

Canopy Preservation Ordinance

Tree canopy preservation helps ensure the preservation of existing trees and natural wooded areas and encourages tree planting in areas where trees are removed or damaged. Tree protection or preservation ordinances are designed to protect existing trees during land development and ensure the continuation of tree canopy cover in communities. Land development does not need to be the end of trees!

Used appropriately and with the support of community leadership, quality, tree-related ordinances help ensure a high-quality human ecosystem. They show that your community values tree growth and canopy cover in your town, state, region while allowing for reasonable and development with coordination and partnership with builders and developers. Thoughtful & informed planning, dedicated enforcement, and quality program implementation that results in a community filled with healthy trees can be a reality for any community.

Tree protection & preservation ordinances vary widely depending on each community's needs, history, culture, and political will.
