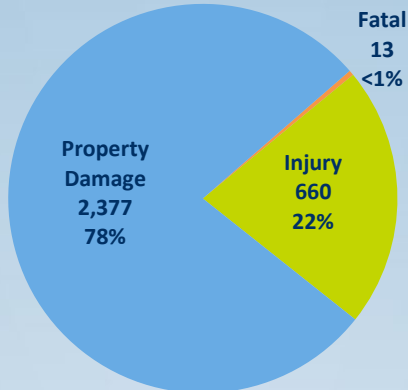




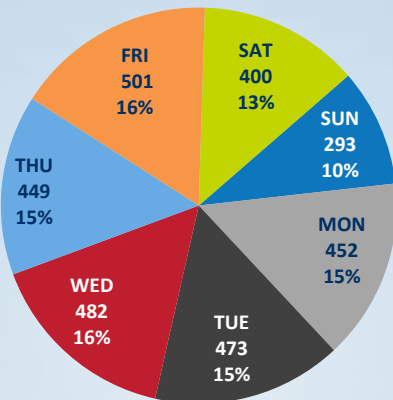

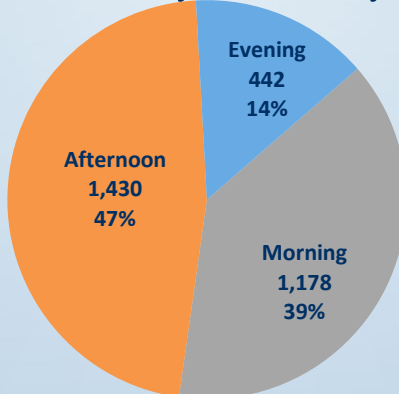
Crashes by Severity

Crashes by Time of Day

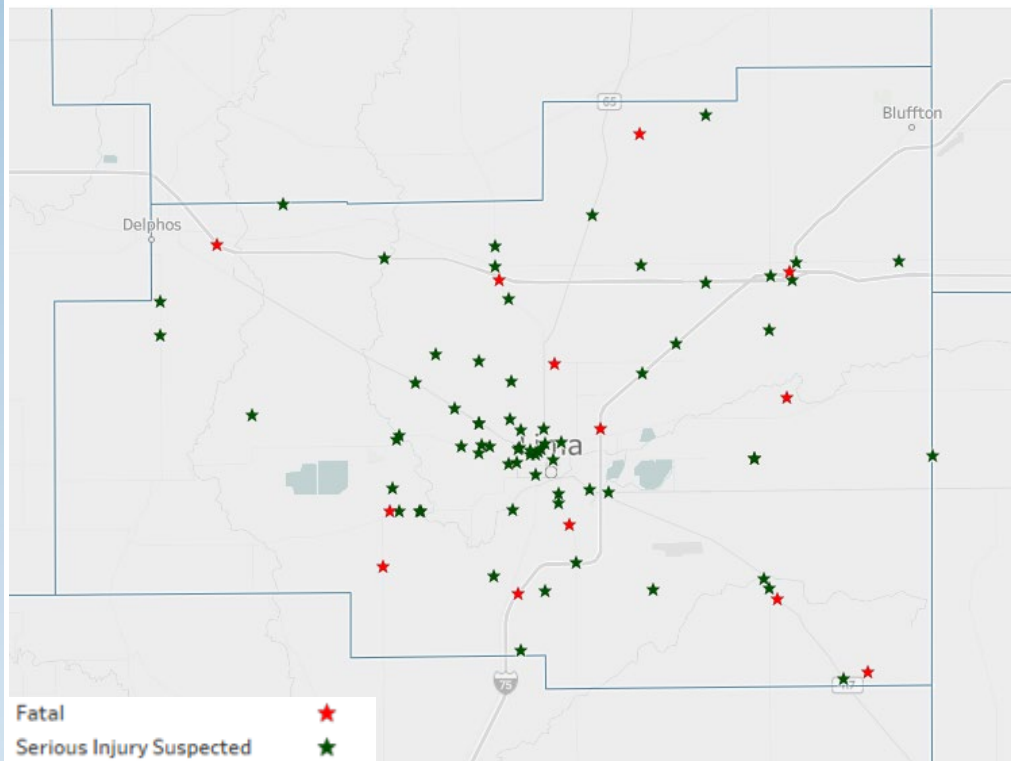

Share the Road with Pedestrians, Bicycles & Motorcycles

- Stay alert and slow down in areas with heavy pedestrian or bicycle activity, especially at crosswalks and intersections.
- Give at least three feet of space when passing bicycles and motorcycles – allow a safe buffer and only pass when it's legal and clear.
- Check blind spots carefully, as pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcycles can be harder to see than cars.

Stay Focused and Stay in Your Lane

- 26% of Ohio's fatal crashes over the last 5 years were the result of driving off the roadway.
- Driving off the road is the 2nd most common factor in teen crashes in Ohio. Speeding is #1.
- Distraction often causes drivers to drift out of their lane which puts themselves, their passengers, and others on the road in danger.
- Ohio's distracted driving law makes it illegal to use or hold a cell phone in your hand or on your lap while driving.

Ohio's App to Practice Safe Driving Skills



- RoadReady Ohio is a free app for new drivers that helps them log their required 50 hours of driving practice.
- Beginning April 1, 2026, the BMV will require new drivers to submit a detailed log of supervised driving hours with their 50 Hour Affidavit.

Impaired Driving a Factor in Two Separate Crashes

On August 29, 2025, the driver of a black car was traveling northeast on I -75 at speeds up to 150 mph just before 2 a.m. When he merged from the left lane to the right lane, he hit the back of an SUV which was also traveling northeast in the right lane at 70 mph. After impact, the SUV spun out into the median. Both drivers were wearing seat belts, and no serious injuries were reported. Troopers say the driver of the black car agreed to toxicology testing and he was found to be under the influence of marijuana. He was charged with OVI and Reckless Operation.



A driver was traveling west on Reservoir Road in Jackson Township on September 25, 2025. She crossed the center line near Phillips Road and went off the left side of the roadway, where the vehicle struck two rock landscape walls and overturned. The driver was wearing a seat belt and was checked out by EMS personnel for possible injuries. Troopers suspected the driver was impaired by alcohol, but she refused all testing. She was charged with OVI and Failure to Control.
