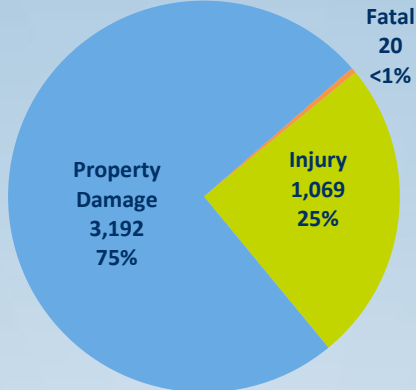




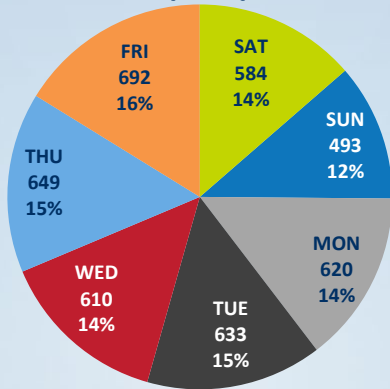

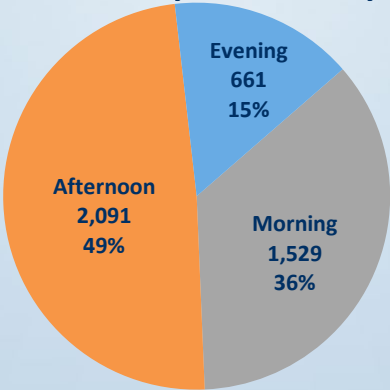
Crashes by Severity

Crashes by Time of Day

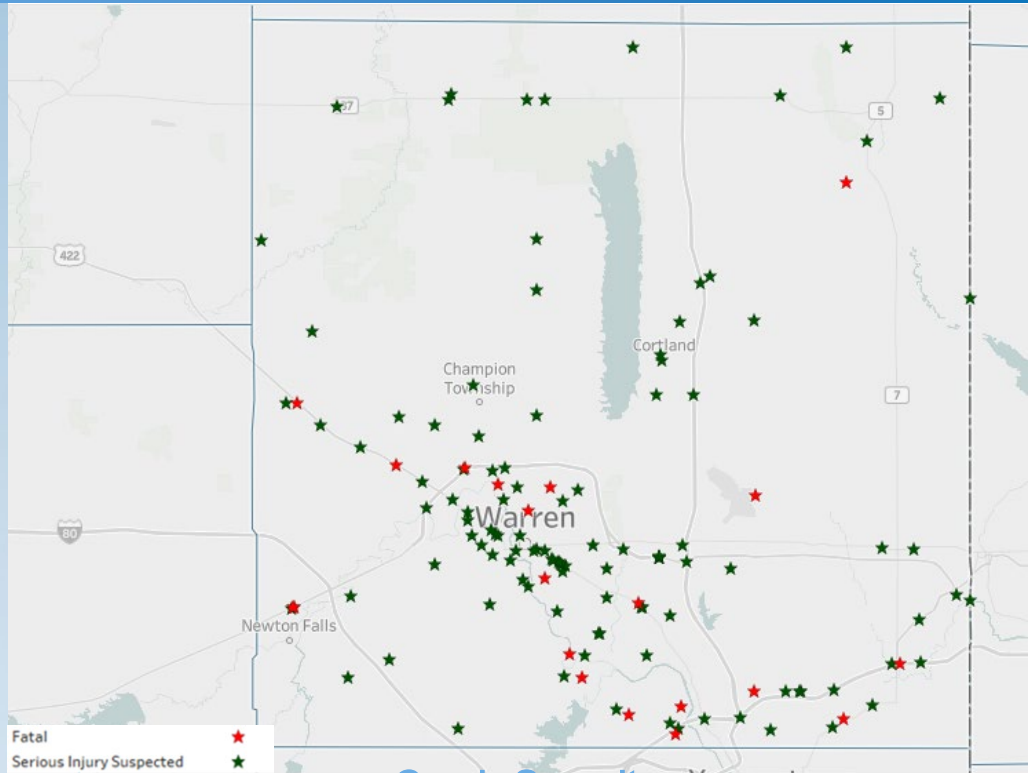


Trumbull County Safety Belt Compliance Rate

Share the Road with Pedestrians, Bicycles & Motorcycles

- Stay alert and slow down in areas with heavy pedestrian or bicycle activity, especially at crosswalks and intersections.
- Give at least three feet of space when passing bicycles and motorcycles – allow a safe buffer and only pass when it's legal and clear.
- Check blind spots carefully, as pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorcycles can be harder to see than cars.

Stay Focused and Stay in Your Lane

- 26% of Ohio's fatal crashes over the last 5 years were the result of driving off the roadway.
- Driving off the road is the 2nd most common factor in teen crashes in Ohio. Speeding is #1.
- Distraction often causes drivers to drift out of their lane which puts themselves, their passengers, and others on the road in danger.
- Ohio's distracted driving law makes it illegal to use or hold a cell phone in your hand or on your lap while driving.

Ohio's App to Practice Safe Driving Skills



- RoadReady Ohio is a free app for new drivers that helps them log their required 50 hours of driving practice.
- Beginning April 1, 2026, the BMV will require new drivers to submit a detailed log of supervised driving hours with their 50 Hour Affidavit.

Three Hurt in Head On Crash with Suspected Drunk Driver

A 20-year-old driver in a blue car was traveling west on State Route 305 just after 3:30 a.m. on December 6, 2025. She crossed the center line in a curve near mile post 5 and hit a grey SUV head-on in the eastbound lane. All occupants were wearing seat belts, but a 20-year-old passenger in the blue car and two people in the SUV were taken to the hospital with serious injuries. Troopers suspected the underage driver in the blue car was impaired by alcohol, but she refused all testing. She was charged with OVI and Driving Left of Center.
