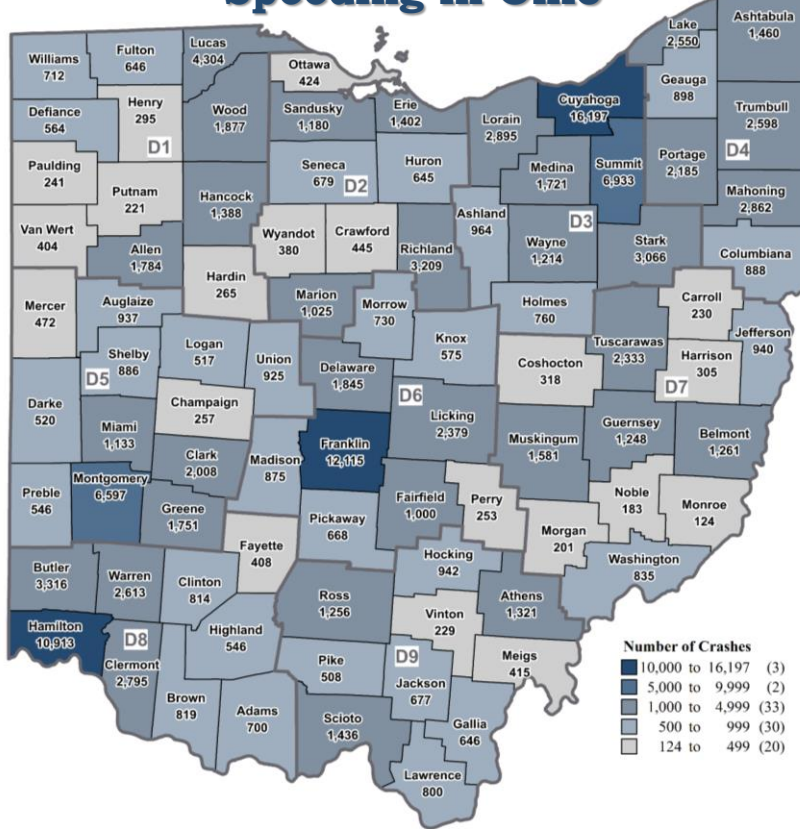

Speed-Related Crashes

- From 2020-2024, 146,983 crashes occurred on Ohio roadways in which a driver was either exceeding the posted speed limit or that unsafe speed was marked by an investigating officer as a contributing factor. Overall, one in every ten crashes are considered speed-related.
- Over the last five years, there were 1,713 speed-related fatal crashes that resulted in 1,890 deaths. This represents 30% of all fatal crashes during this time. Fatal speed-related crashes have decreased each year since 2021 and are down 11% over the time frame (from 360 in 2021 to 319 in 2024).
- From 2020-2024, male drivers were at-fault in more speed-related crashes than female drivers (62% vs. 30%).¹ Drivers aged 65 or older were responsible for 6% of speed-related crashes in Ohio. One-third of speed-related crashes during this time were caused by drivers aged 15-24.
- Cuyahoga (16,197), Franklin (12,115), Hamilton (10,913), Summit (6,933), and Montgomery (6,597) Counties led the state in speed-related crashes. These five counties accounted for more than one-in-three such crashes in the state (52,755 or 36%).

Speed Citations

- From 2020-2024, the Ohio State Highway Patrol issued over 400,000 speed citations for 20mph or more over the speed limit. This includes nearly 20,000 citations for speeds of 100mph or higher.
