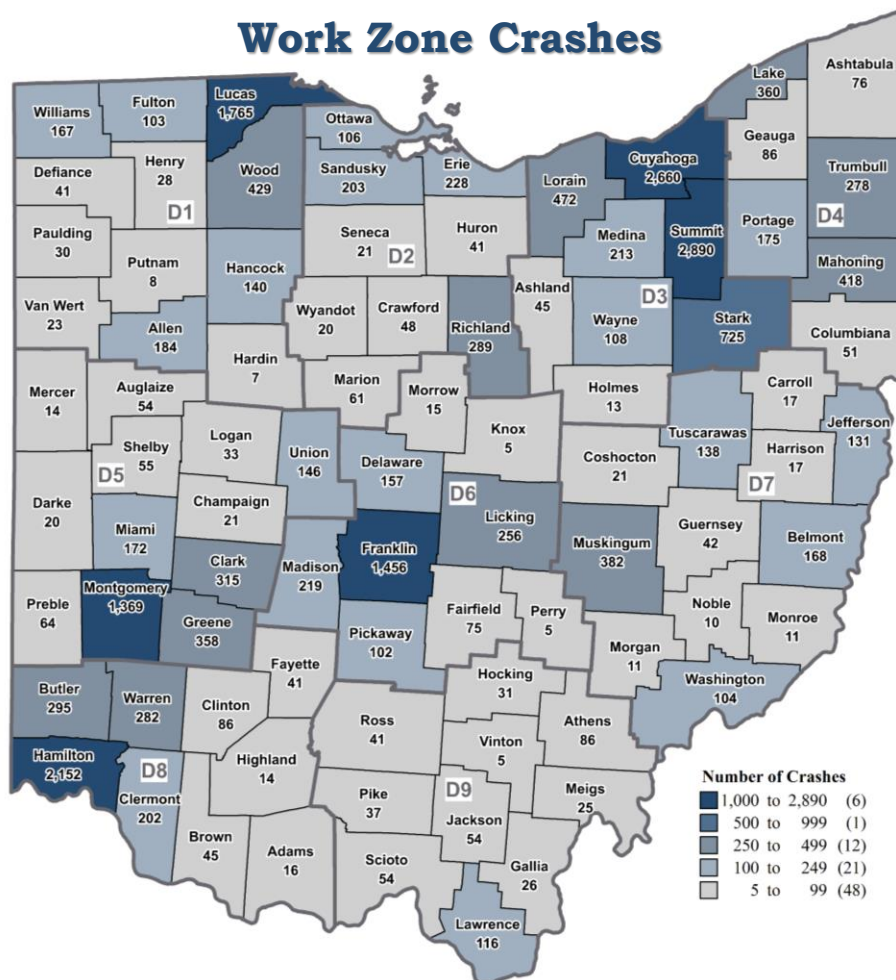

## Work Zone Crashes

- From 2020-2024, there were 22,083 crashes that occurred in work zones on Ohio roadways. Among these were 92 fatal crashes that killed 101 people. Another 8,165 people were injured. In 2024, fatal work zone crashes rose by 22% from the previous five-year average (2019-2023).
- Nearly 50% of work zone crashes occurred in five Ohio counties: Summit (2,890), Cuyahoga (2,660), Hamilton (2,152), Lucas (1,765) and Franklin (1,456). Top routes for work zone crashes included I-75 (2,609), I-77 (1,395), I-80 (1,070), and I-70 (1,064). More than 40% of work zone crashes occurred between noon and 5:00 pm. Fatal crashes occurred most frequently between 8:00 pm and 2:00 am.
- From 2020-2024, 35% of work zone crashes had workers present at the time of the crash. Fifteen percent (15%) of individuals killed in work zone crashes were pedestrians.

## Work Zone Citations

- During this same time period, OSHP troopers issued over 30,000 citations to motorists in work zones. Seventy-four percent (74%) of these citations were for speed violations, including more than 11,000 for speeds of 20 MPH or more over the speed limit. Nearly 120 of these citations involved motorists traveling 100 MPH or more.
