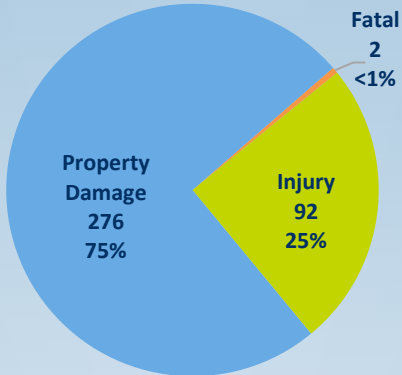




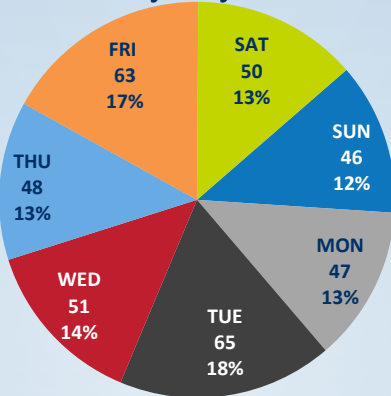

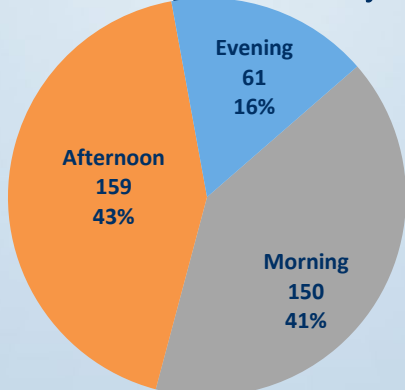
Crashes by Severity

Crashes by Time of Day

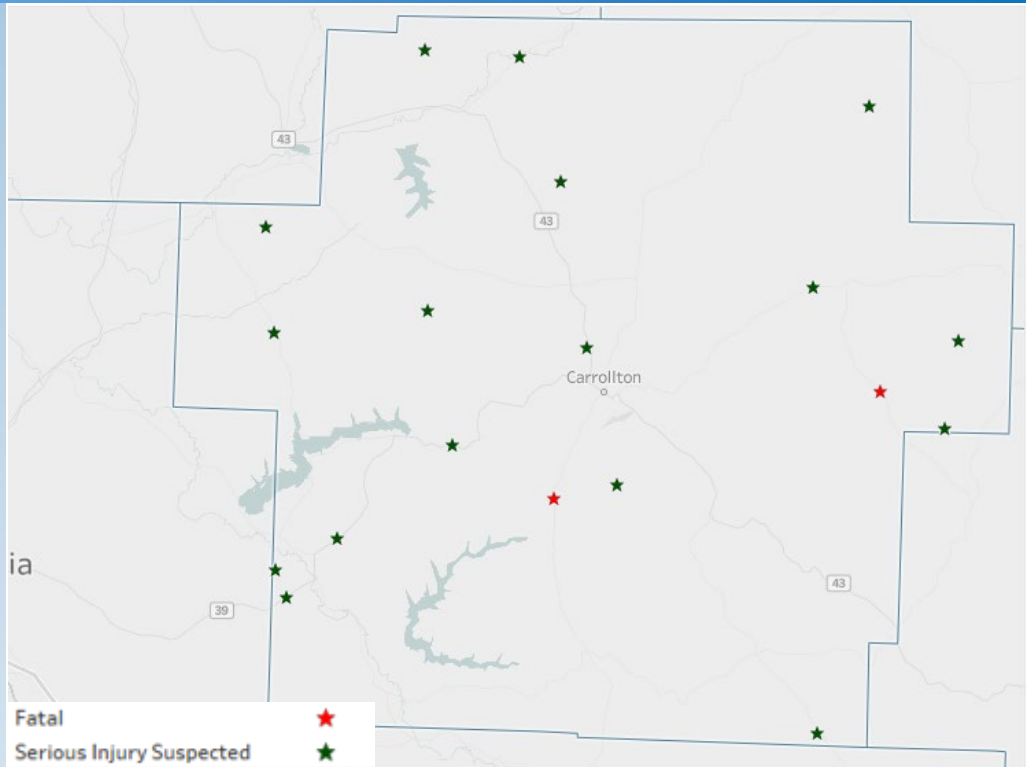

Share the Road with Pedestrians, Bicycles & Motorcycles

- Stay alert and slow down in areas with heavy pedestrian or bicycle activity, especially at crosswalks and intersections.
- Give at least three feet of space when passing bicycles and motorcycles – allow a safe buffer and only pass when it's legal and clear.
- Check blind spots carefully, as pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcycles can be harder to see than cars.

Stay Focused and Stay in Your Lane

- 26% of Ohio's fatal crashes over the last 5 years were the result of driving off the roadway.
- Driving off the road is the 2nd most common factor in teen crashes in Ohio. Speeding is #1.
- Distraction often causes drivers to drift out of their lane which puts themselves, their passengers, and others on the road in danger.
- Ohio's distracted driving law makes it illegal to use or hold a cell phone in your hand or on your lap while driving.

Ohio's App to Practice Safe Driving Skills



- RoadReady Ohio is a free app for new drivers that helps them log their required 50 hours of driving practice.
- Beginning April 1, 2026, the BMV will require new drivers to submit a detailed log of supervised driving hours with their 50 Hour Affidavit.

One Killed in Head On Crash on County Road 54

On January 13, 2026, a driver in a light blue car was traveling northwest on County Road 54 when he crossed the center line in a curve near Union Township Road 136. The car struck an oncoming pickup truck head-on before spinning off the right side of the roadway into a ditch. Both occupants in the pickup truck were wearing seat belts and were not hurt. The driver of the blue car was not wearing a seat belt and was pronounced dead at the scene. Troopers learned he was on his way to the hospital to see his wife who was transported by ambulance for an injury. The investigation revealed the driver was talking on his cell phone at the time of the crash. Toxicology tests showed his blood alcohol content was .03, which is below the legal limit, but Troopers believe it was also a factor in this incident.



Teen Driver Killed, Passenger Injured in Rollover Crash

An 18-year-old driver was traveling east on County Road 22 just after 6:30 p.m. on February 20, 2026. She lost control in a curve near County Road 102, crossed the center line, and drove off the left side of the road – where the car struck an embankment and overturned, landing upright on its wheels. The teen driver was not wearing a seat belt and ejected from the car and pronounced dead at the scene. Her 18-year-old passenger was wearing a seat belt and was treated at the hospital for minor cuts on her hands and arms. Troopers believe excessive speed was a factor in this crash.
