- 1. Applications for admission to four-year education licensure programs may need to be completed by early January.
2. Please check with your receiving institution for GPA requirements (content GPA and overall GPA).
3. To be eligible to be accepted into a licensure program, students are required to have background checks.
4. Receiving institutions may have additional admission requirements including content testing (e.g. ACT, Praxis 1) and disposition assessment.
