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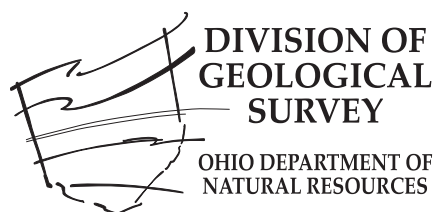

PREFACE

For almost four months this past summer, roadway expansion and construction almost made me a prisoner in my own neighborhood. To get out onto the main highways, I had to weave my way through the area by a convolute and circuitous route. Once out on the larger highways, the challenge of the orange barrels was there to greet everyone. Travel time to my office has tripled during this extended time of highway improvement. In my 44 years of driving experience, I don't think I have ever seen so much construction as we have had in Ohio's major metropolitan areas. But, in spite of the inconveniences, our mobility and ease of travel will be vastly improved.

What most of Ohio's traveling population does not realize is that most of the aggregate used in expanding our highway systems comes from nearby quarries and sand and gravel operations that are part of the state's rich mineral heritage. This report on mineral production for 1999 shows that the value of limestone and dolomite was \$361.3 million. The value of sand and gravel produced in 1999 was \$264.4 million. Ohio has a very healthy aggregate industry. And as we travel a much-improved highway system, we should be grateful that we have abundant aggregate resources.

Although Ohio has abundant aggregate resources, a grave concern is the growing opposition to opening of new pits and quarries. Suburban expansion, rapid construction of new housing developments and shopping centers, and creation of more golf courses are making it more and more difficult to locate sites for new mines. Interest in farmland preservation also constrains additional mining operations. Ohio urgently needs to identify prime mineral-resource areas and set them aside for future mining. We should not be making land-use decisions that exclude mining. Geologic maps should be consulted to identify prime mineral-resource areas, and local government officials need to develop long-term land-use plans that include mining rather than excluding it. Without pits and quarries, we will not have access to the raw materials needed to build highways and other components of our modern infrastructure. Smart and sustainable growth in our society should include multiple and sequential use of prime mineral-resource areas to benefit all citizens.

FOREWORD

Change best describes the Ohio mineral industry in 1999. The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 and low prices challenge the Ohio coal industry's ability to adapt to changing market conditions. Consolidation continues in the Ohio aggregate industry as large multinational and leading U.S. companies seek to gain market share. Ohio clay, shale, and gypsum mines are producing at capacity to meet strong residential and commercial demand. Oil and gas prices have rebounded from historic lows, fostering cautious optimism in Ohio's petroleum industry.

Change was evident when the Ohio Senate approved H.B. 601 creating a new, consolidated division within the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the Division of Mineral Resources Management (DMRM), to regulate Ohio mineral and fossil fuel extraction. H.B. 601 combines the Division of Oil and Gas and the Division of Mines and Reclamation into a new, more efficient, and responsive agency. Mike Sponsler was named chief of DMRM, coming to Ohio from Indiana with impressive credentials.

This year's article, "Warranties on highway pavements—Ohio aggregate suppliers to test uncharted waters," by Pat Jacomet, Director of Technical Services for the Ohio Aggregates & Industrial Minerals Association, highlights changes the Ohio aggregate industry is experiencing. Ohio now has one of the most comprehensive highway warranty programs in the nation. A well-trained workforce becomes even more important in meeting the warranty requirements. We thank Larry Shively of The Shelly Company and Scott Wilson of Shelly Materials, Inc., for their cooperation in obtaining the photograph on the cover.

Electronic filing of mineral industry reports is under development. We are still experimenting with making the *Report on Ohio mineral industries* available on CD-ROM. An excellent start has been made on compiling e-mail addresses to facilitate communications with industry.

Speaking of change, as always, your suggestions for future improvements to the *Report on Ohio mineral industries* are welcome. We hope to continue the tradition of providing a continually improved annual report that is useful to both the public and industry.

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WARRANTIES ON HIGHWAY PAVEMENTS—OHIO'S AGGREGATE SUPPLIERS TO TEST UNCHARTED WATERS

INTRODUCTION

Mineral aggregates are major components of highway paving materials. In Ohio, mineral aggregates are crushed limestone, dolomite, and sandstone; sand and gravel; and slag (a by-product of steel manufacturing). In fact, aggregates account for approximately 95 percent of asphalt mixes (by weight) and 65-75 percent of portland cement concrete (by volume). Aggregates are also by far the most inexpensive material in these paving products. The Ohio legislature passed a law in February 1999 requiring that a percentage of Ohio's roads be constructed with a warranty attached. Similar to the three-year or 36,000-mile parts and labor warranty on your personal vehicle, the highway-paving contractor now, in essence, *guarantees* that the pavement will not fail or the contractor will fix it at his expense.

Ohio is leading the way nationally in highway-pavement warranty projects. Ohio's experiences will be closely watched by transportation agencies in other states. This article explores the history of warranties, reviews Ohio's warranty requirements, and addresses some of the possible problems or pitfalls associated with warranties. The most obvious question for an aggregate producer is, "If the pavement doesn't last for the required period of time, what are the aggregate producer's liabilities?"

A LAW IS BORN

In February 1999, the 122nd Ohio General Assembly passed House Bill 163, the Transportation Budget Bill, which required that 10 percent of the 2000/2001 biennium budget for highway construction projects include a warranty on surface pavements. The initiative for a warranty provision developed quite rapidly, much to the surprise of the construction industry. The warranty initiative was in response to several experimental paving projects that failed prematurely and required early repair. In addition, the central Ohio area experienced one of the worst winters in

recent years in regard to freeze-thaw cycles, which took a toll on area highways. One of the most prominent failures occurred on a heavily traveled section of Interstate 270 in the Columbus area while the Ohio legislature was in session. The warranty language provisions were attached to the existing Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) biennium budget, which typically passes very quickly in order to meet a March deadline for federal matching funds. The law specifies that, for selected projects, warranties be provided by the highway-paving contractor for a period of seven years for new pavement construction and major pavement rehabilitation and a period of five years for minor pavement rehabilitation.

WRITING THE PAVEMENT WARRANTY SPECIFICATIONS—AN INDUSTRYWIDE COOPERATIVE EFFORT

Given the speed at which the budget and its warranty provisions were passed, writing the highway-pavement warranty specifications that would guide ODOT and the construction industry through the next two years was critically important. Because the law required that 10 percent of the budgeted pavements include warranties, it was imperative that these high-profile projects be carefully chosen and constructed. ODOT quickly appointed Dave Powers, ODOT Central Laboratory Bituminous Engineer, to head up the monumental task of coordinating this initiative. Mr. Powers directed over 50 meetings with industry, the Federal Highway Administration, and other interested parties to discuss details of the pavement warranty specifications.

There was much give and take as discussions continued. The majority of the debates involved warranty failure parameters, that is, what types of distresses would be measured and to what extent and what level of accuracy, and just what is failure and how much can be tolerated before performance and safety are compromised. Legitimate, measurable parameters had to be established, as well as a plan for data gathering and failure assignment.

It became apparent early in the negotiations that there was a lack of data about the proposed failure criteria and the corresponding measurements. Some of this lack of information could be attributed to the methods of measurement that were used in the past. Some of the older pass/fail specifications did not meet the level of accuracy that is achievable with today's equipment. For this reason, it was difficult to set stringent failure parameters. Realizing that they had to begin somewhere, the warranty authors decided that the most complicated pavement-warranty specification, that for asphalt concrete pavement, would be tackled first. If it could be conquered, the other specifications would follow more swiftly.

CONSTRUCTING THE WARRANTY SKELETON

There are two types of pavement. (1) Asphalt concrete—also called asphalt, asphalt cement concrete, blacktop, hot-mixed asphalt, and flexible pavement—generally is defined as a paving material that consists of asphalt binder and mineral aggregate. The asphalt binder, also called asphalt

cement, is a petroleum/hydrocarbon material that serves to glue mineral aggregate particles into a dense mass and to waterproof the mixture. When bound together, the aggregate acts as a stone framework or skeleton that strengthens and solidifies the system. (2) Portland cement concrete is similar to asphalt concrete in that it uses mineral aggregate as its major component. However, the “glue” that holds portland cement concrete together is, obviously, portland cement, a material derived from limestone, dolomite, clay, and shale. Aggregate, portland cement, and water (which activates or hydrates the cement), combine to form a rigid or inflexible pavement.

