



Crashes by Severity

Crashes by Time of Day



Phones Down. It's the Law.

- Ohio drivers can be now be pulled over solely for holding a device.
- The first offense carries up to a \$150 fine and 2 points on your license.
- 38% of all distracted driving crashes in Ohio involve a driver under age 24.
- Drivers under the age of 18 are still restricted from using their devices in any way, including hands-free features.

Driving Safely in the Dark

- With fewer hours of daylight in the fall and winter months, drivers spend more time driving in the dark.
- Increase visibility by ensuring your headlights, taillights, and wipers are working properly.
- Don't out drive your headlights! Low beams have 180 feet of visual space, and high beams have 350 feet.
- For the first full year after getting a probationary license, teen drivers must be accompanied by a parent between midnight and 6 a.m.

The Facts About Driving High

- Driving while under the influence of marijuana is against the law.
- Marijuana impairs your ability to drive safely, affecting your motor skills, field of vision, perception, and reaction time.
- Marijuana makes it harder for a driver to correctly judge space between vehicles, speed, and how quickly to stop at an intersection.
- In 2023, marijuana was involved in 306 deadly crashes in Ohio which accounts for 27% of all fatal crashes.
- Mixing alcohol and marijuana amplifies impairment.

Distraction Likely a Factor in Rear-End Crash on I-71

On June 4 2024, the driver of a blue pickup truck was traveling south at 70 mph in the left lane through Norwood. The driver struck the back of a grey car directly in front of him that had slowed to 45 mph. The impact forced the grey car to hit the jersey wall. Both drivers were wearing seat belts, but the driver of the grey car was taken to the hospital with minor injuries. The driver of the pickup truck was not hurt. He was cited for Failure to Maintain Assured Clear Distance Ahead.
