N, 081° 08.455′ W; then south to 41° 48.231′ N, 081° 08.455′ W; then west along the shoreline back to the starting point (41° 48.187′ N, 081° 08.818′ W).

Boat Registration: Registration is required for every recreational boat in Ohio, excluding paddle boards, sail boards, kite boards and belly boats. Boats can be registered online, through the mail or through a registration agent. Boat registration agents include private businesses, title offices and the following ODNR field offices in the Lake Erie Watershed: the Cleveland Watercraft Office; Geneva State Park Office; Maumee Bay State Park Office and the Sandusky Watercraft Office.

From 2010 to 2016, the number of boat registrations in Lake Erie's eight coastal counties totaled nearly 580,700. Combined, registrations increased 12 percent in this seven-year span. Cuyahoga County accounts for 30 percent of the total registrations in coastal counties.

Motorized boating access and amenity information was collected and inventoried by the ODNR Division of Parks and Watercraft. For more information about Lake Erie boating, see the Division of Parks and Watercraft website.





OHIO'S CERTIFIED CLEAN MARINAS





The Ohio Clean Marinas Program is a proactive partnership between Ohio Sea Grant, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and marine trades associations. It is designed to encourage marina operators and boaters to use simple, innovative solutions to keep Ohio's coastal and inland waterway resources clean. Goals include responsible use and protection of the natural environment through education, awareness and applying best management practices. The program helps inform marina operators and boaters about environmental laws, rules and jurisdictions. Committed implementation of various conservation measures that improve environmental and economic aspects of operation may qualify a marina to become a certified "Clean Marina." The Clean Marinas Program is a voluntary program. Benefits include improved water quality and wildlife habitat; public recognition and enhanced image; attracting conscientious boaters; financial incentives, and; compliance assistance.


The Ohio Clean Marinas Program started in 2004. At the time, it was only available to marinas on Lake Erie. In 2015, the program was expanded statewide. Between 2005 and June 1, 2018, 78 marinas were certified as Ohio Clean Marinas, including 58 in the Lake Erie Watershed. Approximately 74 percent of all Clean Marinas are on Lake Erie (as of June 1, 2018). Erie and Ottawa counties have the most Clean Marinas, with 17 and 14, respectively. Once certified, Ohio Clean Marinas are eligible for recertification every five years. A corresponding map key is found on page 132.



The Ohio Clean Boater Program is a component of the Ohio Clean Marinas Program. It is also designed to encourage marina operators and boaters to use simple, innovative solutions to keep Ohio's coastal and inland waterway resources clean. The program offers a list of best boater practices that aim to educate boaters on watercraft upkeep, waste management, aquatic invasive species control and environmental hazards associated with boating. The Clean Boater Program is a voluntary program. Boaters committed to following best boater practices may pledge to become a "Clean Boater."

Water Trails: The Ohio Water Trails Program is a cooperative partnership between the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), various levels of government and non-profit conservation groups. The program promotes lowimpact paddling opportunities, addresses the need for more access points and helps educate paddlers about hand-powered boating safety. In addition to designating water trails, the program also provides funding for access improvements/development, signage and educational materials.

The Water Trails Program has designated four water trails in the Lake Erie Watershed, including the East Sandusky Bay Water Trail, the Lake Erie Islands (LEI) Water Trail, the Maumee River Water Trail and the Vermilion-Lorain Water Trail. The 15.3-mile East Sandusky Bay Water Trail was designated in 2007. It is a circular route with five access points on the East Sandusky Bay and Pipe Creek. The LEI Water Trail is comprised of five individual paddling routes. These include separate trails encircling each of Ohio's four largest islands— Kelleys, South Bass, Middle Bass and North Bass—and one trail following the Catawba Island/Marblehead Peninsula mainland shore. Combined, the LEI water trails total nearly 60 miles and include over 30 access points. The 107-mile Maumee River Water Trail was dedicated in 2018 and includes 39 access locations between Maumee Bay and the Indiana state line. The 27mile Vermilion-Lorain Water Trail was designated in 2009 and connects nine access points along the Vermilion and Black rivers and Lake Erie.

Scenic Rivers: The goal of the Ohio Scenic Rivers Program is to recognize and protect high-quality rivers, coordinate preservation activities and ensure that management decisions are made in an environmentally-sensitive and responsible manner. The program is a cooperative partnership between ODNR, local governments, businesses, landowners, non-profit groups and other state and federal agencies. Scenic rivers are classified by various stream qualities and categorized as either wild, scenic and/or recreational. Factors that determine designation include length, adjacent forestation, biological characteristics, water quality, river use and other natural conditions.


The Scenic Rivers Program has designated portions of seven Lake Erie tributaries, including (from west to east): the Maumee River (1974), Sandusky River (1970), Cuyahoga River (1974), Chagrin River (1979), Grand River (1974), Ashtabula River (2008) and Conneaut Creek (2005).



LAKE ERIE BIRDING





Lake Erie is located at the intersection of the Mississippi and Atlantic migratory flyways and offers many bird watching opportunities. Shore and open water areas, wetlands, marshes, grasslands and forests provide perfect habitat for a variety of bird species during breeding, nesting and migration seasons. Bird enthusiasts from across the world flock to the Lake Erie area to observe nearly 400 bird species (almost 95 percent of all birds observed in Ohio). Many birds that naturally occur in Ohio were first recorded in the Lake Erie region. This map highlights many popular birding locations in the Lake Erie Watershed and in northern Ohio. The corresponding map key is found on page 133. See also the Important Bird Areas map found on page 152.

The marsh complexes and wetland habitats along the Western Basin shore are important resting and feeding grounds for great numbers and diversity of migrant songbirds during spring and fall migrations. Sites such as Magee Marsh Wildlife Area and Ottawa National Wildlife Refuge preserve portions of historic coastal marshland and Great Black Swamp habitat. Noted as "the warbler capital of the world," these sites, along with other northwest Ohio locations, host "The Biggest Week in American Birding" event each spring.


Wetlands are prime locations to view waterfowl, raptors and shorebirds. Harbor areas, such as at Conneaut, Fairport Harbor and Lorain, are also productive locations to view waterfowl, songbirds, gulls, alongshore-migrant shorebirds, the occasional snowy owl and other passerines (perching birds). The Lake Erie Islands are important stopover sites for migrating birds as they cross the lake. Kelleys Island has the greatest habitat diversity of any of the islands and is host to large spring and fall migrations of more than 250 species.

Lake Erie Birding Trail: Developed by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife, in partnership with the Ohio Sea Grant Program, the Lake Erie Birding Trail Guidebook (2013, modifed 2016) and website are intended to provide information on the best birding locations along the Lake Erie shore. The Lake Erie Birding Trail is divided into seven loops, each exhibiting similar habitat types and landscapes. The loops, which do not follow a specific road route, include (from east to west) the Ashtabula Loop, Cleveland Area Loop, Huron & Lorain Loop, Sandusky Bay Loop, Lake Erie Islands Loop, Western Lake Erie Marshes Loop and the Oak Openings Loop. Each loop features several publicly accessible birding hotspots. These sites are labelled 1 through 88 on the map. Identification labels are color-coded by loop. Collectively, nearly 400 bird species have been viewed at these sites.

Many trail sites are also recognized by the Ohio Ornithological Society and The Nature Conservancy as notable birding locations. Additional birding destinations identified by these organizations are included on the map (sites 89-102). Restricted and limited access sites are also included on the map (sites 103-107). These include sites that are not publicly accessible and sites that require special permission and/or permits. To determine if a site is open to the public, contact the managing authority.