Asphalt performance is highly affected by climatic conditions and road salt and, more than any other widely used paving material, depends on a multitude of factors to maintain satisfactory performance. Portland cement concrete also is affected by climatic conditions as well as by road-salt use. Because of the number of elements affecting asphalt and asphalt performance, asphalt concrete pavement was the first pavement-warranty specification to be tackled. Initially, there were many more questions and “what ifs” than there were answers. The warranty authors knew what they did not want in terms of pavement distresses, but had a difficult task in determining how much was too much. It became readily apparent that the best approach was to look at the specifications used at transportation agencies in other states. These specifications were then combined with past experiences, sound science, and engineering judgment to develop Ohio’s warranty specifications. Also, it was known that a certain amount of surface distress is to be expected, and, because of the nature of the climatic conditions in the Midwest, is inevitable. Thus, parameters were set that were perceived to be achievable and, most importantly, measurable.

THE WARRANTY SPECIFICATIONS—WHAT MAKES A GOOD PAVEMENT?

The specifications for highway pavement warranties concentrated on surface distresses that affect safety and longevity. For asphalt, distresses include cracking, disintegrated areas, flushing, and rutting. For portland cement concrete, distresses include cracking, disintegrated areas,

and faulting. Each of these parameters is summarized below. The specifications are described in detail in the Ohio Department of Transportation Warranty Supplemental Specifications (880, Asphalt Concrete with Warranty; 884, Concrete Pavement with Warranty). Cracking—Cracking can occur as a result of a variety of material and climatic factors. Cracking allows water to penetrate the surface of the pavement. Because water expands slightly during freezing, this moisture acts as an expansive force that shoves the pavement as the moisture seeks room to expand. Continued cycles of freezing and thawing can eventually destroy the pavement surface. To repair excessive cracking, the contractor must rout and seal the distressed areas or, in extreme cases, remove and replace the entire area. Most cracking can be controlled by proper construction methods such as proper joint construction in asphalt and adequate joint spacing in portland cement concrete. Because asphalt is a flexible pavement, simply preventing water from infiltrating the pavement generally is sufficient to prevent cracking. However, the asphalt cement (the black, sticky, petroleum-based glue) can contribute to cracking. Portland cement concrete, on the other hand, is a rigid pavement and *will* crack. Control joints in portland cement concrete serve to buffer this problem by dictating *where* the pavement will crack.

Disintegrated areas—More commonly known as “potholes,” this commuters’ nemesis is the result of water infiltration and freeze-thaw conditions. Potholes are common in the Midwest because of our highly variable weather and severe temperature swings. It is often said, “If you don’t like the weather in Ohio, just wait an hour.” In dry, arid areas of the country, as well as areas that remain frozen for extended periods, potholes are not prevalent. Again, proper joint construction in asphalt and portland cement concrete is critical to minimizing this inevitable occurrence.

Rutting—Rutting is unique to asphalt and is the result of the reorientation of aggregate particles combined with

asphalt's inherent flexibility. Heat and loads in excess of those for which the pavement was designed are the major contributing factors. Besides being aesthetically displeasing, rutting can lead to dangerous ponding of water and hydroplaning conditions.

Flushing—Flushing, another distress unique to asphalt pavements, is the migration of the asphalt binder to the surface of the pavement. This condition creates a dangerously slick situation and must be immediately remedied, generally by covering the affected pavement with a suitable surface treatment. One common solution is to add a thin layer of asphalt to cover the flushed surface. Slurry Seal, a thin layer of aggregate and asphalt emulsion, also is a good solution because it can be placed quickly so the surface is ready for traffic.

Faulting—Faulting is associated with portland cement concrete and results from the differential settlement of one slab of concrete in relation to an adjacent slab. This differential creates a ridge or bump in the pavement. Again, portland cement concrete's rigidity and strength contribute to this condition. Proper construction techniques, including proper compaction of the sub-base and proper joint construction, generally can help avoid this type of surface distress.

All of the above distresses are to be monitored for warranted pavements on a yearly basis by an ODOT District Review Team (DRT). The DRT will be responsible for measuring and recording any pavement defects that might occur throughout the life of the warranty. The DRT members will be trained in pavement distresses, in particular, how to identify them and how to measure them. After the yearly review, the DRT will issue a report of the findings to the highway pavement contractor. Industry was very insistent that all interested parties be allowed to witness the yearly review. It was felt that in order to improve performance, it is important to know by what methods that performance was being measured. Thus, the specifications were written to allow observation by interested parties.

DEALING WITH PAVEMENT DISTRESSES AND FAILURES

The highway-pavement contractor is responsible for all remedial actions (repairs) in the case of pavement dis-

resses in excess of the specified limits. The contractor is required to carry a maintenance bond (essentially an insurance policy) that will cover the life of the warranty period. For portland cement concrete pavements, the bond must be for 40 percent of the bid price for the entire pavement. For asphalt pavements, the bond amount varies depending on the depth of the pavement to be constructed. For pavement thickness of 2.0 inches or less, the bond amount is 90 percent of the bid price of the entire pavement. For thickness of 2.1 inches to 4.0 inches, the bond amount is 60 percent of the bid price. For thickness over 4.1 inches, the bond required is 30 percent of the bid price. The bond amount for asphalt pavements is variable because the thicker the asphalt pavement, the less likely the occurrence of distress features and the more control the contractor has over the project.

BEYOND THE CONTRACTOR'S CONTROL

In some instances, a failure may not be due to anything that the contractor did or did not do. Such cases may include vehicle fires, oil spills, or lost tractor-trailer loads. In such cases, a contractor would not be required to repair the pavement at his expense. Other unforeseen circumstances may relieve the contractor of repair responsibilities as well.

In the case of increased traffic loads, such as those that result from the opening of a new shopping center or a new factory, a provision in the warranty relieves the contractor of financial responsibility.

If there is controversy or debate surrounding the findings of the DRT, a system is in place by which the contractor may appeal. The appeals process has time limits depending upon the particular problem. In a situation where the problem might jeopardize public safety, the repairs will take place immediately and determination of financial responsibility will follow.

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD?

At this time, there are more questions than answers. The answers to some of the concerns may not come to light for several years. The mineral aggregate producer is in the most precarious position of all raw material suppliers. On one hand, the aggregate producer supplies an extremely low priced commodity, which is the fundamental component of a relatively high priced end product. In the case of asphalt, a \$5 per ton aggregate makes up 95 percent of a \$25-\$30 per ton final product. In the case of portland cement concrete, that same \$5 per ton aggregate makes up almost 75 percent of a \$60 per cubic yard product. The aggregate producer, by supplying aggregate to a pavement warranty project, has compounded the financial liabilities. If the aggregate is blamed for the failure, what percentage of the cost of the remediation or repairs will be the responsibility of the aggregate producer? It is this scenario that is at the heart of the aggregate producer's apprehensions. Furthermore, the projects selected for warranty provisions will likely be fairly large, highly visible projects and thus fall under more intense scrutiny.

The law also requires that the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation issue a progress report in December 2000. This report will include a comparison of cost, techniques, and quality between warranted and nonwarranted pavements. The report also will include recommendations for future use of warranties. The entire construction industry will be anxious to see this report.

MINIMIZING LIABILITIES—WHAT CAN THE MINERAL AGGREGATE PRODUCER DO?

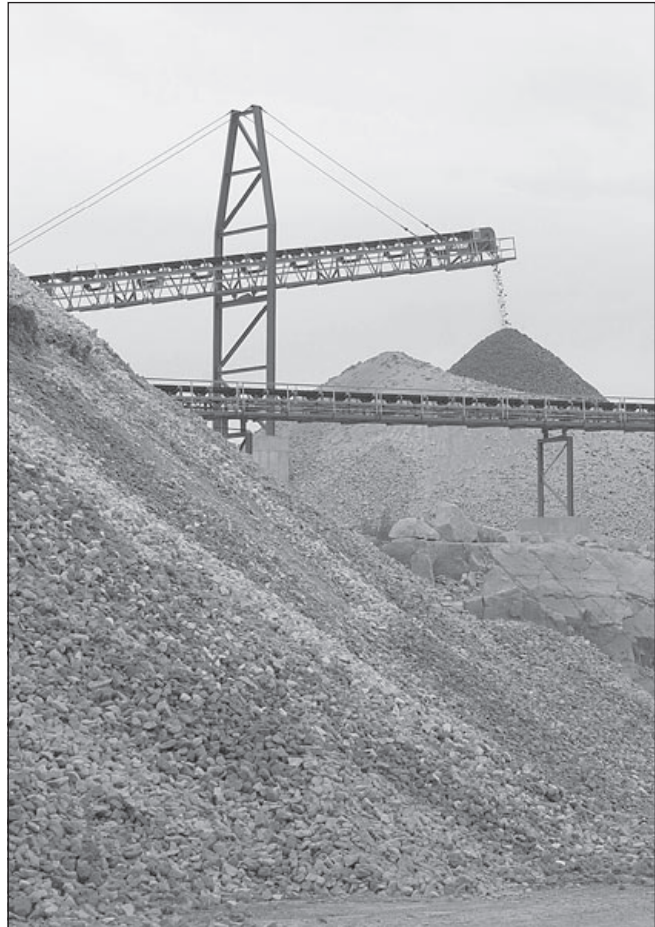
At this point in the warranty-implementation process, any liability-reducing methods are purely speculative. However, several actions may soften a producer's vulnerability in the case of a major pavement failure. Some of these include:

Training—Trained or certified technicians should perform the testing to determine the quality of the aggregate supplied to a warranty project. The Ohio Aggregates & Industrial Minerals Association, in conjunction with Ohio Department of Transportation, currently offers such training.

