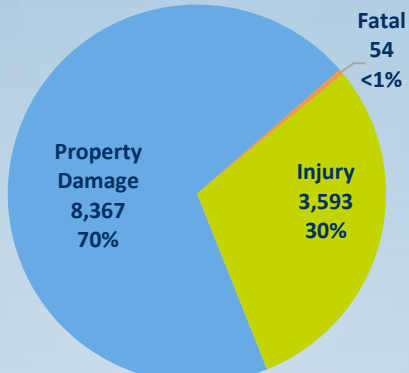




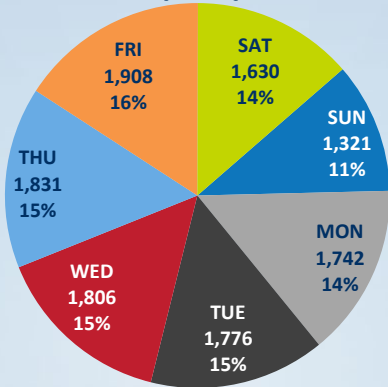

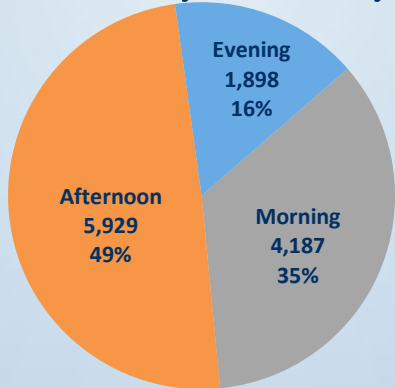
Crashes by Severity

Crashes by Time of Day

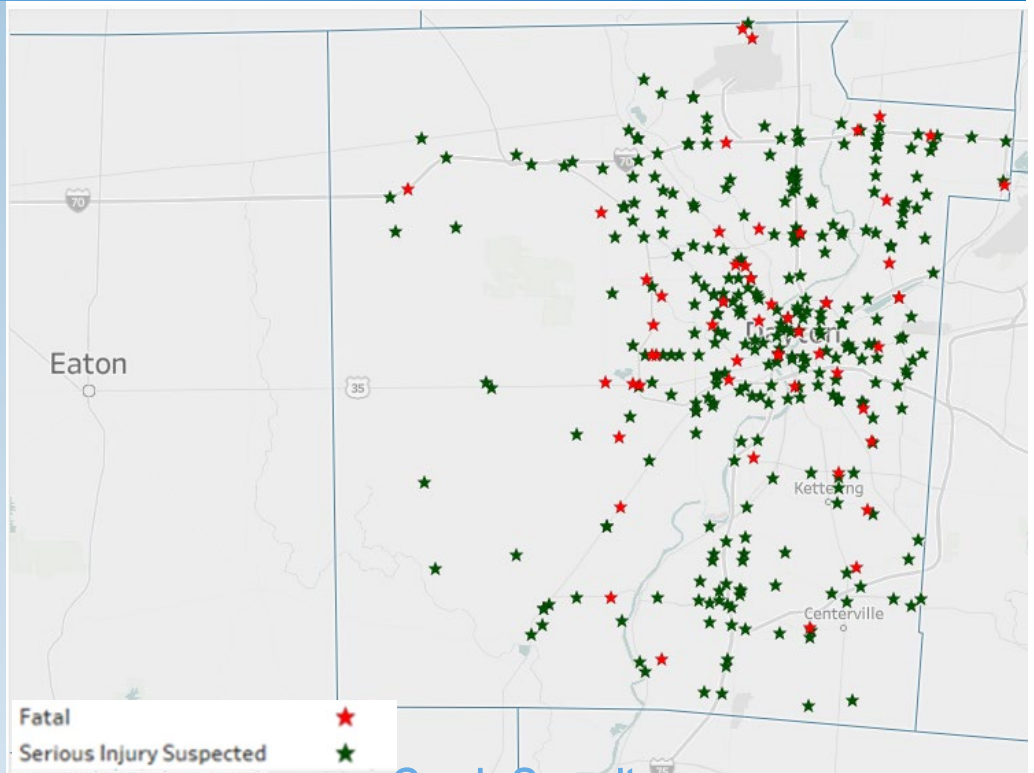

Share the Road with Pedestrians, Bicycles & Motorcycles

- Stay alert and slow down in areas with heavy pedestrian or bicycle activity, especially at crosswalks and intersections.
- Give at least three feet of space when passing bicycles and motorcycles – allow a safe buffer and only pass when it's legal and clear.
- Check blind spots carefully, as pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcycles can be harder to see than cars.

Stay Focused and Stay in Your Lane

- 26% of Ohio's fatal crashes over the last 5 years were the result of driving off the roadway.
- Driving off the road is the 2nd most common factor in teen crashes in Ohio. Speeding is #1.
- Distraction often causes drivers to drift out of their lane which puts themselves, their passengers, and others on the road in danger.
- Ohio's distracted driving law makes it illegal to use or hold a cell phone in your hand or on your lap while driving.

Ohio's App to Practice Safe Driving Skills



- RoadReady Ohio is a free app for new drivers that helps them log their required 50 hours of driving practice.
- Beginning April 1, 2026, the BMV will require new drivers to submit a detailed log of supervised driving hours with their 50 Hour Affidavit.

Distraction a Factor in Rear End Crash on I-75

On February 1, 2026, the driver of an orange car was traveling south in the right lane through a work zone on I-75 in Harrison Township. The driver of a black SUV in front of him drove onto the right shoulder and stopped for other traffic ahead. Troopers believe the driver of the orange car was distracted by something in his vehicle when he swerved onto the right shoulder and rear-ended the SUV. No injuries were reported. The driver of the orange car was cited for Failure to Maintain Assured Clear Distance Ahead.
