Interested in Business? You can take the courses below through College Credit Plus to start your path to a degree in Business. To simplify things, we've laid out an example of a semester-by-semester plan for you. Please work closely with your College Credit Plus advisor and high school counselor to select the coursework that makes sense based on your goals.

After you've completed these courses, save even more time and money by finishing your associate degree through the [Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway](#) in Business and then transferring to a public university with junior standing and half of your bachelor's degree in Business complete.

#### Semester 1

First Writing (TME001) <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours
Microeconomics (OSS004) <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours

#### Semester 2

Any Ohio Transfer 36 approved Arts & Humanities course with an Arts focus <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours
Business Calculus (TMM013) or Calculus I (TMM005) <sup>1</sup>	3-4 credit hours

#### Semester 3

Macroeconomics (OSS005) or Introduction to Financial Accounting (OBU010/CTBU010) <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours
Any Ohio Transfer 36 approved Arts & Humanities course with a Humanities focus <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours
Any Ohio Transfer 36 approved Natural Sciences course with a lab <sup>1</sup>	4 credit hours

#### Semester 4

Any Ohio Transfer 36 approved Natural Sciences course <sup>1</sup>	3-4 credit hours
Any Ohio Transfer 36 approved Social & Behavioral Sciences course outside of Economics <sup>1</sup>	3 credit hours
Work with your advisor to select one of the following (not taken previously): <sup>1</sup> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Legal Environment of Business (OBU004/ CTBU004)</li><li>• Principles of Marketing (OBU006)</li><li>• Introduction to Managerial Accounting (OBU011/CTBU011)</li></ul>	3 credit hours

## Definitions

**General Education** – The set of courses and experiences that provide students with a broad exposure to multiple disciplines within the arts and sciences with the aim of providing students with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. In Ohio, the general education curriculum typically includes coursework in oral and written communication, mathematics and data analysis, arts and humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences.

**Ohio Transfer 36** – The Ohio Transfer 36 contains 36-40 semester hours of coursework in general education. It is a subset or the complete set of general education requirements at each college or university that is guaranteed to transfer among Ohio public institutions. These courses may have different names and numbers across institutions, so we identify them with an Ohio Articulation Number made up of three letters and three numbers, such as (TME001) for First Writing.

**Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) Courses** – TAG courses are pre-major or beginning major courses that are guaranteed to transfer among Ohio public institutions and count toward the major degree program. These courses may have different names and numbers across institutions, so we identify them with an Ohio Articulation Number made up of three letters and three numbers, such as (OBU06) for Principles of Marketing.

## Meeting High School Graduation Requirements

When you use the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway to start coursework to a degree, you also can check off your high school graduation requirements. When you meet with your College Credit Plus advisor and high school counselor, use the following guide to ensure you finish two requirements with one college course.

High School Graduation Requirement	Required Number of HS Credits	College Credit Plus (CCP) Example Course Substitutions
English Language Arts	4	Literature, composition, journalism, speech, applied communication
Mathematics	4	Any college math course of at least 3 credit hours will satisfy requirements; high schools must administer the EOC tests to students to earn graduation points and to satisfy testing requirements of state and federal law
Science	3	One physical science, one life science, and one advanced study such as biology, astronomy, earth/space science, computer science, geology, etc.
Social Studies	3	Anthropology, economics geography, American government, government and economics, American history, integrated history, world history and civilizations, psychology, sociology, micro/macroeconomics
Electives	5	Fine Arts: drama/theatre, dance, visual art, music World Language: any world language, including ASL Humanities: Western culture, world mythology, philosophy, social movements, survey of religion (must not be an instruction in religious doctrine)