Documentation—The mineral aggregate producer and/or supplier should keep well-organized, detailed records at all times, but especially during warranty projects. Having proof that quality products were supplied may offer some level of protection.

Contractors—Highway pavement contractors should pay special attention to detail in construction practices and techniques. The "little things" mean a lot, especially when you are guaranteeing your work.

Communication—Throughout the process of writing the

warranty language, industry, ODOT, and all involved parties exhibited a level of communication that was without precedent. Communication—at all levels—will continue to play the key role if warranties and warranty work are to succeed.

CONCLUSION

Warranties are here and they may be here to stay. Now more than ever, communication and cooperation are of utmost importance between the mineral aggregate producers/suppliers, highway-pavement contractors, and their largest customer—the Ohio Department Of Transportation. The aggregate and highway-pavement industries continue to make a concerted effort to ensure that the travelling public receives a high-quality, durable product. Improvements in construction practices have helped to minimize commuter inconveniences during construction activity. Warranties alone do not guarantee long-lasting, high-quality pavements; warranties simply insure that someone will fix pavements if they fail prematurely. Warranties, if viewed as an opportunity and not a nuisance, can serve as a mechanism for improving the public perception of the construction industry as a whole.

1999 OHIO MINING ACTIVITIES IN BRIEF

Reports were filed in 1999 for 205 coal-mining operations, including 3 mines with their own coal-washing facility. Coal production was reported from 116 of these 205 operations. Reports also were filed for 37 separate

coal-washing plants and associated facilities. Of 673 industrial-mineral-mining operations known to be operating in 1999, 491 operations were active. A total of 48 mines reported production of multiple mineral commodities. Of this total, 42 mines reported production of multiple industrial minerals, including 11 mines reporting production of multiple industrial minerals and coal; 6 mines reported production of coal and one industrial mineral. There were 437 new wells completed for oil and gas in 1999, of which 352 were productive and 85 were dry.

The total value¹ of coal was \$643,010,587 in 1999; the value of oil and gas was \$345,799,488; and the total value¹ of all nonfuel industrial minerals was \$786,113,597 in 1999.

¹Includes reported and estimated values. Some operations reporting sales did not report a value for those sales. A countywide- or statewide-average price per ton was calculated for each industrial mineral commodity based on sales for which the value was reported. A countywide average price per ton was calculated for coal based on sales for which the value was reported and method of production. These calculated averages were used to estimate the value of the sales for which the actual values were not reported.

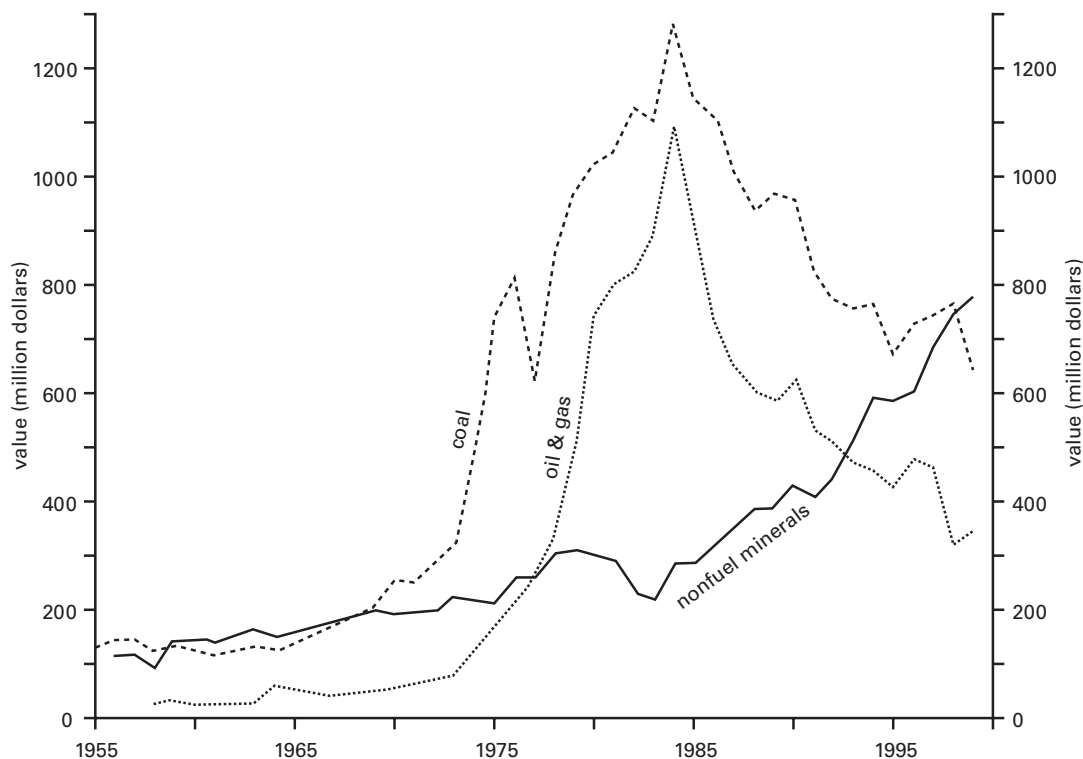


FIGURE 1.—Value of coal, nonfuel minerals, and oil and gas in Ohio.

