12 Model Law Enforcement Policies for Youth Interaction

Americans assume law enforcement agencies provide officers policies for their interactions with youth, according to a September 2023 poll commissioned by Strategies for Youth. A majority of poll respondents believe law enforcement agencies should provide officers with specialized policies and training for youth-related issues, such as responding to youth's mental health crises.

Contrary to the public's belief and desires, many law enforcement agencies have no policies for interactions with youth.

SFY addresses this disconnect in its **12 Model Law Enforcement Policies for Youth Interactions.**These publicly available policies guide agencies and officers in treating youth in a way that is:

- Developmentally appropriate
- Trauma-informed
- Equitable

SFY's policies are the first of their kind. They provide a valuable roadmap for law enforcement leaders, elected officials, communities and municipal/governmental risk managers.

SFY offers technical assistance to agencies and community and youth organizations interested in policy implementation.
