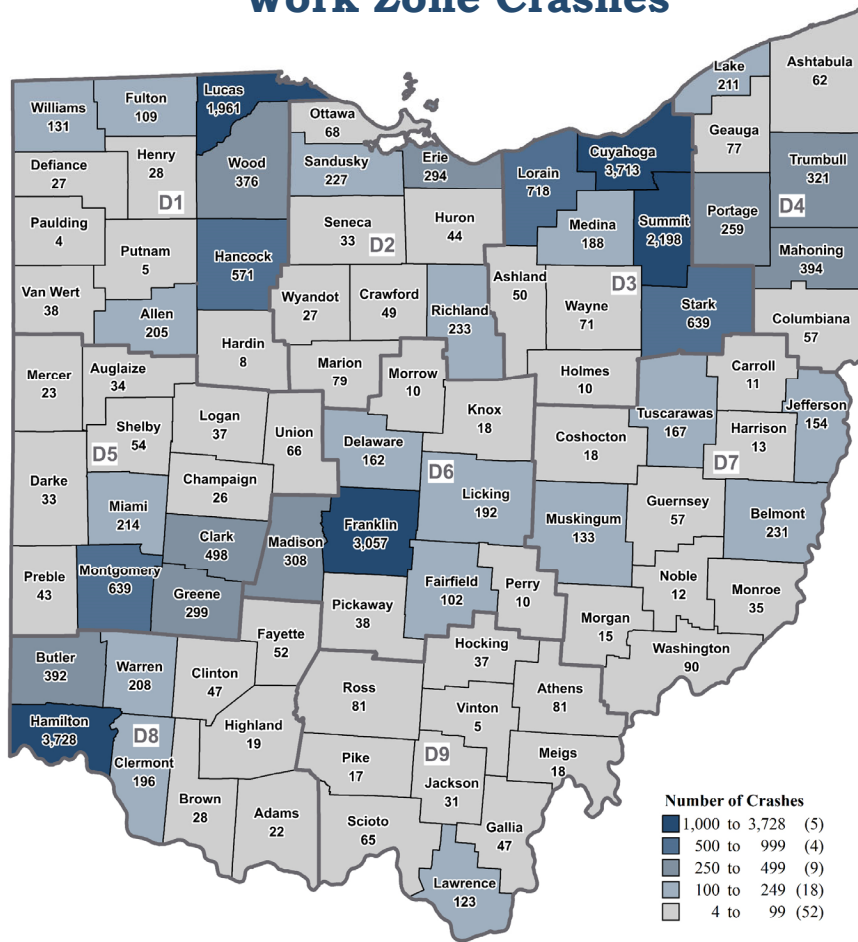

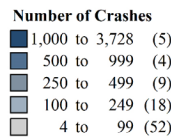
## Work Zone Crashes

### Work Zone Crashes

- From 2017-2021, there were 25,481 crashes that occurred in work zones on Ohio roadways. Among these were 88 fatal crashes that killed 97 people. Another 9,157 people were injured. In 2021, 29 people were killed in work zone crashes, 53% higher than the 19 killed in 2020.
- About 50% of work zone crashes occurred in just four Ohio counties, which included Hamilton (3,728), Cuyahoga (3,713), Franklin (3,057), and Summit (2,198). The top routes for work zone related crashes included I-75 (2,959), I-71 (1,465), I-70 (1,298), and I-80 (1,224). Most work zone crashes occur during a weekday (M-F) and between noon and 5:00 pm. A driver between the ages of 15 and 24 was involved in 28% of work zone crashes.
- Thirty-eight percent (38%) of the work zone crashes had workers present at the time of the crash. One-in-five (19 or 20%) individuals killed in work zone crashes were pedestrians.

### Work Zone Citations

- During this same period, OSHP troopers issued over 44,000 citations in work zones. Seventy-six percent (76%) of citations issued in work zones were for speed violations. OSHP issued nearly 100 citations for 100 MPH or more in work zones from 2017 through 2021.