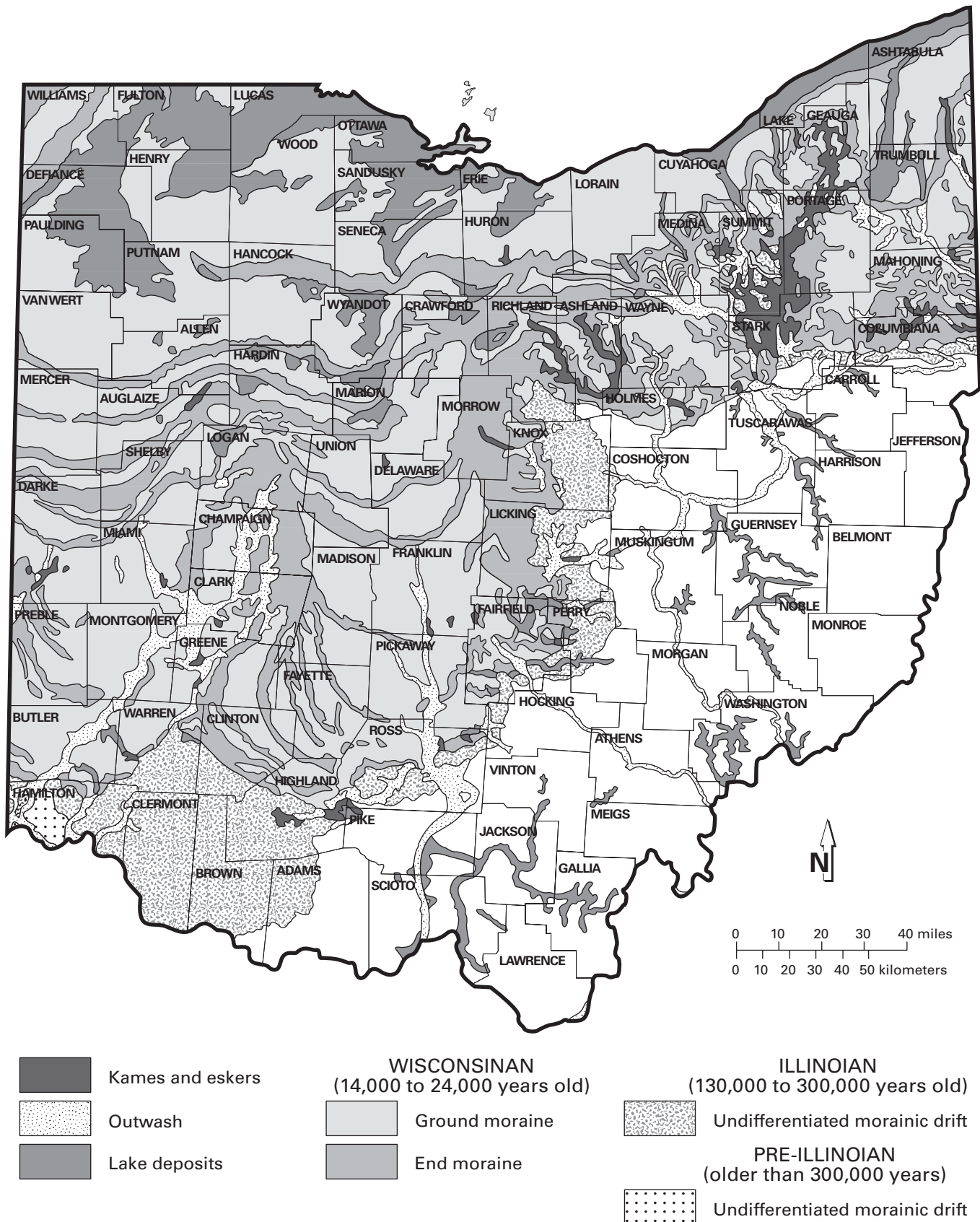


FIGURE 2.—Generalized map of the glacial deposits of Ohio. Continental glaciers advanced over the Ohio landscape several times during the Ice Age. These glaciers deposited unconsolidated materials on top of the bedrock over nearly two-thirds of the state. Most of Ohio's sand and gravel production comes from kames, eskers, and outwash, which were deposited by meltwater from the glaciers. Other glacially derived industrial minerals in Ohio include peat and clay.

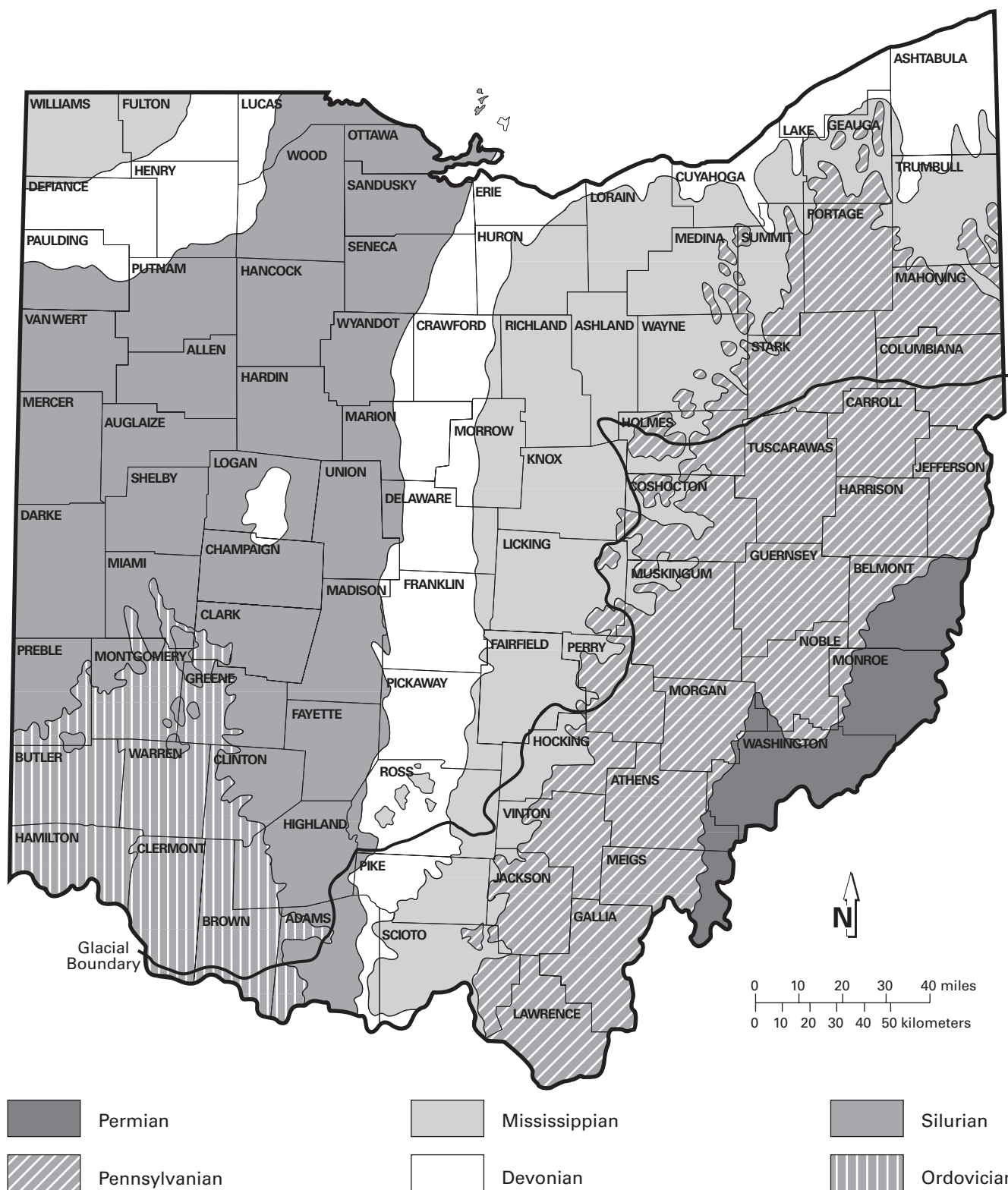


FIGURE 3.—Generalized geologic map of Ohio. Mineral production occurs throughout Ohio and from every geologic system from the Cambrian to the Permian. Coal, limestone and dolomite, sandstone and conglomerate, shale, clay, gypsum, salt, and oil and gas are produced from Ohio bedrock.

COAL

Coal was produced by 48 companies at 116 mines in 22 Ohio counties during 1999. Production decreased 18.8 percent from 1998, totalling 22,539,911 tons in 1999; 10,966,410 tons (48.7 percent of total production) were produced at 108 surface mines, and 11,573,501 tons (51.3 percent of total production) were produced at 8 underground mines. In 1999, tonnage from underground production exceeded tonnage from surface production, continuing a trend that began in 1995. Of 26 coal-producing states, Ohio ranked 14th in 1999. The top five states, in descending order of production, are Wyoming (334.9 million tons), West Virginia (156.4 million tons), Kentucky (139.4 million tons), Pennsylvania (76.3 million tons), and Texas (53.0 million tons). These five states produced 69.5 percent of the nation's coal in 1999. Ohio produced 2.1 percent of the nation's coal in 1999. The top five coal-consuming states, in descending order of consumption, are Texas, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Illinois. These five states used 36.1 percent of the total coal consumed by all 50 states in 1999.²

In comparison to 1998, 10 fewer mines reported production of less than 50,000 tons, and 3 fewer mines produced between 50,000 and 500,000 tons. There was a net decrease of 13 mines in 1999.

The five leading counties for 1999 production were Belmont, Vinton, Harrison, Gallia, and Jackson Counties; these counties produced 65.7 percent of the 1999 total production. A total of 23,286,067 tons of coal were sold in 1999; total value³ was \$643,010,587. The average price per

ton of all coal sold was \$27.61; surface-mined coal averaged \$24.03 per ton and underground-mined coal averaged \$30.73.

In underground mining, 67.4 percent of the coal was produced by longwall mining and 32.6 percent was mined by continuous miner; no coal was produced by conventional mining in 1999. In surface operations, 94.3 percent of the coal was mined by conventional surface methods, and 5.7 percent was auger mined.

The Pittsburgh (No. 8) coal was the most heavily mined seam, followed by the Clarion (No. 4A), Meigs Creek (No. 9), Middle Kittanning (No. 6), and Lower Freeport (No. 6A) seams. Coal produced from these five seams constituted 82.5 percent of the total 1999 production.

A total of 13,093,412 tons of washed coal was reported in 1999. Reports from 11 coal-washing plants indicate an average 44.7 percent loss in washing.

Trucking was the primary means of coal disposition, carrying 44.3 percent of the total sales. Conveyor belts carried 27.6 percent, rail transported 20.5 percent, and water carried 7.6 percent of the coal sold in 1999. A total of 572,279 tons (2.5 percent) of the coal produced was reported as stored.

