The OGTP designation guarantees the transfer and applicability of credits, but does not guarantee admission to a program. Some bachelor-degree granting programs may be competitive, and students should check with individual institutions for their program admission requirements.

<p>Advising Notes:</p> <p><sup>1</sup>The goal of the curriculum in the Department of Anthropology is to produce students 1.) broadly trained across all four subfields, 2.) with an in-depth understanding of at least one of those subfields, and 3.) with experience practicing or implementing anthropological concepts in a field or practicum course. We have grouped our upper-level courses into subfield clusters, with each course listed in two different clusters to maximize student flexibility and each cluster containing 6-15 different courses. A student transferring in with the equivalent of our ATH 255 will have completed one core course, and with the equivalent of two of our introductory level courses will have completed our breadth requirement of two electives from two different subfields. Thus, a transfer student would have remaining core courses (ATH 212, 231, and 265) the senior integrative course (ATH 421), a practicum course, and at least three 300 or 400 level courses at 3 credits each within one cluster which enables in-depth learning. The Department of Anthropology offers 37 courses at the d300 and 400 level courses to choose from and most courses are available annually.</p> <p><sup>2</sup>Assumes that the student has completed the first two semesters of selected foreign language prior to entering Miami University, or that credit has been earned via an approved Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate exam through the end of the beginning level (or higher). The College of Arts &amp; Sciences (CAS) requires that students earn credit in a foreign language at or beyond the 202-level.</p> <p><sup>3</sup>Students are required to attend an orientation session and will meet with an advisor to review the coursework coming in, as well as what they should register for the following semester. At this time, the divisional requirements for CAS will be addressed so that students are able to be efficient in their course selection.</p> <p><sup>4</sup>Miami University requires a total of 124 credit hours for degree completion. The total number of hours to complete the bachelor's degree represents a range of hours that may be needed depending on the individual course selections made during the associate degree program.</p>