The total average annual employment reported in 1999 was 3,063 employees; 1,721 of these were production employees. Production employees worked an average of 172 days producing coal in 1999. The average annual wage earned by all production employees was \$46,109 based on those employees for whom wages were reported. The average annual wage for surface-mine production employees was \$36,898, and the average annual wage for underground-mine production employees was \$53,672. Wages earned by all employees totalled \$153,179,432 in 1999.

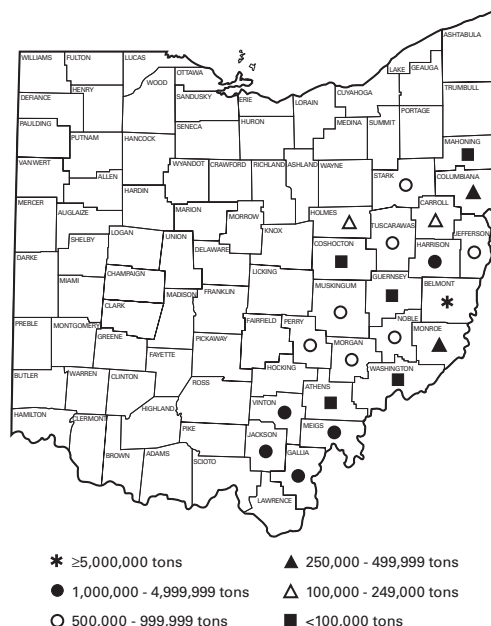


FIGURE 4.—Coal production in Ohio in 1999, by county.

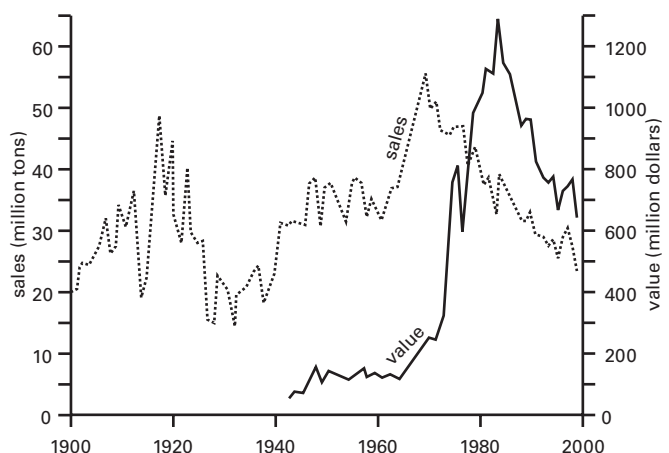


FIGURE 5.—Sales and value of coal in Ohio.

INDUSTRIAL MINERALS

Industrial minerals, other than mineral fuels, were produced in a total of 87 Ohio counties in 1999. The combined value of all nonfuel industrial minerals sold in 1999 was \$786,113,597.

In 1999, 418 companies operated 673 industrial-mineral mining operations. Industrial minerals were produced or sold by 326 companies from 491 active operations. Thirty-six of the 326 companies produced more than one industrial mineral from 42 operations. Fourteen companies produced coal and one or more industrial minerals from 17 operations. Twenty-seven companies produced multiple industrial-mineral commodities (no coal) from 31 operations. The remaining 290 companies produced one industrial-mineral commodity.

Of the 42 multiple industrial-mineral operations (including those operations producing coal and more than one industrial-mineral commodity), 9 operations produced sand and gravel and clay; 6 operations produced limestone, clay, and shale; 6 operations produced clay and shale; 5 operations produced limestone and clay; 3 operations produced limestone and sand and gravel; 3 operations produced

sandstone and sand and gravel; 2 operations produced sand and gravel, clay, and peat; 2 operations produced sandstone and clay; 1 operation produced limestone and sandstone; 1 operation produced limestone and shale; 1 operation produced sand and gravel and shale; 1 operation produced sand and gravel, sandstone, and clay; 1 operation produced limestone, sandstone, clay, and shale; and 1 operation produced sand and gravel, limestone, and clay.

The 315 multiple industrial-mineral-commodity production employees worked an average of 208 days in 1999. Total wages of \$13,218,842 were paid to a total of 481 employees (315 production employees and 166 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$27,482.

The total average annual employment reported in 1999 for industrial mineral operations was 5,360 people (3,724 production employees and 1,636 nonproduction employees). Total wages for all employees at industrial mineral operations in 1999 were \$204,169,057. The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$38,091.

LIMESTONE AND DOLOMITE

Limestone and dolomite were sold or produced by 72 companies at 124 operations in 50 Ohio counties during 1999. Sales of limestone and dolomite totalled 79,494,912 tons (-0.1 percent from 1998); Erie, Delaware, Ottawa, Wyandot, and Franklin Counties accounted for 40.1 percent of those sales. Reported known production totalled 82,175,106 tons.

Lime produced from Ohio limestone and dolomite totalled 1,244,605 tons in 1999 and came from six operations in Ottawa, Sandusky, Seneca, and Wyandot Counties. Ohio ranks 4th nationally in the production of lime out of 34 producing states. The top five states, in descending order of lime production, are Missouri, Kentucky, Alabama, Ohio, and Texas. Ohio ranks 7th in the production of crushed stone (which includes crushed sandstone) out of 49 produc-

ing states. The states leading Ohio in the production of crushed stone, in descending order, are, Texas, Pennsylvania, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, and Missouri.⁴

The total value⁵ of limestone and dolomite sold in 1999 was \$361,314,456. Average price per ton was \$4.55.

An annual average of 1,682 employees worked an average of 219 days to produce limestone and dolomite. Total wages of \$86,356,737 were paid to a total of 2,241 employees (1,682 production employees and 559 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$38,535. An additional 104 people (82 production employees and 22 nonproduction employees) were employed by operations mining limestone and dolomite along with one or more other mineral commodities.

Primary uses for crushed and broken limestone and dolomite were road construction/resurfacing and commercial building. Other major uses for various forms of limestone and dolomite included stone for asphaltic concrete and portland cement concrete, aglime, and the production of lime.

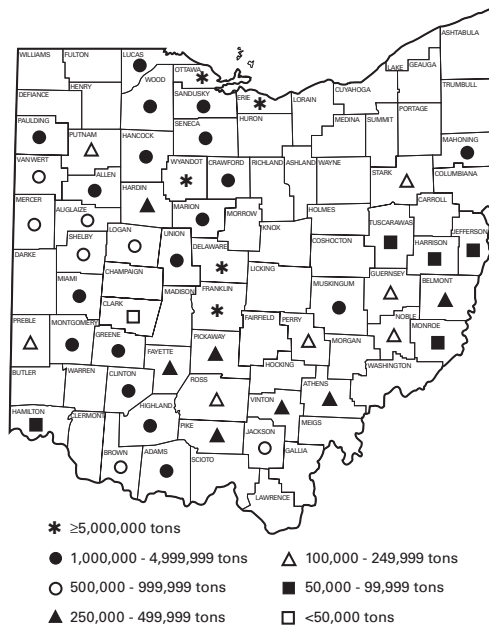


FIGURE 6.—Sales of limestone and dolomite in Ohio in 1999, by county.

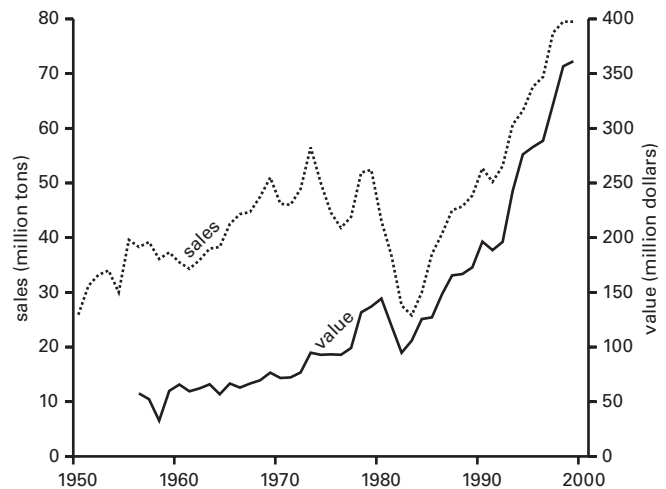


FIGURE 7.—Sales and value of limestone and dolomite in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available.

SAND AND GRAVEL

Sand and gravel were sold or produced by 223 companies at 305 operations in 60 Ohio counties plus Lake Erie during 1999. Sales⁶ of sand and gravel totalled 59,809,555 tons (+0.6 percent from 1998). Sand accounted for 31,119,196 tons of the total sand and gravel sold, and gravel accounted for 28,690,359 tons. Hamilton, Butler, Franklin, Portage, and Stark Counties led in sales, accounting for 45.5 percent of the total. Reported known production⁶ of sand and gravel totalled 59,922,549 tons in 1999. Ohio ranks 4th nationally in the production of construction sand and gravel out of 50 producing states and Puerto Rico. The top five states, in descending order of production, are California, Texas, Michigan, Ohio, and Arizona. Ohio ranks 9th nationally in the production of industrial sand and gravel out of 36 states. The states leading Ohio in the production of industrial sand and gravel, in descending order, are Illinois, Michigan,

New Jersey, Texas, Wisconsin, California, North Carolina, and Oklahoma. Ohio ranks 3rd nationally in the production of aggregates, including crushed stone. The top five states, in descending order of aggregate production, are California, Texas, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Illinois.⁷

A total of 97,627 tons of sand were dredged from Lake Erie in 1999. The Maumee Bay and Maumee River areas are no longer producing sand or gravel.

The total value⁸ of sand and gravel sold in 1999 was \$264,391,627. Average price per ton was \$4.42.

An annual average of 1,245 employees worked an average of 187 days in 1999 to produce sand and gravel. Total wages of \$72,742,054 were paid to a total of 1,867 employees (1,245 production employees and 622 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$38,962. An additional 106 people (78 production employees and 28 nonproduction employees) were employed by operations mining sand and gravel along with one or more other mineral commodities.

Road construction/resurfacing, building, asphaltic concrete, and portland cement concrete were the major uses for Ohio sand and gravel in 1999.

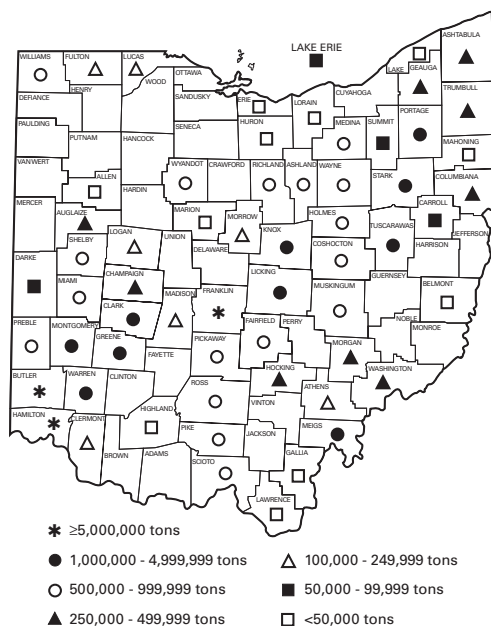


FIGURE 8.—Sales of sand and gravel in Ohio in 1999, by county.

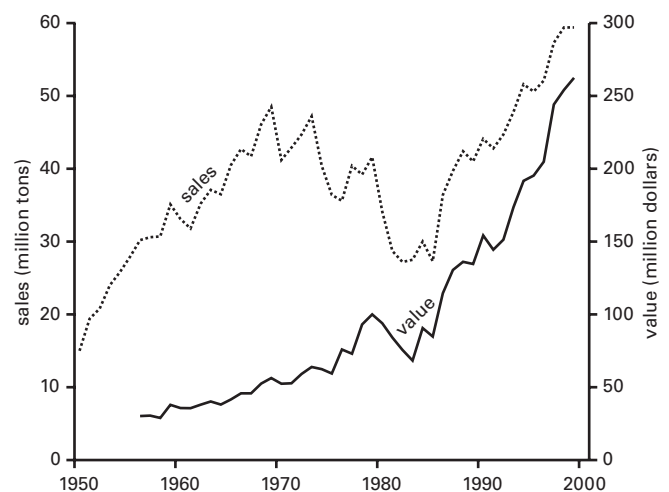


FIGURE 9.—Sales and value of sand and gravel in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available. Figures from 1984 to 1999 include Lake Erie dredged material.

SANDSTONE AND CONGLOMERATE

Sandstone and conglomerate were sold or produced by 20 companies at 28 operations in 18 Ohio counties during 1999. Sales totalled 2,755,410 tons (-51.3 percent from 1998); the large decrease in sales from 1999 is attributed to less activity at the American Electric Power Gavin coal-fired power plant in Gallia County. Geauga, Gallia, Perry, Knox, and Pike Counties accounted for 91.4 percent of the total sales. Crushed sandstone and conglomerate accounted for 2,709,979 tons of the total sales, and dimension stone accounted for 45,431 tons. Reported known production of sandstone and conglomerate was 2,850,836 tons in 1999. Ohio ranks 12th nationally in production of all dimension stone out of 33 producing states. Ohio ranks 3rd in the production of sandstone dimension stone. The top five states, in descending order of total dimension-stone pro-

duction, are Indiana, Vermont, Georgia, Wisconsin, and Massachusetts.⁹ National standings for crushed stone are included with Limestone and Dolomite.

The total value¹⁰ of sandstone and conglomerate sold in 1999 was \$41,541,413. Average price per ton was \$14.05 for crushed stone and \$76.59 for dimension stone.

An annual average of 137 employees worked an average of 161 days in 1999 to produce sandstone and conglomerate. Total wages of \$8,951,790 were paid to a total of 223 employees (137 production employees and 86 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$39,963. An additional 60 people (50 production employees and 10 nonproduction employees) were employed by operations mining sandstone and conglomerate along with one or more other mineral commodities.

Crushed stone was used primarily for glass sand, construction, foundry sand, silica flour, and aggregate. Dimension stone was used primarily for rough construction purposes.

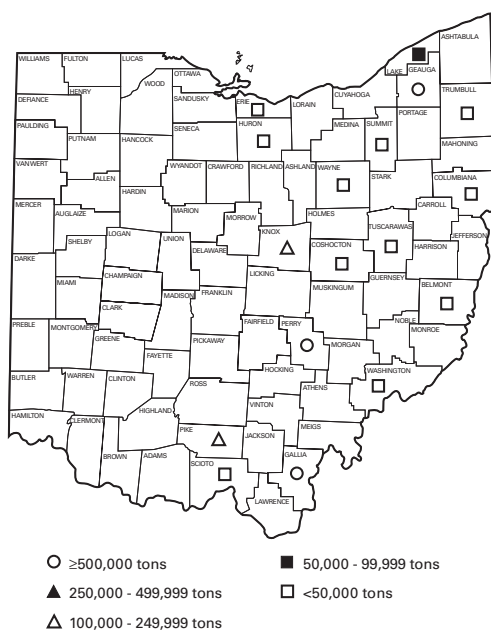


FIGURE 10.—Sales of sandstone and conglomerate in Ohio in 1999, by county.

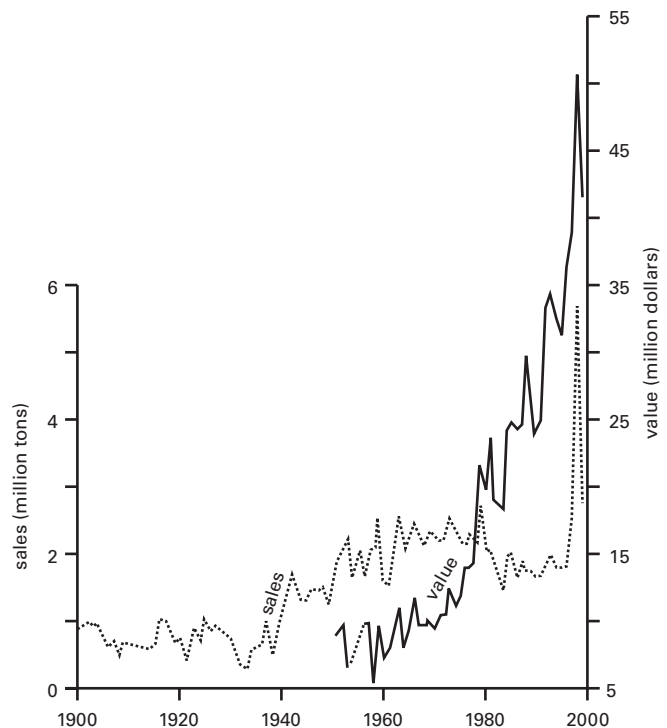


FIGURE 11.—Sales and value of sandstone and conglomerate. Value line dashed where data not available.

CLAY

Clay was sold or produced by 48 companies at 57 operations in 28 Ohio counties during 1999. Clay sales (including material for captive use) totalled 3,097,626 tons (+43.9 percent from 1998); Tuscarawas, Wayne, Hamilton, Perry, and Ottawa Counties accounted for 61.0 percent of the total sales. National rankings for clay are included with Shale.

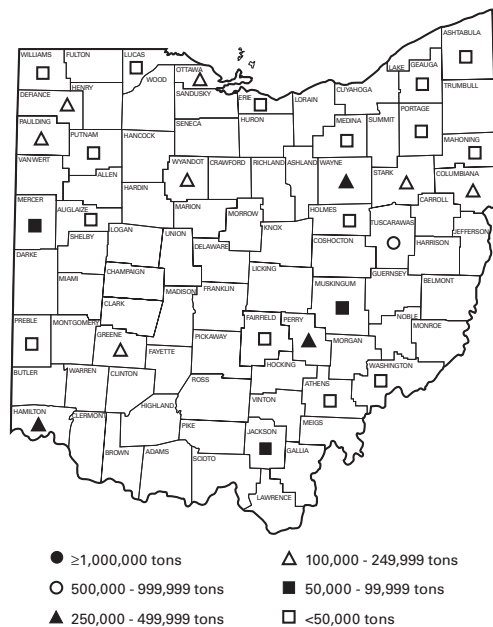


FIGURE 12.—Clay sales in Ohio in 1999, by county.

Reported known production of clay was 3,123,518 tons. The total value¹¹ of clay sold (including material for captive use) in 1999 was \$12,893,867. Average price per ton was \$4.16.

An annual average of 24 employees worked an average of 141 days in 1999 mining clay. Total wages of \$750,468 were paid to a total of 40 employees (24 production employees and 16 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$18,762. An additional 136 people (100 production employees and 36 nonproduction employees) were employed by operations mining clay along with one or more other mineral commodities.

Clay mined in Ohio in 1999 was used largely for captive use in the landfill industry, the production of common clay products, and for cement manufacture.

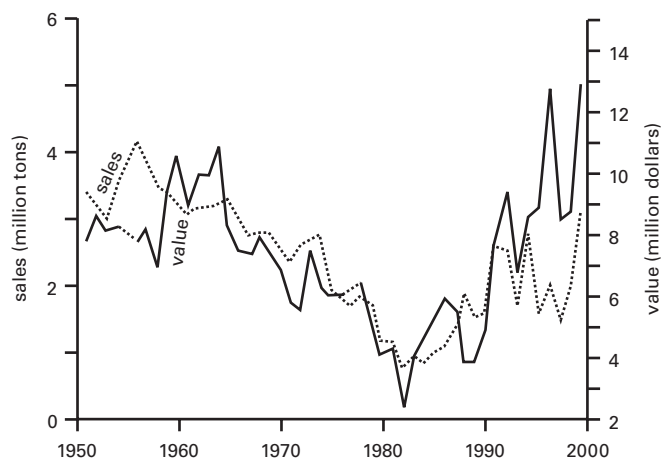


FIGURE 13.—Sales and value of clay in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available.

SHALE

Shale was sold or produced by 19 companies at 26 operations in 15 Ohio counties during 1999. Shale sales (including material for captive use) totalled 4,070,435 tons (+2.7 percent from 1998); Hamilton, Stark, Tuscarawas, Cuyahoga, and Marion Counties accounted for 93.2 percent of the total sales. Ohio ranks 5th nationally in the production of clay and shale out of 44 producing states. The top five states, in descending order of production, are Alabama, North Carolina, Texas, Georgia, and Ohio.¹² Reported pro-

duction equalled sales. The total value¹³ of shale sold (including material for captive use) in 1999 was \$10,571,275. Average price per ton was \$2.60.

An annual average of 25 employees worked an average of 193 days in 1999 mining shale. Total wages of \$1,555,956 were paid to a total of 55 employees (25 production employees and 30 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$28,290. An additional 56 people (38 production employees and 18 nonproduction employees) were employed by operations mining shale along with one or more other mineral commodities.

Shale mined in Ohio was largely for captive use in the landfill industry and in the production of common clay products and for lightweight aggregate.

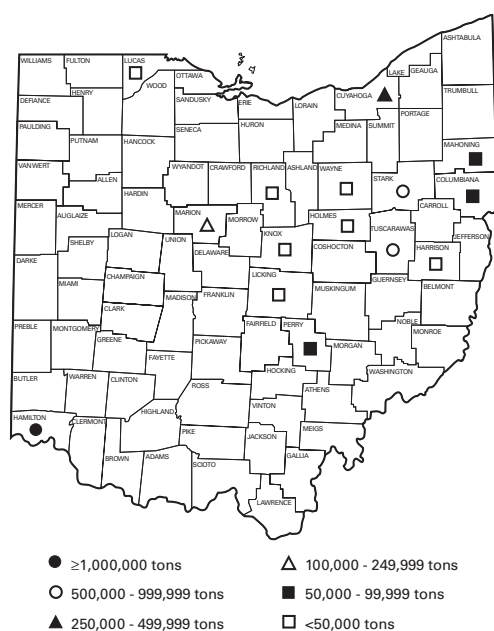


FIGURE 14.—Shale sales in Ohio in 1999, by county.

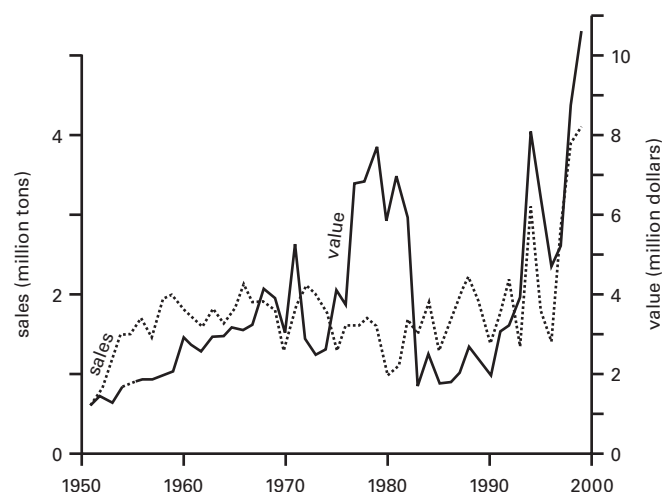


FIGURE 15.—Sales and value of shale in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available.

SALT

Salt was produced by 3 companies at 5 operations in 5 Ohio counties during 1999. Total tonnage of salt sold in 1999 amounted to 4,572,685 tons (+17.2 percent from 1998). Rock salt sales totalled 3,729,224 tons from 2 underground mines, one each in Cuyahoga and Lake Counties. Three brining operations, one each in Licking, Summit, and Wayne Counties, sold a total of 11,400 tons of salt in brine and 832,061 tons of evaporated salt. Reported known production of salt was 4,679,168 tons in 1999. The top five salt-producing states nationally, in alphabetical order, are Kansas, Louisiana, New York, Ohio, and Texas.¹⁴

The total value¹⁵ of the salt sold in 1999 was \$92,675,122. Average price per ton of rock salt was \$19.98 and of salt in brine and evaporated salt was \$21.54. The average price per ton of all salt sold was \$20.27.

An annual average of 299 employees worked an average of 309 days in 1999 to produce salt. Total wages of \$20,251,631 were paid to a total of 452 employees (299 production employees and 153 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage, based on those employees for whom wages were reported, was \$44,805. The primary use for Ohio salt was ice control. Salt also was used as an additive in animal feed, for cattle blocks, and as a commercial and residential water-softening agent.

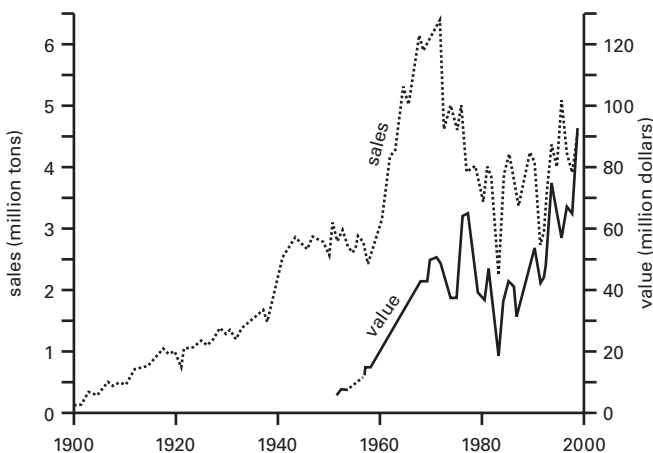


FIGURE 16.—Sales and value of salt in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available.

GYPSUM

Gypsum was produced by 1 company at 1 operation in Ottawa County during 1999. Gypsum production and sales (all material was for captive use) totalled 294,757 tons (+15.5 percent from 1998). The reported value¹⁶ of the gypsum sold was \$2,652,813. Average price per ton was \$9.00. Ohio ranks 15th nationally in the production of gypsum out of 19 producing states. The top five states, in descending order of production, are Oklahoma, Iowa, Texas, Michigan, and California.¹⁴

An annual average of 4 employees worked 321 days in 1999 producing gypsum. Total wages of \$341,579 were paid to a total of 7 employees (4 production employees and 3 nonproduction employees). The average annual wage in 1999 was \$48,797. The sole use of gypsum from this operation is for the manufacture of wallboard.

PEAT

Peat was produced by 4 companies at 4 operations in 3 Ohio counties during 1999. Peat sales (including material for captive use) totalled 9,216 tons (-9.9 percent from 1998). Champaign, Portage, and Williams Counties accounted for 100 percent of the total sales. The total value of the peat sold in 1999 was \$73,024. Average price per ton was \$7.92. Reported known production was 9,275 tons. Ohio ranks 14th nationally in the production of peat out of 19 producing states. The top three states, in descending order of production, are Florida, Michigan, and Minnesota.¹⁴

Most peat operations in Ohio are owner operated. Therefore, employment information is not available.

Peat produced in Ohio was used primarily for mulch and soil mix.

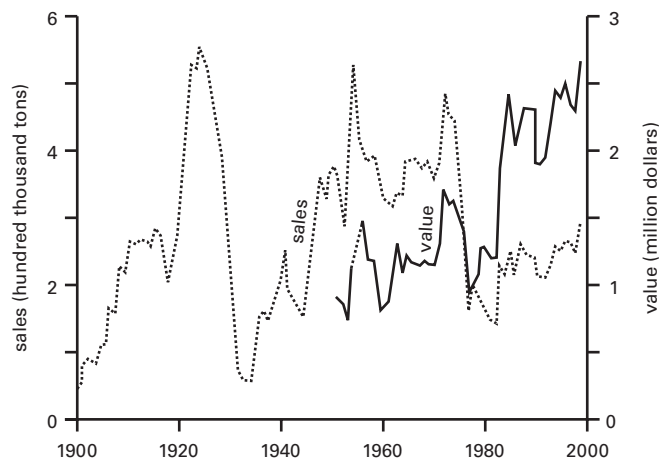


FIGURE 17.—Sales and value of gypsum in Ohio. Value line dashed where data not available. Some figures were calculated because actual figures were not reported in order to maintain confidentiality.

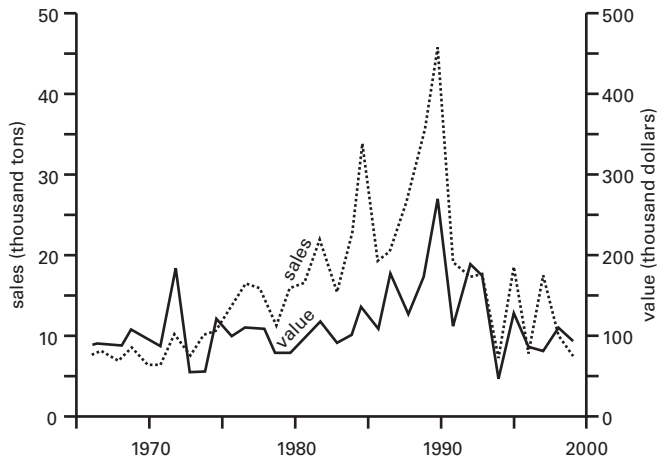


FIGURE 18.—Sales and value of peat in Ohio.

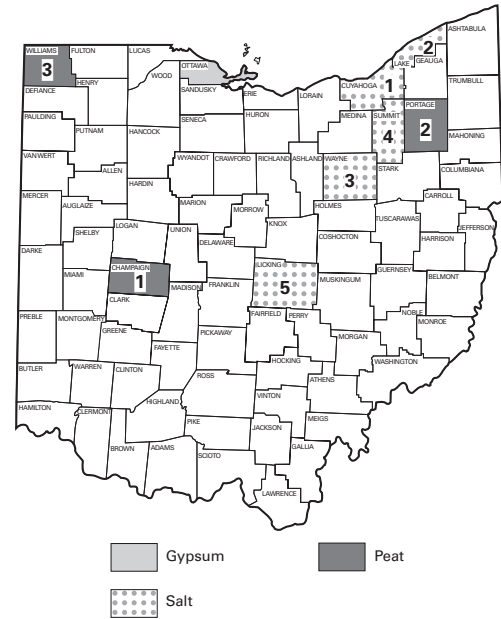


FIGURE 19.—Counties producing salt, gypsum, and peat in Ohio in 1998, and their ranking in sales.

OIL AND GAS

This information is summarized from the 1999 Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Oil and Gas Annual Report.

The Division of Oil and Gas issued 660 drilling permits for oil and gas in 1999, a 10.3 percent decrease from 1998. The Division estimates that 499 wells were actually drilled in 1999, a decrease of 18 wells from 1998. Ohio ranks 10th nationally in the number of wells drilled.¹⁷ Wells were drilled in 38 of Ohio's 88 counties, a decrease of 1 county from 1998. The top five counties in number of new wells completed in 1999 were Ashtabula, Washington, Stark, Muskingum, and Wayne. The Division of Oil and Gas received 437 well completion reports; 352 wells were productive and 85 were dry holes for a completion rate of 80.5 percent.

The total reported crude oil production in Ohio in 1999 was 5,968,342 barrels, an 8.8 percent decrease from 1998. Ohio ranks 18th nationally in the volume of crude oil produced.¹⁷ Through 1999, Ohio wells have produced

1,074,591,317 barrels of crude oil. The dollar value of crude oil produced in Ohio in 1999 was \$96,681,166, an increase of 26.0 percent. Average price per barrel in 1999 was \$16.20, a 38.1 percent increase from the 1998 price.

Natural gas production in Ohio in 1999 was 103,540,658 MCF, a 4.6 percent decrease from 1998. This production figure includes an estimated 1,035,407 MCF of gas used on the lease. Through 1999, Ohio wells have produced 7,531,848,404 MCF of natural gas. Ohio ranks 17th nationally in the volume of natural gas produced.¹⁷ The dollar value of natural gas produced in Ohio in 1999 was \$249,118,822, an increase of 2.5 percent from 1998. The value of the estimated volume of gas used on the lease was not used in computing the total dollar value. The average price per MCF in 1999 was \$2.41, an increase of 17 cents per MCF from 1998.

The combined total value of Ohio oil and gas production in 1999 was \$345,799,988, an increase of 8.1 percent from 1998.

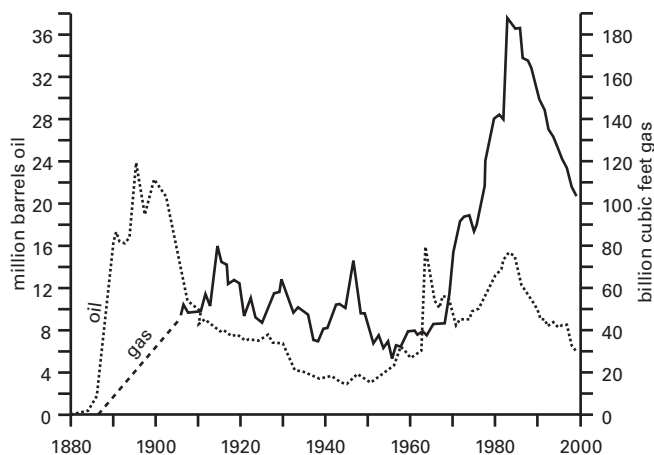


FIGURE 20.—Production of oil and gas in Ohio.

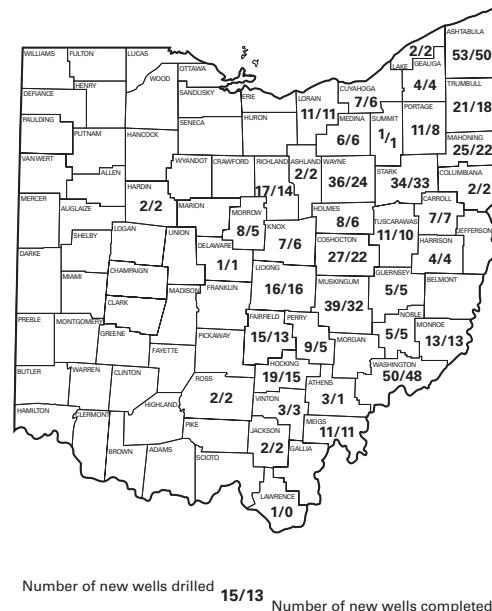


FIGURE 21.—New wells drilled for oil and gas in 1999, by county.
